Nixon's Welfare Reform Plans Delayed By 'Kinks'

 WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon's welfare reform proposals remain lodged at the White House in their 11th draft because of kinks in the family assistance program.

Congress probably will have to wait another two weeks before receiving a final detailed package of welfare legislation, government sources say.

The President said last month he wants to replace aid programs for dependent children with a sweeping family assistance program that would provide minimum aid of \$1,600 a year to a needy family of four.

And for the first time, a working family of four with income less than \$2,700 a year could receive a cash supplement under the proposal.

White House drafters say completion of the family assistance plan is being slowed by such questions as these:

- What amount of personal assets can a family retain and still be eligible for aid?
- How many times a year must a family report its income for recalculation of benefits?
- How long should a person have to wait for his first monthly check after making application?
- What value should be placed on the land of a farmer who has had several years of crop failures?

Other issues, appearing trivial on the surface but still important, have been settled, sources say.

A family would be able to keep its house, for example, and still receive benefits. A tenant farmer would not be docked the value of vegetables grown in his own garden.

Roner M. Ball, commissioner of the Social Security Administration, concedes there are difficulties in running a nationwide family assistance program.

Ball, whose agency would administer the program, is confident they can be worked out. He said the program would be a massive public works program similar to the one that brought 20 million elderly persons into the Medicare system.

Ball and other officials in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare admit special problems would be posed by front operations in big cities and mobile offices in rural areas.

