



From there it was 13 months behind the barbed wire of a prisoner of war camp before U.S. troops liberated him. Then he was flown to France, whence he hiked an air trip to Britain, where he will visit his wife in Scotland. Lieut, Bunte had three enemy planes to his credit when he went down.
