Sanford's Opportunity

The limitless possibilities of the resort business in Florida have been made doubly clear to local residents during the war when, despite restrictions on travel and the almost total lack of tourists in the usual meaning of the word, Sanford hotels, apartments and rooming houses have been almost constantly filled because of the large number of service men's families located here in connection with the Sanford Naval Air Station.

These were tourists, in a sense, for whom we did not have to advertise, for whom no special inducements had to be offered, and for whom it was not necessary for us to compete with other more aggressive resorts. They were sent here by the government, they had no choice in the matter, but for the most part we believe they enjoyed their

stay. Now most of them are gone.
