Sheriff back at work after hospital stay

incident happened, firerescue was called. The sheriff was subsequently transported to the hospi-tal by Chief Deputy Steve Harriett some

time after 9 p.m. While at the hospital, he received a battery of tests, all of which showed to be normal. He was released Saturday morning.

According to a report from the Sheriff's Department, Eslinger did not suffer chest pains, which had been inadvertently mentioned by personnel on the scene when the fire-rescue team was originally summoned. However, to be on the safe side, hospital officials felt it necessary

to keep the sheriff overnight. Eslinger has served as Seminole County Sheriff since January, 1991.

Dale offered top job at airport

SANFORD — Less than a month after leaving office as mayor, Larry Dale has a new job offer — president of the Orlando Sanford

International Airport.
The Airport Authority Board unanimously approved creating the position and offering it to Dale. If he accepts, Dale

Dale would be the top full-time executive at the airport, a position currently held by Executive Director Victor

Airport board votes 9-0 to name former mayor as president

White. White would remain as executive director, but answer to Dale.

"The Airport Authority has been look-ing for some means to bring Larry on board because of his expertise," said White, who laid out the proposal in a memo to board members over the week-

In that memo, White proposed two options: he and Dale serve as equals, or

appoint Dale as the top executive. In either scenario, Dale's primary role would be to increase economic development at the airport. White has received criticism, both from Dale when he was mayor and board members, for not aggressively pursuing industrial devel-opment deals at the airport.

Asked if the proposal was a way to shore up support for his job, White said, "In a sense you might call it that. But really this is an expansion. My expertise is in airport management, and in those areas we have seen tremendous growth.

"Larry is development-oriented. That's his background and he's very good at it. That's something we desperately need right now, and we have not been able to move ahead in that area as fast as any-

Rumors of Dale taking on a role at the airport began several months before he left office as mayor. During an interview in February, Dale said he hadn't consid-

Wall piques residents' curiosity

Groseclose wonders if fall has historical significance

SANFORD — There's a wall of mystery on Elliot Avenue. Behind Debbra Groseclose's

house on the 400 block of the avenue is an old crumbly stone and cement wall currently used for decorative purposes. Always interested in its history, the Sanford resident wants to know why and when the structure was built.

"I am just looking for answers," Groseclose said. "If the wall means something to the city, I want to make sure it is preserved."

Groseclose, who has lived on Elliot Avenue for five years, began looking for answers by researching the history of the house, which was built in 1925 by the Fort Mellon

Development Co.
"I don't know anything about the property before the house was built," Groseclose said. "That's as far back as I could get." In 1928, Kat

Sperring bought the house and lived in it until 1930, when the house was sold to Sanford Building and Loan for \$3,500 during a public auction. The house was eventually sold to B.E. and Anne Aiken, who lived at the location for almost

half a century.
"I got in touch with the Aikens, and they told me the wall was there when they bought the house," Groseclose said. "They did say the wall was taller than it is now."

It may have also been much longer than the few yards cur-rently standing on the proper-ty. Groseclose has found pieces of stone in various areas around her house that match

pieces of the wall.

"Anytime we do any work on our place, we dig up pieces of cement and granite," Groseclose said. "It's all over

the property."

She is also curious about the earth surrounding the wall, which is "really soft and mushy" even though the rest of the land around the consists of harder dirt.

Sanford Museum Curator Alicia Clarke said the wall may have been built as a boundary

dividing residential developments in the old Mayfair area.

However, there is no mention of a wall or the neighborhood on older maps of Elliot Avenue.
"Our best guess right now is that the wall was built when the Mayfair development was built, Clarke said. "It may have been a wall surrounding the

subdivision.

"During the '20s, all kinds of subdivisions were planned during the building boom," she said. "Some were never fin-

ished or don't exist anymore."



From 1967 until it closed in 1976, the present site of New Tribes Mission on East First Street in Sanford, was the Sanford Naval Academy. It was a private preparatory boarding school, offering private personal education with small classes, with the focal point being true learning experiences.

