

Crooms High Is Partially Burned



46 YEAR OLD SCHOOL IN FLAMES

Controversial "hot potato" Crooms High School in Sanford ignited into a roaring inferno early this morning when fire of an undetermined origin destroyed the administration building and four classrooms. It was the first major school fire in Sanford in 31 years, and according to Fire Chief G. M. Harriett, "Arson hasn't been ruled out."

Replace Or Convert Crooms Considered

With the fire damage, Crooms is insured for \$152,800 on that portion which was burned. This is enough funding to build only 7,640 square feet as replacement, according to estimates by Walter Teague, school finance officer.

Also worthy of consideration is the promised \$143,550 from millage money for air-conditioning the old facility, which now must have parts replaced before this can be completed.

Thus, it would be financially sound to utilize these moneys toward new room construction at Seminole High School to bring that facility up to 2,400 students, the maximum now for county high schools, Mrs. Bryant explained.

Report Is Denied On Fire Hydrants

But we turned them back on and on a few occasions stems were broken off inside by inexperienced firemen" and later repaired.

"But we have yet to find a National Standard hydrant that was not usable," he concluded.

Concern about the workability of fire hydrants came into focus after a building burned down in Orlando when firemen found the nearby fire hydrant dry.

The concern extended to Longwood where the City Council Wednesday night instructed Fire Chief Carl Lounnier to do a complete survey on all city hydrants and report results to the Council next week.

Lounnier told the board he has already begun the survey.

In order to attempt to have the answers to some of the questions which have been presented at other meetings dealing with the incorporation, the Chamber has invited several authorities to be present. Among those who will be present to speak are B. C. Gunkin, of Clark Dietz Associates, Engineers; Kenneth Dyer, Florida Power Corporation; Thomas G. Freeman, attorney; and Harold G. Hartsock, C.P.A.

Principal Edward Blackshire said portions of some records are on microfilm at the County School office but many are feared lost in the fire.

Disney To Sell 965 Acres

Walt Disney Productions today announced plans to sell apartment sites to private developers for construction of housing to meet the needs of Walt Disney World employees and other in Central Florida who may wish to live near the Vacation Kingdom.

Don B. Tatum, Chairman of the Board of Walt Disney Productions, said the move represents a major advancement in the company's land development policies in response to the request of thousands of employees and potential residents.

The new developments will be administered by the Madeira Land Co., a subsidiary of Walt Disney Productions under the supervision of the newly created Real Estate Department.

Robert P. Foster has been named to head the new department with offices at the Lake Buena Vista.

First sites offered for development will be in the City of Lake Buena Vista near the Motor Inn Plaza and the Buena Vista golf course which have already been developed by the Disney organization and its subsidiaries. The initial offering will involve about 65 acres on the east edge of the 27,000-acre Disney site.

With a few weeks an additional 900 acres north of U.S. 192 and west of Reedy Creek (in the southwest corner of the Disney property) will be offered for development under master plans now being finalized.

The early morning fire that partially destroyed Crooms High School, an all-Ninth Grade facility at Sanford, may have been the push needed to persuade the School Board to make room additions to the present Seminole High School to accommodate 800 Crooms students, thus leaving the delapidated building for a vocational school.

This move had been suggested on previous occasions by Jean Bryant, School Board member, but was never given serious consideration by the board due to a shortage of funds.

Now, with a school millage election coming on March 13, to raise funds for air-conditioning the older county schools, as well as build new facilities in South Seminole, and with the need to make repairs and renovations at Crooms, the opportunity may have arrived that the board will consider changes suggested earlier by Mrs. Bryant.

The board vice chairman commented, when consulted by The Herald today, on the question of replacing Crooms, that she had planned to bring up the matter of utilizing Crooms as a vocational school during the board's next session set for

State Fire Marshalls were to begin probing the smoking ashes and twisted wreckage of the 46-year-old Crooms High School administration building at Sanford today after it was destroyed in a pre-dawn fire.

Sanford Fire Chief G. M. Harriett said arson hasn't been ruled out at the school that recently has been a center of controversy because of its alleged poor condition.

