





It is equally logical to expect that this phase will mass and be properly taken care of. But what is not to be overlooked at this time is the urgency of creating some way to relieve the pressure which traffic is making and will do so in even greater degree in the years ahead as east-west traffic is bottlenightmarish confusion which surrounds Orlando.

We believe that the proper attack on this problem is not in trying to handle the flood after it reaches our neighboring city but to create a new channel which would take people coming from the north and wanting to go south on an east-west I-95 on the east and I-75 on the west.

This highway is S-46 with a western extension. Those who, like Commissioner Drummond talk about the comparitively low traffic count on the existing S-46 ignore the dangerous state of construction which exists on that road.

Of course trucks and passenger cars will avoid the inbuilt hazards which make this road a gamble apart time it is need Vat it in in mistanan You it does have the rights-of-way and these can be extended if action is taken soon.

Improvement of this road bettween I-4 and west to Wekiva River is in the works. But this is a very small step in the right direction and does do little more than reduce the hazard for those who have small need for longer east-west routes.

We sugest that everyone who is ready to think in terms of the traffic needs, not only of Sanford and Seminole County, spread out a state highway map. Look carefully, and this is needed as S-46 gets little

attention now in its present ability to handle traffic and outline its course from Mims on the east to Mt. Dora on the west.
