Violence Strikes Nation's Capital

The fires and thrown rocks and bottles of racial violence struck Washington, D.C., today in a 24-hour disturbance that brought rioting bands of Negroes to within a mile of the White House.

A police charge and a heavy rain broke up the groups who had surged north and northwest of White House, Capitol and other landmarks, breaking windows and in at least one case looting a liquor store.

In Detroit, Gov. George Romney today called off the curfew that had been in effect in the city and some of its suburbs since July 23. Although a state of emergency remains in force, restrictions on the sale of liquor, gasoline and public assemblies were also lifted.

The Washington outbreak came as violence in Milwaukee and Portland, Ore., subsided and charges grew that rioting had played a role in the handling of the Detroit riot.

In Milwaukee, some 4,000 National Guardsmen appeared to have a firm grip on the disturbances that brought two shooting deaths and more than 100 injuries and 260 arrests Sunday and Monday.

An alleged sniper was arrested Monday night and a 34-year-old Negro woman appeared to suffer a heart attack as the fire from a five-story building burned.

A curfew on the city was lifted temporarily but will be re-imposed tonight.

Police in Portland, where the worst racial disturbance in Oregon's history flared Sunday and Monday, reported the streets quiet. Negroes were ordered to return to their homes by rioting racists in a loudspeaker truck and they complied within moments.

Some 30 arrests were made in White House.

A brick hurled through the windshield of a car seven blocks from the White House caused minor injuries to a fireman. There were reports of gunfire, but police later attributed the blasts to firecrackers exploding in garbage cans.

Other incidents hit Providence, R.I., and Erie, Pa., where racial disturbances flared two weeks ago.

In Providence, a man was shot and another stabbed but not seriously injured before a Negro section was closed off during a series of rock and bottle-throwing incidents. No arrests were made and police reported the disturbances "pretty well broken up" by midnight.

Police and firemen were called into Erie's Little Negro ghetto and another rioting band of East Side neighborhood with bottles and rocks were reported. 90-Day Wonder Takes On New Meaning

ST. BENNING, Ga. (AP)—Stripes on the sleeve, instead of bars on the shoulder, will mark the "90-day wonder" of the Vietnam war.

A new term, "instant NCO," commissioned officers trained through 12-week classes at Ft. Benning under a program designed to produce thousands of new recruits to lead fire teams and other units.

The program is patterned after the "90-day wonder" course which filled a shortage of officers in the Vietnam war.

Officially titled the NCO Candidate Course, the new program is expected to turn out 10,000 NCOs in 1967.
