

### Nehru Plans Visit To U. S. In July

WASHINGTON UN-Prime Minister Nehru of India plans to visit the United States in July for talks with President Eisenhower and other officials, the White House announced today.

An invitation was extended to Nehru by Secretary of State Dulles during their meeting in New Delhi earlier this month.

The White House announcement said the visit will be 'an informal one" and the talks "will cover matters of mutual interest between the two countries."

Nehru will arrive here July 6 or 7, coming directly from the commonwealth prime ministers conference in London.

## Marty Best Movie Magnani, Borgnine Get Acting Awards

HOLLYWOOD W-"Marly," the movie originally made as a tax loss to offset big grosses of two Burt Lancaster Westerns, em-erged today as the Oscar-winning

It also won the top male acting Academy Award last night for Ernest Borghine, an actor who only earned \$2,300 in his profession three years ago. He is worth at least \$150,000 a picture with an Oscar behind him.

Anna Magnani, the flery Italian, now in Rome, won the top fem-inine Oscar for her performance in "The Rose Tattoo."

Roused from sleep to be given the news, she shouted: "it's great . . . I feel just as if I'd built the Colosseum—it's all an earthquake

The supporting scior award went to Jack Lemmon, the comic Esn. Pulver of "Mister Roberts." Jo Van Fleet, the madam mother of James Dean in "East of Eden," was named the best supporting

Besides earning best picture and best actor awards, "Marty" also won an Oscar for the best acreen play for playwright Paddy Chayelsky. He wrote the tender story of a lonely butcher first as a tele-

Delbert Mann, who directed "Marty" on TV and then for his movie debut, won the best direction award.

"Marty" was produced by the team of Harold Hecht and screen star Burt Lancaster.

Lancaster gave much of the credit for "Marty's" success to newspaper advertising. He told a reporter that the film cost only \$343,000 to make but that half a million dollars was spent on an advertising campaign, much of it in newspapers seen by Academy