Students enrolled in the school were from various parts of the United States, as well as some from Central and South America, Mexico and Canada.

Many of the staff members were retired military personnel, giving the students a structured learning environment while offering leadership training as well as an advanced education. The staff members were excellent as role models for the midshipmen and stood as examples of leadership and service to their country from the late 60s to early 70s.

Some of the instructors, many local area residents from Daytona Beach to Orlando, not only served as educators, but as

coaches, guidance councilors and house parents, Local high school girls served as cheerleaders for the school during their athletic programs which included baseball, foot-ball, basketball, track, swimming and crew.

Now, the time has come for all the graduates of the Sanford Naval Academy to gather together and reunite once again.

With the assistance of Jeanne Esclavon from the Seminole County Public Schools, the former students at the Sanford Naval Academy are planning a reunion of all classes.

A reception to kick off the event will be held on June 9 at the Best Western Marina Hotel on Lake Monroe.

Losing the battle

War on drugs fought with all the wrong weapons

Sometime soon, Darryl Strawberry, the once-great baseball player, could end up serving time. His latest drug binge (he ran away from his court-ordered drug rehabili-

..... tation program in March) could cost him, a

three-time probation violator, his freedom.
The same fate could await Robert Downey Jr., the talented actor whose starring role in the hit TV show "Ally McBeal" could not restrain his self-destructive tendencies. He was arrested in California, apparently stoned. That came just days before he was to appear in court for an alleged Thanksgiving drug binge. Both arrests jeopardize his parole; he was

released in August after a one-year stint in a California prison on drug-related charges.

Strawberry and Downey have both wasted their tal-ents, waylaid or destroyed promising careers and abused their loved ones. But neither man is a menace to society. Why put them behind bars? Why not a measured punishment that fits the crime: continued court-ordered treatment, random drug testing, electronic monitoring, and increased restrictions on their social and professional

It may be that no judge would feel sympathy for highly paid and pampered stars who broke every rule, abused every amnesty and flouted the law. Certainly, Strawberry and Downey deserve no special consideration because they are celebrities. There should be no mercy granted to Darryl Strawberry, baseball player, that would not be granted to Darryl Williams, Wai-Mart clerk, no break given to Robert Downey Jr., actor, that would not be given to Robert Wayne Dennis, plumber.

But the same question applies to self-destructive substance abusers of every social station: Is society served by putting them in jail? Why does our criminal justice system treat drug addicts the same way it treats car thieves and bank robbers?

If you have ever watched a life waste away in the grip of addiction, you know that narcotics are dangerous substances that rob the user first of judgment, finally of humanity. Heroin, cocaine and a host of other illegal sub-stances can ruin lives, wreck families, breed crime and poison whole communities.

Because those drugs are so dangerous, we have fought them with a variety of aggressive and punitive measures, from interdiction abroad to incarceration at home. Unfortunately, this "war on drugs" creates the same havoc it was meant to prevent; it ruins lives, wrecks families and breeds crime. It is a classic burn-the-village-to-


save-it strategy. Incarceration of drug addicts deprives them of drug treatment (little treatment is available in most prisons) and isolates them from family support. It takes up precious prison beds that ought to be reserved for genuine societal threats: rapists, murderers and drug kingpins, for example. Worse yet, this punitive strategy makes criminals out of thousands of Americans who have done nothing worse than torture themselves and their loved ones.

Interdiction, for its part, burns up billions of dollars that could be spent instead on drug treatment, drug courts and prevention programs. Attempts to dry up the drug supply also entangle the United States in questionable relationships with foreign governments, such as the U.S.-Peruvian agreement that led to the recent mistaken shooting-down of a small airplane carrying American missionaries.

If this incarceration-interdiction strategy were working, its high costs might make sense. But it's a miserable failure. Significant numbers of Americans still use illegal dnigs; even as the crack epidemic fades, heroin and Ecstasy burst into popularity. Meanwhile, narcotics continue to flow past our porous borders by the tons; pressure on the Peruvians just increases the flow from Colombia or Brazil.

