## If Only Dulles Had Extended His Hand...

When President Nixon alighted from Air Force One in Peking on Feb. 21, 1972, one of his moves was to extend his hand to Chinse Premier Chou En-Lai.

It was a gesture rich in symbolism. Relations between Washington and Peking might have evolved much differently had Secretary of State John Foster Dulles not spurned Chou's proffered hand at a 1954 Geneva meeting.

"It was probably the most expensive display of rudeness of any diplomat anywhere, ever," wrote journalist Theorodre White, a World War II acquaintance of the Chinese Communist leader. "Chou became a dedicated enemy of American diplomacy for many

Yet, it was Chou and ex-cold warrior Nixon who were most responsible for the gradual thaw in relations between their countries.

The men's new attitudes reflected the changing times. The communism that seemed so frighteningly monlithic in the 1950s had been fragmented by the deterioration of the Sino-Soviet alliance. Peking now felt it had as much to Within weeks of his 1969 inauguration, Nixon set events

in motion by successfully seeking a renewal of the in-formal ambassadorial-level discussions between the United States and Chine that had taken piece intermittently since 1955 in Geneva and Warsaw.

Then — through public utterances and private messages relayed by heads of state friendly with both governments — the president made increasingly clear his desire for better relations with the "People's Republic" (not "Red China" or "Peiping," the terms used by He launched a series of measures easing trade and

tourism between the two countries. The United States dropped its long-standing opposition to Peking's admission to the United Nations, though it still opposed the ouster of Taipei from the world body. The first big breakthrough for the new policy came in April 1971, when the U.S. table tennis team was invited to

"We have opened a new page in relations of the Chinese and the American people," Chou told his U.S. visitors.

Three months later, National Security Adviser Henry Kissinger slipped away during an Asian fact-finding trip to meet with Chou in China.

Out of their two days of meetings came in Nixon visit. At the end of Nixon's week-long "journey for peace," the

In the document, the United States acknowledged that "there is but one China and that Taiwan is part of China" and pledged to reduce its military support of the Nixon had hoped to recognize Peking late in his second term. But things had not progressed beyond the opening of "liaison offices" before Watergate intervened.

President Ford had to reassert U.S. support for Taiwan following the Communist takeovers of Vietnam. Laos and

And President Carter had higher diplomatic priorities in Panama and the Middle East. But the new Chinese leaders who succeeded Chou and Mao Tse-tung continued to press for full normalization of

Now they were motivated not only by apprehension of the Soviets; at the urging of Deputy Premier Teng Hsiao-ping, China had reversed Mao's go-it-alone economic policy to seek increased trade and developmental

assistance from the West. Finally - yet with the appearance of dramatic suddenness - President Carter and Chinse Prime Minister Hua Kuo-feng announced that formal relations between their countries would be established on Jan. 1. Noted their joint statement: "Normalization of Sino-American relations is not only in the interest of the Chinese and American people but also contributes to the cause of peace in Asia and in the world."

#### Church Bus With Teen-Agers Overturns; 13 Hurt In S. C.

GREENVILLE, S.C. (UPI) - A church bus carrying teenagers and counselors from Pinellas Park, Fla., to a North Carolina ski resort overturned today, injuring 13 people most of them slightly.

Authorities said only one person, the Rev Dale Ellsey, 28, driver of the bus, was admitted to Greenville General Hospital. He was reported in fair but stable condition.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UPI) - Law enforcement officials said 47 persons were arrested Thursday on charges of trafficking more than \$2 million in drugs in Memphis and North Mississippi, but they said it may take a week to round up 23 others on the charges. The sword is one of a handful of Japanese weapons with the five-body attestation engraved on its shaft. It was sold to an anonymous dealer.

#### First Space Shuttle 'Columbia'

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The name of the good ship Columbia, rich in the annals of U.S. exploration, will grace the first space shuttle on its orbital test flight next November. Columbia, a sailing frigate launched in 1836, was among the first few U.S. Navy ships to circumnavigate the globe. The command ship for the Apollo lunar landing mission in 1969 also was named Columbia. Astronauts John Young and Rpbert Crippen are scheduled to pilot Columbia on its initial flight into space Nov. 9 from Cape Canaveral.

#### Voyager Photographs Jupiter

PASADENA, Calif. (UPI) — A photograph taken by Voyager 1 at a distance of 29 million miles from the planet, has been transmitted back to earth and scientists say it reveals small details not previously shown. Voyager 1 was 24.5 million miles from the planet Thursday and getting closer at 29,800 mph, relative to the sun, heading for its closest approach March 5.

### Do You Need An FTC Nanny?

There may be no clearer example of empire building by government regulators than the Federal Trade Commission's current crusade to dictate the content of television advertising aimed

To save us from the menace of pre-sugared cereals, candy bars, and toys that fail to meet a bureaucrat's arbitrary standard of suitability, the FTC is considering:

- Banning all television advertising directed at children under eight years of age. - Prohibiting commercials for sugared

products that might contribute to tooth decay in children under 12 years of age. - Requiring advertisers to pay for "nutrition" and "health" ads whose content would be deter-

mined by the commission In short, the Federal Trade Commission proposes to become, in the words of the Washington

Post, a great national nanny. The legitimate role of parents gets short shrift

Overlooked is the simple fact that children too young to understand that television commercials are sales pitches rarely do the family shopping.

