



"That these private and church state, "our nation has been bless- related schools serve a minority in rently receiving their education. These schools, emphatically, are a integral part of the American educational system."

Defining more precisely the place of thhe private school in the educational picture, the bishops continue:

"They have, we repeat, full right to be considered and dealt with as components of the American educational system. They protest against the kind of thinking that would reduce them to a secondary level, and against unfair and discriminatory treatment which would, in effect, write them off as less wholly dedicated to the public welfare than the state-supported schools. The students of these schools have the right to benefit from those measures, grants, or aids, which are manifestly designed for the health, safety and welfare of American youth, irrespective of thhe school attended."

The bishops note with approval the stepped-up development of the private school movement as an "impressive example of the American spirit at work," They cite the private school as "a conerete demonstration of the fact that education is not a monopoly of public authority," and as providing "a saving and challenging variety in the total system, beneficial to the whole and manifestly fruitful in its effects."

The bishops make the point private schools exist by right and not by sufferance. Parents have the final say on the education of their children, they state, and in this connection they cite the Supreme Court decision in the Oregon School Case of 1925. The hishops recognize, however, that the state has the right "to decree a minimal education for its citizens, as a vital necessity in a

modern democratic society . . ." Tracing the historical growth of the private school movement in the United States, the bishops find these schools were first in the field of education. "For well-nigh two centuries, during our Colonial and early national periods, they occupied that field alone, It was from such schools, as from fruitful seed-beds, that there came the guiding intellectual and moral impulses which led to the definition and establishment of American freedom, no less than the leadership which launched the young Republic on her career in history.

Turning specifically to Catholie education, the bishops declare it is "no foreign importation, no alien growth, but a sturdy native plant, a conspicious example of a com-mon religious impulse working under the favorable condition: of our Republic." The bishops point "with honest pride" to the Catholie school system and praise the "magnificent generosity" of those Catholics who have made it poss-ible. They describe it as "perhaps the greatest achievement in genral ducation under religious auspices and without government support the world has ever know." In answer to those critics who find church-schools a divisive influence in national affairs, the bishops state:

"But surely, religion itself is not a discordant factor in American life. Surely, Christianity, with its primary inculcation of love of God and love of neighbor is not divisive . . Rather, is it not oblous that positive Christian training, with ite emphasis on thhe sane\_ tions of divine law, of the natural law, and of civil law, on the social nature of the virtues of justice and charity, on the moral obligations of patriotism and public service, provides the strongest cement that can possibly bind a nation together. Criticism of these schools at times seems to forget that we are a pluralistic society that postulates not uniformity but rather unity in variety."



## Meaning Of Thanksgiving Can Be Explained In Many Ways

plained many ways. We are thankful of all that is good about us, and for the memory | degree that we seek ever to do the will of of our forbears who left the spirit of Thanksgiving Imbedded in the hearts and souls of mankind here in our broad land of the free. Thankful for a democracy, a government so endowed by our Constitution that the people who live under it can breathe, and speak, and write as true Amer-

However, the truer meaning of Thanksgiving is involved in the words of our religious leaders who give us the deeper explanations that speak of the words many of us overlook as we celebrate another national observance.

Rev. W. P. Brooks Jr., of the First Bapthat Church in Sanford explains Thanksgiving this way:

"In the attitude of real thanksgiving at least three things are involved; our intelloct-our emotions, and our will. Surely our intellect is involved. In the 103 Psalm we are exhorted, "Not to forget all of His benefits". Martin Luther is commenting upon that verse says that while we cannot remember them all-we are asked not to forget them all. We are told that the word think and the word thank come from the same root work—to be thankful is but to be thinkful. Also our emotions are involvedwe are atirred in our hearts as we consider God's goodness and mercy to us "Bless the Lord O my soul and all that is within me bless Mis holy name"-that is the attitude of our deep emotions. 