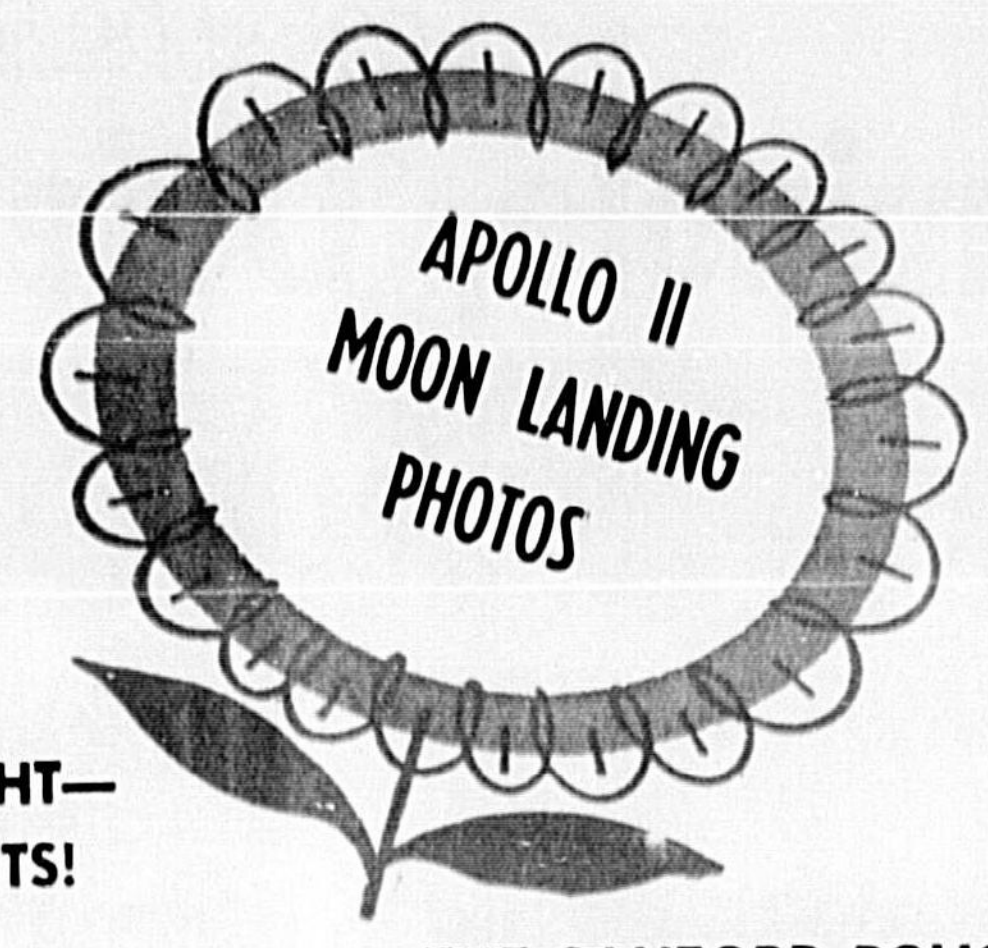

Jewelry, Clothing For Beautiful People

NEW YORK (AP) — "If you've got a pair of pliers and imagination, you can do an awful lot," said an assistant to jewelry designer Bill Smith as she held up a pair of pants made of gold coils.
The pants, along with a matching vest, were one of a number of items at a show Tuesday night of Smith's latest jewelry.
The 34-year-old designer, one of the first Negroes in the business, creates dresses, suits, neckties, capes with "pearlized" rhinestones, pearl, black beads and metal chains of his own design. Smith said his designs are "jewelry as clothing. They are strong enough so they can be clothing in themselves."
A former dancer who worked in a jewelry factory when he first came to New York and finally decided he preferred jewelry, he said his designs "can be worn over clothing or instead of clothing."
The models Tuesday draped the jewelry over simple jersey dresses by Jimmie Figgie, over body stockings and over bare skin.
Among the standout items were a long scarf of pearls, trimmed with cloth tassels, a metal cape with "pearlized" rinks, a flow-length skirt of ropes of pearls, a short skirt and vest of jet beads and a pearl cape.
There are about two dozen pieces in the collection for Richelle, retailing for between \$35 and \$150. The pearl scarf, for example, is \$100.
Smith admitted that "not everyone can wear these things. There are many people, however, who will make sacrifices for beauty."
Among the disadvantages of the jewelry clothing is their weight. The pearls Smith uses have an alabaster or plastic base, but they still make a six-foot scarf pretty heavy.

It's really odd how things work out. Take for instance the pennant races. In the NL West, San Francisco leads the division with an 83-66 record for .554 per cent. But Detroit trails the Orioles by 18 1/2 games in the AL East but has a record of 84-64, with a percentage of .568. This puts them two games better than the Giants.

Speaking of pennant races, it's too bad the AL fans don't have one. Baltimore has already clinched the Eastern flag and have a 100-46 record going into the stretch, while Minnesota is 10 1/2 games out in front of Oakland, and are counting the games till the title is theirs.

But the NL doesn't have a pennant race. They are over-extended. They have not one, but two exciting pennant drives. The Western division, which was dominated by the Cubs just weeks ago, now has a new leader. The New York Mets, the annual regular of the royal NL floor mat, have climbed to the top, and behind the fine pitching of Tom Seaver and Jerry Kosman, they could just go all the way to the division title.

The Mets showed they had hitting power as well as pitching thrust earlier this week when they defeated the St. Louis Cardinals, in spite of a 19 strike-out performance by the Cardinal's Steve Carlton. Carlton will go into the history books for his name being carried next to it. Carlton, the St. Louis hard-luck lefty, shattered the major league record for most strike-outs in a game held by Bob Feller, Sandy Koufax and Don Wilson.

The Mets were powered to their win by a pair of two-run homers by Ron Swoboda. The Mets are currently riding four games ahead of the Cubs, and the way Chicago has been playing recently, they could easily double that margin.

With the Giants hosting the Braves, and Los Angeles meeting the Cincinnati Reds, the divisional lead in the Western division is changing hands every day. San Francisco is sitting on the top, but it's real thin ice as the Dodgers are only three percentage points back and the Braves are only one percentage point behind the Dodgers. Cincinnati is two games back in fourth place, while the Houston Astros are not out of the running as they trail the front-running Giants by only six games.

2. Should there be a three-way tie in a division, one team will draw a bye, and then play the winner of the October 3 game the following day.

