### Simmons: Issuing Sanford's report card

SANFORD - When it comes to painting a bright future for the city of Sanford, City Manager Bill Simmons has perhaps the brightest colors and best brush. When asked about the city's progress, he dove into a response with no hesitation.

"One of the biggest advances we've seen in recent times," he said, "is the continuing growth and development at the Or-lando-Sanford Airport." He said the growth is providing more jobs, an economic boost and a brighter future for the entire city.

\*Regarding the past developments," he continued, "the biggest spike in growth was the opening of the Seminole Towne Center Mall. Now we see additional growth in that area. I see where there is a new super center being planned for the Upsala Road area, and there is a new Landry's Sea Food company com-

ing into the city."
We are seeing what I consider an 'orderly develop-ment," Simmons commented. "And this is better for the city. much better than uncontrolled growth or only minor growth."

He was very pleased with the road and highway project being undertaken in Joint agreements with Seminole County and the city, "Our road infrastructure is going to be excellent," he said. Through the joint work, we will probably come closest to having an adequate road system we've ever had. We are going to have a highway/road system in place at or before the time when it is actually needed. It will be a unique situation and probably become the envy of the state."

He also said the utility program being undertaken by the city will be directly connected to the road and highway program in that new roadways will afford the opportunity to

upgrade the utility lines.

Regarding stormwater drainage he said, "In the past we have often had to bite the bullet, but now we have established a Stormwater Utility Fund which gives us money to deal with our problems and needs. For example, we have a \$2 million downtown interceptor program coming up." The program will prevent downtown stores and shops from any stormwater flooding. There will be new piping which will go to the east for stormwater discharge," he said, "rather than going into the sanitary sewer systems."

Another area where stormwater runoff has become a problem is along Willow Avemie between Fourth and Fifth Streets." We have a \$150,000 project for that," he said, "to

correct flooding in that area."

Simmons is also positive

about the lakefront development. "It's time we brought the downtown development into the city's progress. Anything that helps the lakefront will also be beneficial to the downtown area, including plans to develop Fort Mellon Park," he continued.

Simmons said the Recreation and Park Department has prepared plans to be presented, which would relocate the two ball fields in Fort Melion Park to a location at Chase Park where there would be four ball fields for juvenile sports events. This would certainly be more efficient," he added.

\*One Item which I see as progress is a rather controverstal matter," Simmons contin-ued. That's the adult entertainment issue. There has to be adequate adult entertainment space, so sayeth the

State Supreme Court," he said. The city has an adult entertainment resolution and the county has one as well. We have working on combining them into a total amount of space. If adult entertainment establishments don't have enough space they will proba-

bly go to court over it." He said by combining the available space, it puts both the city and county into a position where it would be more difficult for the adult entertainment people to take the matter to court for approval. With the two jurisdictions pooling sites, we stand a bet-ter chance of being taken to court over this," he said.

Simmons, who has announced he would be leaving his city post later this year, said he is very proud of the accomplishments and progress made by the city since he first



SANFORD \_ The Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission (GFC) has a deal for anglers who buy a 5-year freshwater fishing license during April and May.

With the purchase of a 5-year freshwater license, anglers will receive a bonus package with product samples and magazines with in excess of \$50. In addition, the package will include special deals and rebate offers worth hundreds of dollars more. In effect, you get five years' worth of freshwater fishing, virtu-

\*Major national manufacturers and local companies combined to provide this offer for the first time anywhere last year," said Bob Wattendorf, of the GFC's Division of Fisher-

The result was a six-fold increase in fiveyear freshwater fishing license sales during those two months. That is extremely important to the GFC because it allows the agency to invest the money for fish and wildlife conservation programs. At the same time manufacturers, publishers and other participants got to put their products in the hands of dedicated anglers who are likely to spend thousands of dollars on their sport during the next five years.

This year, the sample value is nearly doubled. Lure manufacturers such as Cotee, Culprit, Phantom, Rapala, Reaction, RJ Tackle and Storm are providing samples. Popular magazines like Bass Destinations, "Florida Fishing and Boating," and "Florida Wildlife" will be included. 

