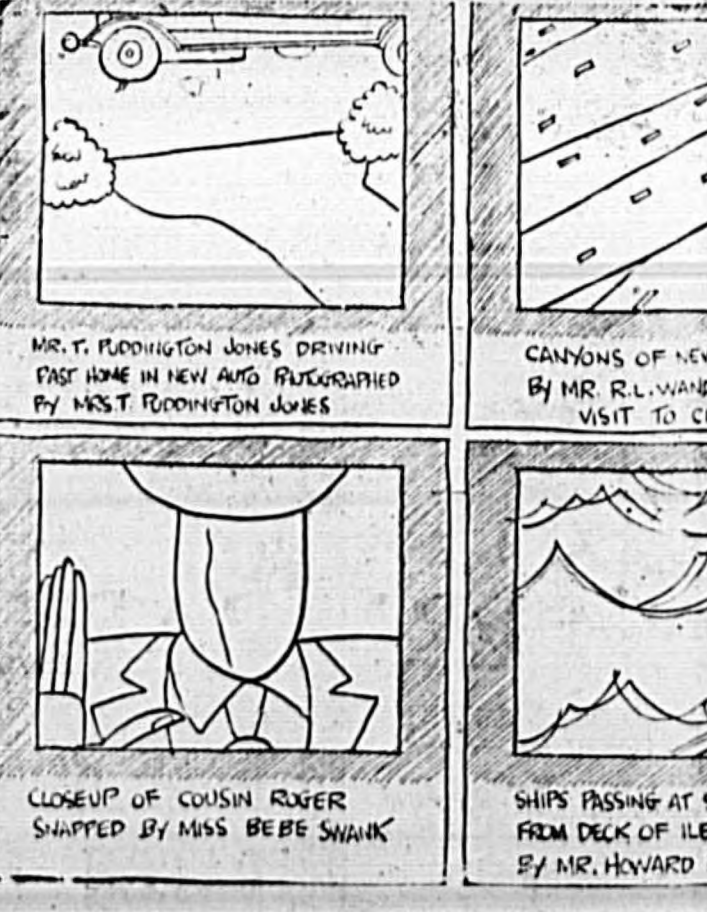

We give it to them in our musical rhythm, that is, we translate it in our own language, but it is understood by everyone."

Why, then, argues Ingraham, does our national government neglect this obvious channel for building up strong international relationships?

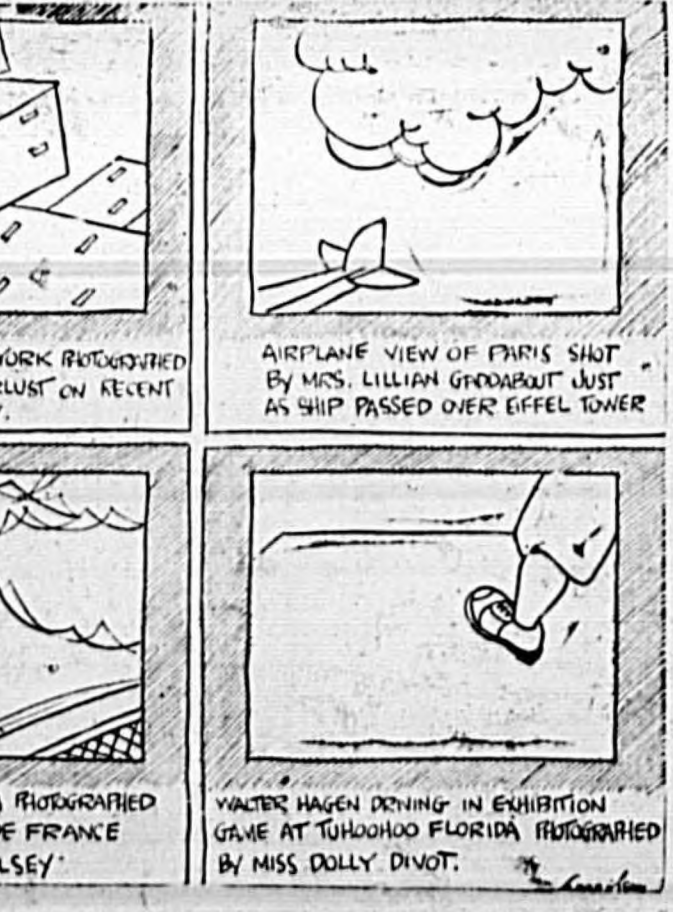