Mom and dad buy the food. And mom and dad are perfectly capable of saying no to a child whose vision of dinner is a dozen candy bars or a box of

Has it occurred to the commission that even children who have never watched an hour of television in their lives might still favor a breakfast of ice cream and lollipops

Admittedly, the FTC staff report on which these proposals are based does mention parents. The report suggests that parental disapproval of a child's television-induced gastronomical fantasies fosters "alienation" and "child-parent

necessary to say no to a child a dozen times a day, and does so without producing neurosis.

As for tooth decay, even the FTC doesn't pretend that there is a direct correlation between watching television commercials and the incidence of dental cavities.

As if all this were not enough to bury the FTC proposals under an avalanche of ridicule, consider the First Amendment implications of these potential regulations.

If the commission, acting on the basis of bogus or nonexistent scientific evidence, can ban or restrict ads for cereal, candy and toys, what form of commercial speech is safe from the Washington


All this is not to say that the FTC should relax its enforcement of existing law against false and misleading advertising.

But we do think the agency should give parents a modicum of credit for common sense in raising their own offspring.

### Recovery Question Unanswered

WASHINGTON (NEA) - Worried about possible oil shortages induced by the political turmoil in Iran? Have no fear, because the federal government has stockpiled more than 70 million barrels of petroleum for just such an

Although the Department of Energy has pumped the crude oil into vast underground salt caverns along the Gulf Coast, nobody at DoE is quite sure how to get it out again.

As a matter of fact, DoE has encountered a few other difficulties with its Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR) program, designed to assure the country of a 150-day oil supply in the event of an international crisis. Among those

- In less than two years, DoE's estimate of the cost of the SPR program has more than doubled, from \$1.53 per barrel predicted in May 1977 to \$3.35 per barrel currently projected. The original plan called for placing 500 million barrels of oil in storage at a total cost of SCIENCE WORLD \$7.6 billion. But the big spenders at DoE now are

talking about a one billion barrel reserve with a \$25 billion price tag. - Federal officials originally claimed they would have 125 million barrels in storage by the beginning of this year, then boldly doubled that estimate to 250 million barrels. In fact, only

- Many of the salt caverns designated to hold the oil proved inadequate, producing major delays in filling them. But the DoE officials buying the crude petroleum continued to order additional shipments at a rapid pace.

As a result, DoE last autumn was paying more than \$2 million a month in demurrage the vessels must stand idle off the coast until the recipient is prepared to accept delivery of the

Instead of providing a guaranteed supply of oil if imports from a major supplier (such as Iran) are unexpectedly halted or sharply curtailed, the SPR program has become a textbook example of a government undertaking plagued by unforcesen problems, unacheduled delays, cost overruns and miscalculations.

Currently being filled with oil are sub-West Hackberry, La., and Bayou Choctaw, La. A mine at Weeks Island, La. is being prepared and a fifth site is being acquired at Sulphur Mines.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (UPI) - Documentary filmmaker Stan Woodward admits his unroarious new film "It's Grits!" fails in one area - it never resolves the grammatical dilemma of whether "grits is good or grits are What the the 36-year-old South Carolina moviemaker's

film does determine, however, is that Southerners love their grits with a passion that is often puzzling to their Northern friends. When it comes to grits, Woodward's low-budget film

leaves no stone unturned. Nearly every segment of society, from black children to stereotypical rednecks to illustrious New York Times food critic Craig Claiborne, is interviewed on the subject. "I love grits souffle, even Yankees love it," insists Claiborne as he prepares his delicacy in his New York

Claiborne, one of the world's best-known cooking experts, grew up in Sunflower, Miss., where he said he developed his taste for the white, lumpy cornbased food that is routinely plunked on breakfast plates across the

But the film, which also explores the history and production of grits, proves conclusively that the mushy substance is not just a breakfast food. "You can eat grits anytime, for breakfast, lunch or

dinner." says one "actor." Woodward, who calls his film a "celebration of what I think the best of Southern culture is all about," wasn't content to let the people who know all about grits - those living south of the Mason-Dixon line - do all the talking. So, he took his camera to the streets of Brooklyn where, among other things, he found a young man who told him:

"Yea, grits. That's that Italian food isn't it?" "It's Grits!" is a fast-paced, mouth-watering documentary, accompanied by lively music.

In Columbia, where it has been shown only four times free of charge, it has drawn standing-room only crowds. Woodward, a native of Spartanburg who is the filmmaker in residence at the South Carolina Arts Commission, got the idea for the film three years ago while eating breakfast in his favorite diner - 1900 Block. "I noticed that only about three people asked the waitress to hold the grits," said Woodward. In a fit of inspiration, he ran back to his office, grabbed a camera and returned to the restaurant.