### Storm volunteer credits all who helped in hours of need

LAKE MARY - Lake Mary restdent, Cindy Von Herbulis worked tirelessly during the time of the devastating tornado. Her volunteer efforts reached many yet stemmed only from a few earing souls trying to help those in need.

Previously, Von Herbulis assisted Christian HELP and its thrift store. "I would go to yard sales and see what they were going to do with items after the sale was over," she said. "I would go back and pick up the items and take them to the thrift store for them to sell. It would help the organization."

Although Von Herbulis presently cares for an elderly neighbor now living in her home she still takes time for others. She also has two young sons, Daniel and Austin.

"Monday morning after the tornado happened I was talking to a friend and we were discussing what we could do to help," she shared. "We figured we could make sandwiches. We called the Red Cross and they said they needed money. We knew we didn't have extra money to give. For the next two hours I was on the phone with Seminole County Sheriff, 8 Office, Seminole County and the Salvation Army. The Sheriff's Office gave me the number of the Command Center."

By the time that Von Herbults finally reached Mr. Barnett, she and others had collected towels, clothes and shoes. "I figured the people would be wet and cold by then," she said. "I knew we needed to be close to the people so they could get things easily. We asked if we could just sit by the van in case anyone came up and needed something."

Initially, Von Herbulis, her sister-in-law, Lort Von Herbults and Debbie Redman sat by the Command Post where the police were located. On the first day, shoes, socks and blankets were

"By the time we left that first day my van was full," she said. "A lady came by and brought three car loads of stuff. Many people dropped off food. Wal-Mart donated things too."

Eventually the group moved across the street from the Command Center and as Von Herbulis put it "it just grew and grew and grew." Items came in by the droves.

"The Salvation Army wanted to take the things to their building but we wanted things to stay there so they would be close to the people," she said. "I knew we needed to be close to the people. We wanted to keep things where they were. We were there for five days. It started out that we were the only people there that first Monday and others came later. We came back to check on the people on Saturday and Sunday. The things were moved to the churches on the following Monday,"

She added that her husband of six years, Bernie, had grown up in Sanford and there was a special place in her heart because of this bond. Her inlaws have also been in Sanford for many years.

"When I drove down into the tornado area with someone I saw so much," she said. "I saw some people that couldn't get out. I felt so much for the people. I just knew that they needed help. I knew I needed to be there. My kids were with me too. I think it was a good experience for them."

She closed by saying," I really want to thank all the people that donated items and food. I want to thank Wal-Mart too. So many people would go out and buy what the people needed. The outpouring of support from the people was great."

### All you need to know about vegetable gardens

Vegetable gardens range in size from plant containers (mini-gardens) all the way to fields of an acre or more (maxigardens). What makes them all gardens rather than farms is that the produce is consumed by the grower, or his family and friends, rather than being marketed. Minigardening is practical for those who do not have sufficient yard space for a larger series. Even persons living in apartments and condominiums can grow at least a few yegetables by planting a minigarden. Areas suitable are along fences and in fence corners, in and around flower beds, adjacent to walks and drives, near the foundation of the house, on Dauge, porches and Dalcomes and even on roof-tops. Containers: Minigardening involves growing plants in containers which contain soil or any one of a variety of soil substitutes. A wide assortment of containers might be used, ranging from hanging baskets and flower pots to tubs, and refuse cans. Most any container is suitable as long as it is sufficiently durable and large enough to hold the fully-grown plant or plants. In this respect, gardeners are limited only by their imagination.

Raised beds: Many entire gardens are successfully grown throughout Florida on raised, constructed beds. When you plan the size of the beds, it is a good practice to keep their area in a simple figure number of aquare feet. In a small garden, a bed that is 2 x 5 feet (10 square feet) makes garden calculations simple. To improve drainage and garden neatness, beds can be raised with brick, rot-resist-Many gardeners shovel soil from around the raised bed. This extra soil combined with liberal amounts of organic amendments creates the raised bed. Soil depth should be six inches minimum, and twelve inches if possible.