"It's the first major school fire in Sanford in the 31 years I've been on the department," the chief said.

Harriett said the crew of a passing train reported the fire at 2:13 a. m. and within minutes

when the first two engine companies arrived the blaze had eaten through the auditorium roof and was licking the interior of the offices.

Firemen used bolt cutters to gain entry to the fenced and locked campus.

Firemen said they were hampered by lack of water pressure after running long hoses from three hydrants within a block radius of the sprawling school complex.

Police notified the operator at the city's main water plant and pressure to the eastern section of Sanford was cut to allow greater fire flow to the Goldsboro fire.

Hugh Carlton, director of Auxiliary Service for the

District School Board, said the fire destroyed four classrooms, offices, the auditorium and school records room.

At 8 a. m. firemen were still pouring water on the school and housing remaining pockets of flame feeding on the rich beams and wooden floors in the 1926 building.

"I'm afraid the records have sustained considerable fire and water damage," Carlton said. "We haven't been able to get into the room yet."

He said some of the valuable records were stored in fire retardant filing cabinets.

Individual records follow students each year. Over 800 ninth graders are enrolled at Crooms this year. Also stored in

3 POW Releases Officially Denied

SAIGON (AP)—The U.S. Command and other official sources denied a report today that three American prisoners of the Viet Cong had been released and flown back to Saigon aboard a U.S. helicopter.

Command spokesmen said they checked with every available source within the system set up for prisoner recovery under the Paris peace agreement and found nothing to substantiate the report.

The report was based on an account given by a U.S. Army officer who claimed to have been on the recovery mission. He gave a detailed account, saying the prisoners were "fantastically happy" and "jumped all over" their rescuers.

He added that three prisoners had been given candy and cigarettes by the Viet Cong before they were released and were flown back to the Saigon Army hospital that will be the receiving point for American prisoners released and returned to U.S. control in the Saigon region.

The U.S. Command at first had no comment on the report when queried by The Associated Press. But there have often been delays of an hour or more in official disclosures of past prisoner releases.

The command and other official sources, including the hospital's executive officer, said later they had no information to substantiate the reported POW release.

Viet Cong General Flown To Four-Party Meeting

SAIGON (AP) — U.S. helicopters flew to a jungle rendezvous today, picked up the Viet Cong general who directed the 1968 Tet offensive against Saigon and flew him back to join a peacekeeping commission.
Five years almost to the day since the start of the 1968 attack on Saigon, the U.S. helicopter crews brought Lt. Gen. Tran Van Tra and 28 other Viet Cong men to Tan Son Nhut Air Base. Tra is the 53-year-old deputy military commander of the elusive COSVN, the Communist Central Office for South Vietnam. As chief Viet Cong member of the four-party joint military commission, he likely holds the key to the release of American prisoners of war held in South Vietnam.
Seven U.S. helicopters marked with white stripes picked up Tra and his men at Loc Ninh, a rubber plantation town 75 miles north of Saigon which Tra's forces captured last year.
They were taken to Camp Davis, a former U.S. Signal Corps installation at Tan Son Nhut, where the other Communist cease-fire delegates are housed.

Senator's Condition Is Serious

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. John C. Stennis, shot twice in a holdup, remained in very serious condition today, but a hospital spokesman said the 71-year-old chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee was helped by his general good health.

Police and FBI agents, meanwhile, checked police files and visited several high schools in an effort to learn the identity of two teen-agers who are believed responsible for shooting Stennis outside his northwest Washington home Tuesday night.

The spokesman at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Maj. Gen. Frank Garland, said Stennis' condition was "still very serious and the prognosis is guarded."

But he said the Mississippi Democrat was "doing well in view of his extensive wounds and the subsequent surgery." Garland said Stennis had been in excellent health, which children may swallow some of the toothpaste.

Richardson Mulls Secrecy Of Laos

WASHINGTON (AP) — On his first day as secretary of defense, Elliot L. Richardson mullied what many Americans have been asking for years: Why the secrecy surrounding the U.S. air war in Laos?
"I hope to have an answer pretty soon," said Richardson.

The issue was raised Wednesday during Richardson's first news conference, and the secretary replied he had asked that question himself after taking office the previous day.

