

## Bullet Riddled Body Of Bomb Suspect Is Found Suspended From Tree

### Victim Had Been Taken From Officers Who Had Arrested Him As Plant City Bomber

TAMPA, Fla., Apr. 28.—(AP)—The bullet riddled body of John Hodz, suspected of the Plant City bombing, was found swinging from a tree in an oak hammock 10 miles northwest of Plant City early today by N. M. Davis, a woodsman, according to Sheriff R. T. Joughlin.

The body was clothed in a cheap black alpaca coat and white dress trousers. A few minutes after the officials reached the place where the discovery was made, the body had been removed from the hammock and placed in a car.

The body was found in a natural glen, surrounded by live oak, palmettos and the dense undergrowth with the spot a wooded and fairly level, the road leading to it being only a few feet from the woods.

Rain was falling as Mr. Watkins, who was hunting for a deer, discovered the body. He was alone at the time and he was not far from the spot where the body was found.

The bill was passed by a vote of 245 to 100.

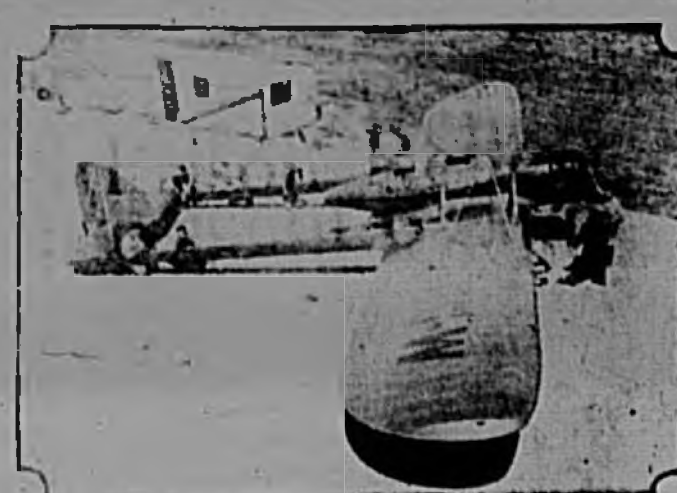
## SEVERE BLAST SHAKES YACHT OF VANDERBILT

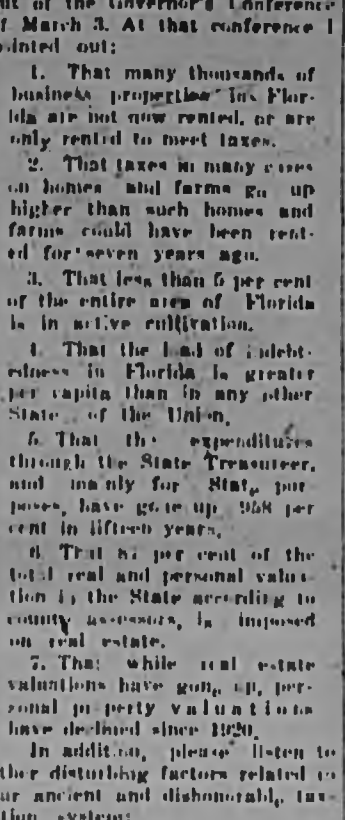