Alcoholics Anonymous, the classic model of substanceabuse treatment, says the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting a different result. By that definition, our "war on drugs" is

Mayor decides he won't be board's liaison

It's a time to continue improvements and guarantee the breakdowns don't happen again. I hope that Commissioner Williams will consider continuing to serve not just the Commission, but more importantly, the residents, as their liaison to the Housing Authority. She has a big heart and her dedication to service is unmatched. I remain convinced that she more than any other City Commissioner/Mayor is suited for the job, and have no doubt that together we will help the SHA become successful.

"There is no provision in the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees that would prohibit you from becoming the Executive Director of the Airport after you leave office as mayor," Claypool added.

City Attorney Bill Colbert reached a similar conclusion in an April 20 letter to Dale.

"The key factor, in your case, appears to be that the provision that 'no former commissioner shall hold any compensated appointive city office or employment' for one year," Colbert wrote. "The airport director is an employee of the Sanford Airport Authority, a special district created by the Legislature, not an employee of the city of Sanford."

For his part, Dale said he does not know whether he will accept a position at the airport.

There's been a lot of discussion, but nothing has been offered," Dale said. "I'd have to look at the specifics. I would say

that I'm intrigued by the idea, and it would be a challenge I would consider.

"I look forward to meeting with the chairman and discussing the matter," Dale added.

In his final months as mayor, Dale said one of the reasons he wasn't seeking re-election was a desire to rebuild his residential development firm. He currently is seeking permits to build a subdivision on Celery Avenue. Dale said if he accepts the airport job, he will "phase out of that business." He said he will work to get the Celery Avenue property through the site plane process and then diminish his

role in the project.

White said he expects the airport board to vote on a contract for Dale at it's June 6 meeting. Because his own responsibilities will change, White said the board would also consider a new contract for his services, as





Lovebugs once again invade Central Florida

Lovebugs are small black flies Feeding with a red thorax that have been invading our lives for the past several weeks. They are considered a nuisance mainly because they congregate in large numbers along highways

and splatter on windshields and grills of our

Damage

Car's windshields become covered with the Ferrer fatty remains that can become thick enough to obscure vision. The flies can also clog radiators and cause our cars to overheat. The fatty tissue can pit our car's finish if not removed within a few days.

A word of caution, do not paint your house now, lovebugs can mar freshly painted sur-

Adult lovebugs are harmless - they do not sting or bite. They feed on the nectar

of various plants, especially sweet clover, brazilian pepper and goldenrod.

Frequency Of Flights Two flights of lovebugs occur each year in Central Florida. The spring flight occurs during late April and May. A second flight occurs in fall around

late August and September. Flight periods generally last four to five. Flights are usually restricted to daylight hours and temperatures above 68 degrees.

Mating takes place almost immediately after emergence of the females. Adult females live

only two to three days.

There are several effective insecticides available for lovebug control, but spraying can be impractical because infestations occur over such a vast area and for a short period of time. You can control lovebugs in confined areas like porches and around your home with aerosol sprays available for other household insects.

Predators have substantially reduced the population of lovebugs in Central Florida during the past several years.

Lovebug larvae populations are extremely high in pasture areas, making an ideal environment for certain bird predators like robins and quails Armadillos are thought to be predators as well, but scientific data has yet to back this up.

Certain beetle larvae, earwigs and centipedes have been found to be natural predators of lovebug larvae in the soil.

Lovebugs And Your Car There are several things a motorist can do to lessen the lovebug nuisance. First, travelling at night can reduce the incidence of lovebugs since they are active only in the day, usually after 10 a.m. Also travelling at a lower speed will reduce the number of bugs splattered on your car.

There are many types of screens available that can be placed on the front grill of your car to protect the finish and prevent the radiator from becoming clogged. If a large screen can't be used on the front of the car, a smaller screen can be put behind the grill but in front of the radiator.

