WASHINGTON (AP)—Administration forces mounted a final assault on the Cooper-Church amendment today as the Senate wound up its eight-week debate on Cambodia.

Dole said Cooper-Church had been made more palatable by several amendments approved since debate began shortly after President Nixon announced April 30 that U.S. troops were being sent into Cambodia.

Republicans also succeeded in forcing the President to block passage of Cooper-Church's message at American troops from Cambodia Monday, one day before his promised deadline.