The new Pentagon chief didn't say to whom his question was directed, but it seemed obvious he was referring to the White House and, more specifically, to the office of presidential adviser Henry Kissinger.

Despite the Vietnam ceasefire, U.S. planes have hit Communist positions in Laos for four consecutive days. All the Pentagon will say is that American aircraft are continuing operations "at the request of the royal Laotian government."
Although Richardson himself indicated he has strong doubts about the long-standing U.S. policy of carrying on bombing of Laos behind a partial cloak of secrecy, it appears unlikely he will be able to remove the wraps without White House consent.
The indication has been that touchy diplomatic considerations involving the Laotian government—which once considered itself neutralist—are responsible for the refusal to talk about U.S. operations there in any detail.
On another matter restricting newsmen, the Pentagon has clamped tight security around the expected return of more than 500 prisoners of war from Southeast Asia.
Despite a Richardson memorandum Wednesday affirming the principle of free flow of information, "to assure that the American people are fully informed about matters of national defense," newsmen are to be barred from interviewing the POWs immediately on their return.
Pentagon spokesmen say their first concern is for the welfare of the men—to speed them through medical checks at Clark Field in the Philippines and return them to their families without delay.
Another reason for secrecy is concern for prisoners still awaiting release by Hanoi. Any bitter or hostile statements by the first men freed could jeopardize the release of others.

Report Challenged Toothpaste Lead Danger

CHICAGO (AP) — The American Dental Association has challenged a report published in its own journal.
A group of Philadelphia researchers report in the February issue of the Journal of the American Dental Association that some children may be getting dangerous amounts of lead from toothpaste tubes.
"Squeezing an almost-empty tube dry can liberate toothpaste in which there is an accumulation of lead," they wrote of their study a year ago of six advertised brands.
They refused to identify the brands tested other than to say they were six leading brands. They said the names of the brands had been sent to the dental association for investigation.
"Unfortunately, the article does not identify the products tested nor whether they represent current production or whether they represent brands which have a major share of the market," the dental association said Wednesday in a statement issued in response to a newsman's inquiry.
"It is therefore, impossible to evaluate the extent of the problem, if one exists."
The association's statement continued:
"As far as the association has been able to determine, all the major brands of toothpaste, which represent approximately 90 per cent of the products sold today, are presently packaged in either plastic, aluminum or aluminum-plastic laminated tubes."
An association spokesman said decisions about what is published in the journal are made independently by the editor.
"If he found lead in our toothpaste, he must have gotten an old tube because we've been in aluminum containers for the last 15 years," a spokesman for Pepsodent commented.
"We went to plastic tubes last summer," said a spokesman for Crest. "Our market research people told us at the time that we were the last to switch."
They said adults "remove most of the toothpaste from the oral cavity by rinsing" but that children may swallow some of the toothpaste.