Splattered lovebugs should be washed off the car as soon as possible. Cars that have been waxed recently are more protected from damage by lovebug residue. Soaking the area with water for several minutes will aid in removal

When lovebugs are numerous, or you know you will be traveling at the peak times, you can spread a light film of baby oil or use an aerosol oil spray over the front of the hood, above the windshield, and the grill and bumper. This practice will make lovebug removal easier.



Williams has been sharply criticized for her performance as liaison. Lessard said last week that his original decision is "not a reflection on Velma." He went a step further in his letter acknowledging there were breakdowns in communication and oversight, but no

one person should be blamed. "Commissioner Williams didn't breakdown, everyone

did — HUD, the Housing Authority Board, the former director, the city of Sanford, everyone," Lessard wrote in his letter.

Williams defended her actions as liaison, saying her role was only to pass information between the housing authority board and the City Commission.

'There's been a lot of miscommunication about what I was suppose to be doing," Williams said. "It was never my role as liaison to take personal responsibility for the housing authority. I didn't have that authority. I couldn't vote on the board. I couldn't even make suggestions."

While Williams blames her critics for failing to understand the duties of a liaison, she said she doesn't intend to ask Lessard or the City

Commission to clarify them. "I'm not going to ask the commission to define my role," Williams said. "Ya'll might have a problem viewing what my duties are, but I don't." Lessard said, however, he

believes the commission should outline what it expects from its liaisons.

"The other liaison positions are pretty well defined, but we should probably take a look at them all," he said.



This week we will look at West Lake Tohopekaliga in Kissimmee on our review of the top 10 bass lakes in Florida.

When you ask Florida Fish and Wildlife **Conservation Commission**

(FWC) fisheries biologists what are the top bass fishing lakes in Florida you get a lot of different opinions. But one thing is

West Lake Tohopekaliga is

on everyone's list. In a Bass Anglers Sportsman Society (B.A.S.S.) tournament on Jan. 17-20 at Lake Tohopekaliga, the win-ner landed 108 pounds, 12 ounces of bass, shattering the organization's previous high mark of 91 pounds, 3 ounces. On the first day of the tournament, a B.A.S.S. single-day catch record was established at 45 pounds, 2 ounces that included two bass more than 10 pounds, and a 9, 8 and 7-pounder to round out the five-fish bag limit.

FWC director of freshwater fisheries, Ed Moyer, who spent 20 years for the agency managing lake Tohopekaliga said, "It was the most incredible four days of fishing that I have ever heard of in Florida or anywhere else for that matter. Florida has taken a major step toward re-establishing itself as the Bass Capital of the World."

Moyer credits the tournament's success to FWC's lake management practices on Lake Tohopekaliga during the past decade. As a result, anglers can expect ars of quality

ing.
Drawdowns have enabled us to enhance water quality, restore shoreline habitat and replace noxious weed growth with desirable, productive aquatic plant species. Also, we instituted statewide regulations and policies in 1992 to return Florida's inland fisheries to their previous greatness," Moyer said.

"We reduced the daily bag limit from 10 bass of any size to five bass that had to meet a minims size limit of either 12 or 14 inches depending on the location and established a one-over-22-inch rule to restore trophy bass fishing."

flipping plastic worms, crayfish and lizards in shoreline vegetation is a common technique among successful anglers. Casting Carolina- or Texas-rigged plastic worms, jerkbaits, spinnerbaits or top-water propeller balts in these areas are also popular methods. Anglers fishing live golden shiners account for some of the larger bass caught from the lake.

In spring 2002, the FWC will conduct a lake drawdown to help remove bottom sediments and stimulate native vegetation. Bass fishing should be outstanding during this time of low water. Lowered water level will also provide prime wade fishing opportunities for anglers.





Faulk tops SARA, Thompson retires in style at Speedworld

BITHLO — For several years, Orlando Speedworld was the home track of veteran racer Lee Faulk and he has many wins to his credit here. Friday night, Lee played the role of crew chief and watched as his son Michael Faulk rode to victory in the Executive Racing School SARA Late Model 100 lapper in impressive style.