Containers: Metal containers should be painted on the inside with asphalt paint, and clear glass containers on the outside with dark paint. Be sure to punch holes at interval 1" above bottom of container to allow for drainage of excess moisture. Baskets could be lined with plastic to permit drainage. Fill

container with growth medium. Use a good garden soil, a prepared mixture, or a soil substitute such as sawdust or wood

Soli media: A first time minigardener probably should start with a commercial mix which is already mixed in the proper proportions of ingredients. Some of the many combinations of aggregate materials which have been tried successfully with tomatoes are as follows: sand;"1" part sand to 1 part perlite or vermiculite; I part sand to I part rice hulls; I part sand to I part redwood bark; I part sand to 1 part pine bark; and 1 or 2 parts sand to 1 part peat moss. In general, the more porous rrowth media, such as sand and gravel, most closely approximate hydroponic culture. These tend to dry out fast and do not hold nutrients very long.

the containers once or twice a day. During especially hot, dry weather, the aggregate may need more than two drenchings daily, sometimes as many as five. Soil substitute mixes which contain ample organic materials, and which have fertilizer included in the mixing process. also will need additional fertilizer from time to time, but at much less frequent intervals than with porous sand or gravel culture. Once every week or two may be sufficient. Either drench with soluble fertilizer or apply dry common garden fertilizer to the soil surface and water thoroughly into the root zone. Don't apply too much or fertilizer burn will result. Usually, I level teaspoon of dry fertilizer per square foot of soil surface is adequate at each feeding. Where ready-mixed soluble fertilizers are purchased, follow label directions for application. A suggested solution is made with one ounce of 20-20-20 analysis water-soluble fertilizer in 5 to 6 gallons of water. For tomatoes, substitute calcium nitrate for the complete fertilizer every 2 weeks. Mix at the rate of one ounce per 3 gallons of water to insure adequate calcium and to prevent blossom-end rot. 

Alcohol linked to breast cancer

DEAR DR. GOTT: Is there any way that I can modify my daily habits to avoid breast cancer?

DEAR READER: A recent report in the Journal of the American Medical Association (Feb. 18, 1998) reached a surprising conclusion: Women who consumed significant amounts of alcohol had a much higher incidence of breast cancer. The study, which involved more than 300,000 women, showed that the consumption of two to four shots of liquor, 2.5 to 4.5 bottles of beer or three to five glasses of wine a day led to a 30 to 40 percent higher risk of breast cancer than that in non-

Although researchers were puzzled by this phenomenon, they hypothesized that the alcohol interfered with the metabolism of estrogen, with resulting higher blood levels of the hormone. These higher levels overstimulated breast tissue, leading to

While infrequent and moderate alcohol consumption does not appear to affect health, regular and significant drinking does. Therefore, based on this study, you might choose to avoid alcohol or keep its consumption

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have an elderly friend who was recently diagnosed with intestinal angina. What is this?

DEAR READER: When muscles are deprived of oxygen due to poor circulation caused by arteriosclerosis, they cramp. When the coronary arteries are affected and pain results, physicians diagnose angina pectoris. But the same muscle cramping can also occur in the intestinal lining, when the arteries supplying the bowel are blocked by arteriosclerotic plaque. Called "intestinal angina," the condition is marked by periodic abdominal spakms, usually occurring after a meal. Patients may also experience nausea, vomiting, distension and altered bowel habits. In severe cases, the angina may progress to bowel damage or even gangrene, for which emergency surgery may be necessary. The diagnosis is made by X-ray

Treatment is primarily surgical. If appropriate X-rays tof the bowel circulation) show potentially dangerous obstructions, bypass grafting has to be considered.



DEAR DR. GOTT. I read with interest your column on stones in the salivary glands. I agree that it is prudent to drink plenty of fluids (especially lemonade) during meals. In addition, I've discovered a useful maneuver that often relieves the pain of salivary stones. When I feel the area around my cheeks become very sensitive, I

firmly massage the gland around the stones and have found that I can significantly reduce the pain and

DEAR READER: Stones in the salivary glands can cause dry mouth, pain and swelling. Generous intake of fluids will help overcome this. So will lemon juice, which causes an increase in the flow of saliva. When the stones block the salivary ducts, the pain and swelling may be severe. In such instances, the early application of gentle massage may alter the position of the stones, allow drainage and soothe inflamed tissue. Therefore, there is ample theoretical and practical justification for your maneuver. Thank you for writing.
