Peru Offers Truce Plan To End Deadlock

Proposal Attempted To Circumvent Refusal Of Reds To Accept Compromise

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. — Peru called on the United Nations General Assembly today to consider creation of a commission aimed at breaking the deadlock in the Korean truce talks. The proposed commission would supervise the screening and return to their homes of prisoners. It was an obvious attempt to circumvent the Communist refusal to accept the results of screening by the unified command which has shown thousands of Reds unwilling to go home.