"I was taken by the spontaniety of people who wanted to talk about grits," he said. "It was so fresh and exciting that it evolved into a much larger project." With a little seed money from the Arts Commission, and

the help of the National Endowment of the Arts, Wood-He trekked to high school football games, amusement parks, corn fields and restaurants, asking people how they felt about grits.

personal loans. The movie cost about \$12,000 to produce, and has been selected for showing at the New York Filmmakers Exposition. Woodward said he plans to distribute the movie to schools and libaries across the South in order to recover

his costs and "maybe make a modest profit." But his hidden desire, he confesses, is to show the movie to the man who unwittingly has done more to promote grits than anyone else - President Jimmy Carter. "When I first started making this film, people were talking about "Grits and Fritz," Woodward said.



#### You Have The Ball, Kenny

NEW YORK (UPI) - Here's the way I see the Kenny Stabler

Without knowing whether he is or isn't involved in that amateurishly contrived cocaine comic-opera in Gulf Shores, Ala., I do know he certainly isn't doing himself a whole lot of good with some of the statements he has been making.

In one of them, he accused the writer who came to Alabama to interview him, Bob Padecky of the Sacramento Bee, of "being out

I did some checking in California with those who know Padecky and have worked with him and everyone I talked with told me the same thing, that he's a straight arrow, a good, level-headed newspaperman and not at all the type to go out and intentionally

That was one Stabler statement which didn't seem to hold much water. He made another which I'm reasonably sure he didn't give a whole lot of thought. "I have no loyalties to the Silver and Black

Specifically, he was talking about the Oakland Raiders, the team he has been with nine years, and if he really means what he's saying, how can he keep taking their money? You don't spit in the hand that feeds you.

Basically, Kenny Stabler is a nice guy, a guy who once had it all and let it get away from him. Maybe he fancied himself so secure. so famous, he didn't have to worry anymore about such a minor detail as taking care of himself. He didn't do too good job of that last season and nobody knows that better than he does. He says he was "in the best shape of my life" when he reported to the Raiders' training camp. Too bad he didn't stay in that same shape the rest of the season, though.

For reasons probably known only to him, Stabler decided to pull a Thurman Munson following Oakland's third game this past season. He had always talked with sports writers before, but now after the Raiders had won only one of their first three games, he informed the writers that win or lose, he no longer would talk to them after the games. Okay, fine. He kept his word. There were no interviews for the rest of the season.

Now, suddenly, he feels an urgent need to talk, to get out his side

of the story, so he's granting interviews again. Wouldn't it be terrible if nobody cares what Kenny Stabler has to say now? I'm not that sure there are that many who do. What he's apparently trying to say is that many of his problems can be attributed to the team owner, Al Davis, and the sports writers in the Bay Area, who made him and John Madden scapegoats for the Raiders' 9-7 record last season. It's funny, but I don't recall John Madden claiming he was made a scapegoat by either Davis or the press upon leaving the Raiders a few weeks ago.

. When Stabler lays the blame on Davis and the sports writers, he should bear in mind they didn't throw the ball, he did. He should also remember that when the Raiders were winning more regularly, it was he who received most of the credit and he readily accepted it. Now that they didn't have that good a season, he should be able to accept the criticism as well.

I remember Stabler doing the same thing when George Blands was quarterbacking the Raiders. Blands hept telling him to be nations, that Stabler eventually would get his chance after he gitired, and I also remember how Stabler once told me he didn't think Blanda would ever quit.

My own feeling now is that time generally takes care of hine Stabler ion't that old, only 33, and the says he can't come back next season and have a great year with

the Raiders. It's entirely up to him. I don't know if he's lee any advice, but if he is, I'd suggest he talk to sports writers again and resume the same relationship he had with them as he did in

That seemed to be his natural way, and nothing over succeeds more than plain naturalness. If Kenny Stabler thinks back, he enjoyed his best years that way — when he was just plain natural

Not only did he have the awesome Miss Hepburn as his co-star, but the director was George Cukor, one of the greats of the golden age of Hollywood. The Cukor-Hepburn team produced 10 films, starting with "Bill of Divorcement" in 1932 and including "Philadelphia Story," "Holiday" and "Keeper of the Flame."

"When you think you're working with two people like that - very famous people, with incredible reputations, people who are legends, it can be nervous making," Saynor said in an interview.

"At first you might think because of their greater age, maybe they are settled in their ways - but the two of them are so flexible, and especially Mr. Cukor has this great elasticity of mind.

"And they were so enthusiastic — they had so much energy. I was the one that got tired."

Saynor's slight build wasn't the burly diamond in the rough that Cukor and Hepburn had in mind for the Welsh miner. What do real Welsh miners look like?

"Like me," Saynor said with a grin. He gained 25 pounds for the film — although on the screen he certainly doesn't look it — to appear heftier.

"Miss Hepburn bought me some weights to build me up - I asked her to sign them. She was very determined that I put on more bulk."
