"I do not think a new approach. would get over the difficulty, which is the unwillingness of Russia to cooperate," Attlee told the House of Commons.

Attlee's remark was prompted by this question from Laborite Norman D. Dodde:

Will the Prime Minuter take the initiative in calling a conference for the purpose of endeavoring to find ways and means of nutlewing the hydrogen bomb and all atomic weapons in view of the desire of the people that he diould do 102"

Attlee replied that "the initial ... tive has already been taken as long ago as 1945. We have been pressing this matter continuously and it is now before the United Nations.

The suggestion of a new top level approach to Joseph Stalin was made by Conservative Leader Winston Churchill during the recent election campaign. Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin waved it away as a "stunt" to get votes. Conservative Sir Waltron Smithers then asked Attlee whether, in view of the hetrayal of the West's atomic secrets by Com-munist Dr. Kishii Fuchs, the Lapor government will introduce a bill to out law Britain's Commu