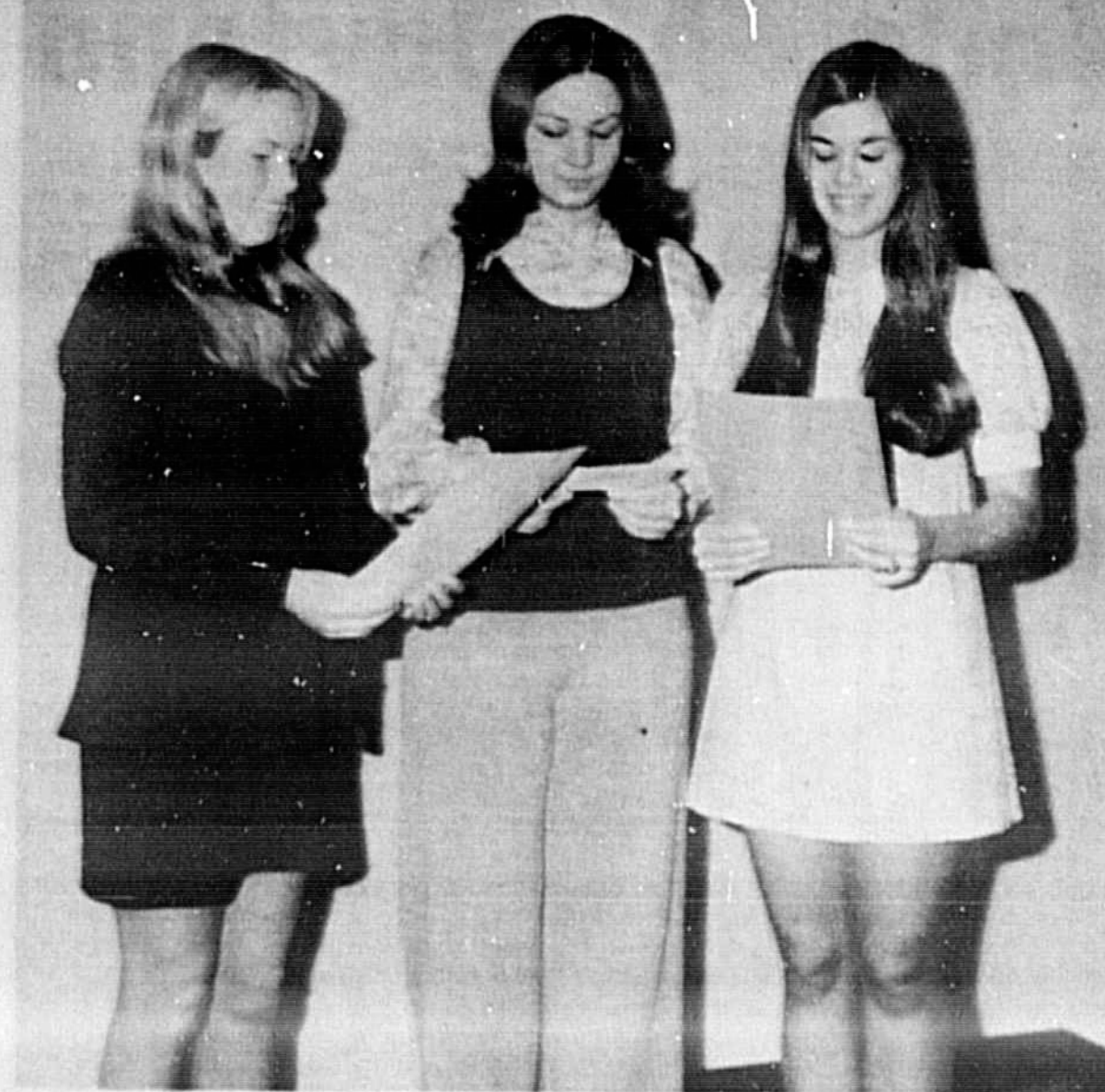

WORLD OF WORK Retirement Age Is Not a Federal Affair

By SECRETARY OF LABOR JAMES D. HODGSON
E. R. of Scranton, Pa., inquires: Why doesn't the government reduce the age for retirement? Wouldn't this give jobs to younger people?
Dear E. R.: You may be interested to know that 87 per cent of the workers covered by private pension plans in the United States belong to plans that contain early retirement provisions. Some plans provide full retirement benefits for employees who reach the age of 55 with 30 years of service. There is no federal law which mandates a retirement age in the private sector. Because conditions vary from company to company, it is important to determine a degree of flexibility in pension plan retirement age. Furthermore, in our industrial democracy, determination of retirement age is largely regarded as a private contract matter to be decided between the employer and his employees or their collective bargaining organization. Many older persons continue working out of sheer economic necessity. A mandatory national retirement age would work a severe financial hardship on many persons.

C. B. of San Diego, Calif., asks: Does the branch of service make any difference in connection with Veterans' Reemployment Rights?
Dear C. B.: It makes none whatsoever. Job protection extends alike to members of all branches of services and to all kinds of military training.

L. O. of Memphis, Tenn., writes: I was told that many of the workplace standards issued under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 were "National Consensus Standards." What does this mean?
Dear L. O.: These are standards issued by nationally recognized standards-producing organizations such as the American National Standards Institute and the National Fire Protection Association. They are developed through extensive discussions with the business affected, which must reach substantial agreement before adoption.
