The population time bomb is ticking loudly

The United Nations Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East (ECAFE) is gravely concerned about the region's future growth. Already in what is generally regarded as "Asia," fully 55 per cent of the world's population lives on 23 per cent of the world's real

In 1970 the region's population was 1.9 billion. But since then it is estimated to have increased by at least an additional 96 million

U.N. surveys estimate that "between 1970 and 2000 the urban population will increase at a much faster rate and will triple itself." During the next 10 years, Asia will have to

find desks for 125 million children entering school for the first time. Education is not the only institution that will feel the impact of this explosion. Those countries which already have high rates of unemployment

and underdevelopment and low rates of

productivity will be hit very hard. The gap between the rich and poor nations will widen even further.

DEAR POLLY - The hot water emptying out of r bathroom basin has slowed to a trickle (copp tubing) and we have tried tapping the pipe but that was no good. Help, please, someone. -A.B.

DEAR POLLY - My Pet Peeve is with the sales people who deliberately ignore the small fry who are trying to make purchases. When shopping with a neighbor and her small son he wanted to buy a gift for his mother. He had her stand out of sight since he wanted to surprise her but he got no attention. His dollar was just as good as an adults and his purchase was just as important to him. -GOOD

DEAR POLLY - Ruth H. should be able to remove the rust spots left by a metal cabinet on her tile floor with oothpaste. It may take two or three applications to remove it all but I have found it works on tar, ink, rust and grease spots on walls. In fact, I have found it works on almost any-DEAR GIRLS - One maker of resilient flooring (such

as Ruth's tiles probably are) suggests removing rust stains by rubbing with FINE steel wool that is wet with detergent and then rinsing, followed by wax. Another remedy they suggest is rubbing LIGHTLY with a cloth dipped in alcohol and then rinsing. Follow with a clean cloth with polish or self polishing wax. —POLLY.

DEAR POLLY — To clean soiled spots on a mattress I take lump starch to which I have added water to make a paste, put this on the spots, let dry until it is a powder and then brush off. This always has worked for me. -MRS.

DEAR GIRLS - If you are out of starch try the same procedure with baking soda. This has worked well for me.

DEAR POLLY - Several weeks ago one of the girls suggested the use of cotton tipped swabs for cleaning the plate and under the bottom of her sewing machine. I think my idea is even better. I use a pastry tube brush. It is permanent, washable, easy to handle and does a thorough job. Materials are now made of such a mixture of things that lint and ravelings are quite a problem. With a firm grasp on such a brush one can get into any area — mine has a round bottle-type brush on one end and a small whisk broom like one on the other. These can be bought in hardware or department stores for less than a dollar. I have been using the same one for two years. Cotton from swabs often leaves a bit of lint, too. -GERTRUDE.



National News Briefs

Skylab Energy Study

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) - While many nations wrestle with the energy crisis, Skylab 3's astronauts concentrate on a study of the sun that could help develop a limitless source of energy. Solar physicist Edward G. Gibson today was to control the first of the many telescopic studies of the sun planned for the 84-day mission Researchers are seeking a clearer idea how the sun produces its energy through thermonuclear fusion, which scientists are trying to perfect as an inexhaustible pollution-free power source. Gibson, commander Gerald P. Carr and William R. Pogue finally finished getting settled in the space station on Sunday, freeing themselves to start research in their 11th day in spare.

Gallup: Kennedy Ahead

PRINCETON, N.J. - The Gallup Poll says its latest survey of Democrats put Sen. Edward M. Kennedy of Massachusetts far ahead of other possible contenders for the party's 1976 presidential nomination. Kennedy was chosen by 41 per cent of the 627 adults who identified themselves as Democrats in the Nov. 2-5 survey. Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace was second with 15 per cent, and Sen. Edmund S. Muskie of Maine was next with nine per

Gulf Denies Oil Find

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (AP) - Gulf Oil Corp. has denied a newspaper story that the company discovered a major new oilfield off the west coast of Africa. The London Sunday Observer said Gulf had made the big strike off the coast of the Portuguese colony of Angola. Gerald Bradley, director of public relations at Gulf headquarters here. said of the story on Sunday: "I don't know where it came from. I have talked with our people here in Pittsburgh who would know if we had any big find over there, public or private, and we don't. It's just not true."

Jupiter's Eye Captured

MOUNTAIN VIEW, Calif. (AP) - The vanishing "eye" of Jupiter has been captured by cameras aboard the Pioneer 10 spacecraft, now five million miles from the planet. The brilliant red "eye," which disappears and reappears about every 30 years, is a shimmering oval 30,000 miles long and 8,000 miles wide in the planet's southern hemisphere. It was clearly visible in color photographs beamed to earth by Pioneer 10, scientists at the Ames Research Center of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration said Sunday. Ames spokesman Pete Waller said the "eye" probably is gaseous material although some scientists speculate it could be hydrogen ice floating in the planet's heavy atmosphere. "Three or four earths could disappear in that eye," he said

World News Briefs

Cambodian War Rages

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) - Government forces repelled four insurgent attacks early this morning on positions along Highway 4 between Phnom Penh and the sea, military sources said.

Seven government soldiers and 32 Khmer Rouge insurgents were killed and 15 government troops wounded, The clashes were reported near the provincial town of

Konpong Speu, 30 miles west of Phnom Penh. Supply traffic from the coast to Phnom Penh is blocked by insurgent forces who control a five-mile stretch of the highway about 35 miles southwest of the capital. Along Highway 5, Phnom Penh's supply road from the rice fields of northwest Cambodia, 12 government soldiers were reported killed and 25 wounded in three days of fighting north of Sala Lek Pram, 35 miles north of the capital, where the highway is cut by insurgents.

In Saigon, the Viet Cong charged the South Vietnamese with the heaviest bombing since the cease-fire in a raid on the Communist base at Kontum, 70 miles northwest of

Saigon military sources confirmed the claim and said 114 bombing sorties were flown against the base Friday. The bombing apparently was in retaliation for a North Vietnamese rocket attack earlier Friday against the government air base at Pleiku.

The Viet Cong delegation to the Joint Military Commission said the day-long attack on Kontum killed dozens of civilians and destroyed hundreds of homes. The government military command reported scattered small-scale shelling attacks and infantry clashes from the Mekong Delta to the northern city of Hue.

Peace Talk 'Condition

TEL AVIV (AP) - Premier Golda Meir's government announced that though it is willing in principle to attend the proposed Middle East peace conference in Geneva next month, she will not make a final decision until Israel receives a formal invitation. Egypt, while also willing in principle to attend, was reported reluctant to agree to start the conference until some Israeli troops withdraw from the Suez Canal. The talks between the Egyptians and Israelis on troop withdrawal were deadlocked by Israel's refusal to allow more than a token Egyptian police force on the east bank of the canal.

IRA Blamed In Deaths

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (AP) - The Irish Republican Army is blamed for the deaths of four of the five persons-three Eritish soldiers and two Roman Catholic civilians - killed by terrorists in Northern Ireland during the weekend. One of the civilians was a man in his 20s whose hooded body was found in Belfast. A total of 913 persons, including 202 British soldiers, now have been reported killed in more than four years of communal warfare in the province.

Brezhnev In India

NEW DELHI-, India (AP)-Soviet Communist party chief Leonid I. Brezhnev arrived for a five-day visit with Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. It was his first visit to another Asian country since he became party head in 1964. Observers expect him to seek Indian endorsement of his proposal for an Asian collective security agreement, and Mrs. Gandhi's price is expected to be the mobile SAM6 antiaircraft missiles that Egypt used successfully in the October war and MIG23 jet fighters.





Need For Money