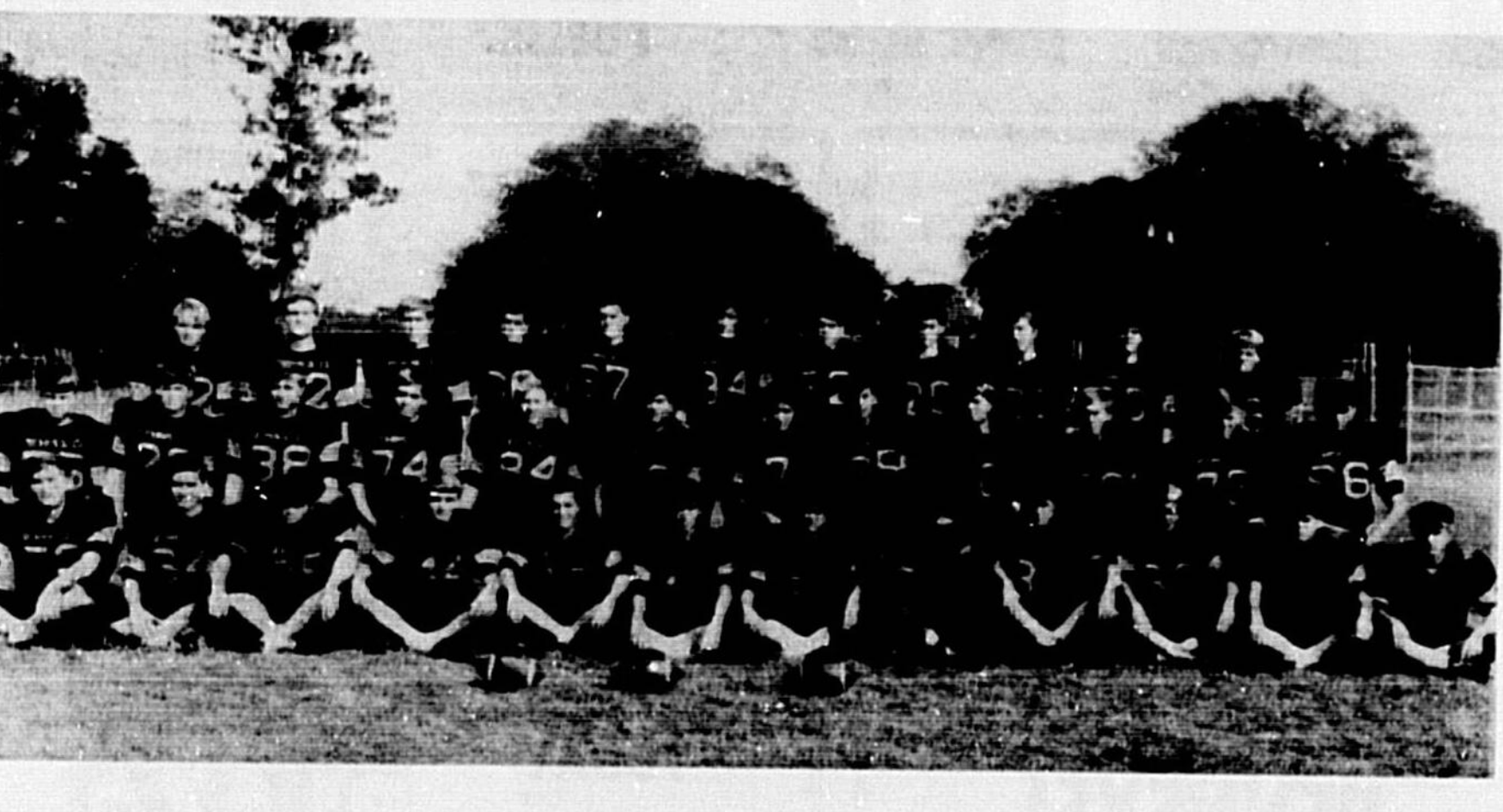
3. If there is a four-way tie in any division, two games will be played on October 3. The winners will meet the next day.