This Friday night (May 5) Orlando Speedworld will be hosting the first race in the Mini Stock Challenge Tour for 2001. The four-bangers will duke it out for 50 laps and \$500 to win.

Also on the schedule will be the DARA Antique Cars as well as heats and features in the Super Late Models, Modified, Sportsman, Mini-Stock Super Stock & Strictly Stock divisions.

It looked as though Faulk would have to play second fiddle to another young gun, Jason Boyd.

Boyd set fast time among the 40 teams entered with a new track record for the SARA series of 13.898 sec. at just over 97 MPH on the threeeighths mile. Boyd then drew the #1 pill and sat on the pole for the race which he immediately

began to dominate from the drop of the green. The field of 28 did some great racing in the early laps avoiding the usual early-race crashes

that tend to happen here.

The first caution flew on lap 19 as Jimbo
Bjorkland tagged the frontatetch wall and spun to a stop in turn one.

Racing resumed with Boyd still showing the way by a big margin as Faulk worked his way into second spot, leading a freight train past Richard Baer who had been gamely holding on to second up to that point.

Just like Winston Cup at Talladega, you knew something was bound to happen sooner or later with so many cars running so close together, and the "big one" finally took place on lap 44 when cars racing for position in the middle of the field ran up on several lapped machines.

ran up on several lapped machines.

Someone got loose on the front straightsway and before the smoke cleared, the cars of Kevin Ingram, Martin Pierce, Chris Lawrence, and Tony Amico were done for the night. Several other cars received damage including that of Wayne Morris. Morris, winner of the two previous SARA events, spent several laps in the pits making

repairs and returned to complete at total of 59 laps, good for a 20th place finish.

Another victim of the crash was Boyd, who ran over some debris and cut down a tire forcing him to pit. Boyd returned at the tail end of the field for the restart.

Faulk made the most of his good fortune, opening up a decent lead and surviving a rash of caution flags over the final 50 laps.

Boyd was the show from this point as he tempted to work his way back to the front. In doing so, he was involved in three seperate incidents including a wild, smoky spin at the start-finish line. Despite all this, Boyd still managed a ninth place finish.

No one was going to catch Faulk as he raced to a comfortable win in his Pierce Motorsports Monte Carlo. Rookle contender Brad Barkis did an excellent job of holding off 2000 SARA champ Bobby Beauchemin for second. Kenrick Gomez seemed to come from out of nowhere in the clos-

ing laps to get fourth spot ahead of Joe Boyd.
Joe Sumansky, Kavin Dueleo, Chip Shell, Jacon
Boyd, and Larry Osteen rounded out the top 10.
"It felt like we were racing slot cars," said Michael Faulk's dad Lee, commenting on sitting next to his old nemesis Leroy Porter in the grandstands while Lee was on the radio with his son

and Porter was doing likewise with Jason Boyd. Chip Shell won the Hard Charger Award for the race while Kevin Ingram raced his way into the

100-lapper with a victory in the B-Main.

Jason Boyd had even more disappointment in the Modified feature. Trying to win his third in a

row, Boyd tangled with leader Hank Sanders sending both to the rear of the field.

That handed the lead to veteran Bruce

Thompson who held off the late challenges of '99 track champ Gary English to take what would be his first, and only win of the season as Thompson announced his retirement from racing in victory

Boyd raced back to third at the finish only to be set back a spot for jumping a restart. However, he still ended up in third place when Ted Head's car came up light in post-race inspection. Ironically, Head's car is owned by head tech inspector Donnie Lewis.

"Make sure you tell everybody that the tech inspector disqualified his own car tonight," said Lewis. "When you're right, you're right... When you're wrong," he said."
Frank Polly took the checker in fourth place followed by Shain Held.

Tim "Missleman" McPhail took his second win of the year in the Minl Stock feature holding off a determined affort by newcomer Trans Flord.


