### Mission: Public's good health

SEMINOLE COUNTY - The Seminole County Health Department has a mission. That mission is to promote and protect the health and safety of the people in the community. The success of their mission depends on the public having access to the wealth of knowledge and services provided through the Health Department.

National Public Health Week, April 6 through April 12, recognizes the efforts of public health departments throughout the nation working to improve the health of the general public. Activities during this week are designed to increase the community's awareness of services available to everyone through the Health Department. "The population based services we offer are very broad," said Dr. Jane Polkowski, director of the Seminole County Health Department. "But we

## County's employment rate leads the district

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Seminole County led the job force in District 5 during the month of February with the highest percentage employed in the district's labor force. According to the Department of Labor's preliminary statistical release, Flagler County led the district a year ago to date.

Orange County lags behind with a 3.0 rate, followed by Lake and Flagler at 3.1, Osceola at 3.2, Volusia and Sumter at 3.4, Brevard at 3.9, and Marion 4.2.

## Should Sassy Merlot's have a license to thrill?

SEMINOLE COUNTY - If you just look at the bar facts, a nude dancing club known as Sassy Merlot's is getting more and more under the county's skin.

The club remains open despite Seminole County's costly efforts to close it down for operating unlawfully.

On Monday, the county took another jolt in court.

Not only did Circuit Judge Alan A. Dickey allow Sassy Merlot's to keep on dancing, he told the county it must treat the Fern Park "no differently" than any other licensed club.

Sassy Merlot's didn't receive a building permit from the county or get to put up a temporary trailer sign, and Dickey told the county from

now on it would not deny such requests without justification.

In other words, Sassy Merlot's is legal until proven otherwise.

By now most people know the story. The county wanted to sweep clean U.S. Highway 17-92. No more massage parlors and sleazy joints. No new nude bars.

As it worked on a tougher adult entertainment ordinance, the county passed a moratorium of "reasonable length" to prohibit any new clubs from opening.

Two opened, anyhow - Sassy Merlot's and VIP Gold.

The county hired an Orlando law firm, Shotts & Bowen, to defend it in court.

The county filed injunctions against Sassy Merlot's and VIP Gold.

The county won one case, lost the other. VIP... Please See Adult, Page 3A


According to chamber officials, "Our goal is to facilitate better communication and gain a clearer understanding, by providing a forum for business people, residents and govern-

# Simmons: Issuing Sanford's report card

SANFORD - When it comes to painting a bright future for the city of Sanford, City Manager Bill Simmons has perhaps the brightest colors and best brush. When asked about the city's progress, he dove into a response with no hesitation.


"One of the biggest advances we've seen in recent times," he said, "is the continuing growth and development at the Orlando-Sanford Airport." He said the growth is providing more jobs, an economic boost and a brighter future for the entire city.

"Regarding the past developments," he continued, "the biggest spike in growth was the opening of the Seminole Towne Center Mall. Now we see additional growth in that area. I see where there is a new super center being planned for the Upsala Road area, and there is a new Landry's Sea Food company coming into the city."

"We are seeing what I consider an 'orderly development.'" Simmons commented. "And this is better for the city, much better than uncontrolled growth or only minor growth."

He was very pleased with the road and highway project being undertaken in joint agreements with Seminole County and the city. "Our road infrastructure is going to be excellent," he said. "Through the joint work, we will probably come closest to having an adequate road system we've ever had. We are going to have a highway/road system in place at or before the time when it is actually needed. It will be a unique situation and probably become the envy of the state."

He also said the utility program being undertaken by the city will be directly connected to the road and highway program in that new roadways will afford the opportunity to

upgrade the utility lines.

Regarding stormwater drainage he said, "In the past we have often had to bite the bullet, but now we have established a Stormwater Utility Fund which gives us money to deal with our problems and needs. For example, we have a \$2 million downtown interceptor program coming up." The program will prevent downtown stores and shops from any stormwater flooding. "There will be new piping which will go to the east for stormwater discharge," he said, "rather than going into the sanitary sewer systems."

Another area where stormwater runoff has become a problem is along Willow Avenue between Fourth and Fifth Streets. "We have a \$150,000 project for that," he said, "to correct flooding in that area." Simmons is also positive

about the lakefront development. "It's time we brought the downtown development into the city's progress. Anything that helps the lakefront will also be beneficial to the downtown area, including plans to develop Fort Mellon Park," he continued.

Simmons said the Recreation and Park Department has prepared plans to be presented, which would relocate the two ball fields in Fort Mellon Park to a location at Chase Park where there would be four ball fields for juvenile sports events. "This would certainly be more efficient," he added.

"One item which I see as progress is a rather controversial matter," Simmons continued. "That's the adult entertainment issue. There has to be adequate adult entertainment space, so sayeth the

State Supreme Court," he said. "The city has an adult entertainment resolution and the county has one as well. We have working on combining them into a total amount of space. If adult entertainment establishments don't have enough space they will probably go to court over it."

He said by combining the available space, it puts both the city and county into a position where it would be more difficult for the adult entertainment people to take the matter to court for approval. "With the two jurisdictions pooling sites, we stand a better chance of being taken to court over this," he said.

Simmons, who has announced he would be leaving his city post later this year, said he is very proud of the accomplishments and progress made by the city since he first took office.

rates of the two previous quarters.

Central Florida is in the nation's Top 10 list for economic growth. According to Nation's Bank Chief Economist, Lynn Reaser, "Florida will probably be one of the strong states in the nation and will lead the Southeast in 1998."

Ms. Reaser pointed out that sustained growth which was propelled in part by Disney's operations, has created new challenges for businesses in the area. Her concern is that there might be a shortage of available workers since the supply scale is so great.

Another sector keeping its eyes on Central Florida's growth is the Metro Orlando Economic Development Commission for Central Florida. According to the Director of Economic Development for Seminole County, Tracy Grygiel, job growth and expan-

Gold closed, Sassy Merlot's danced on. Judge Leonard Wood ruled in favor of the county and Judge Dickey against in identical cases. Dickey suggested the county work on its ordinance.

Almost a year later, the two cases continue. VIP Gold's case is waiting for a look by the 5th District Court of Appeals in Daytona Beach. Sassy Merlot's is still bouncing around in Circuit Court, the original ruling by Judge Dickey never being appealed.

"Why didn't you appeal," Dickey asked attorney Andy Brumby on Monday. Brumby said the county chose a different strategy.

The decision by the 5th District Court of Appeals could clear up most of the confusion. Attorney Hugh Trees warns not to place too much emphasis on this call. The 5th District Court of

Appeals is reviewing Judge Wood's decision that was made before the county finalized its adult code. By this time there were numerous revisions, zoning, land use and site ordinances.

"It's not as simplified as the county is suggesting," Trees said. County Commission Chairman Randy Morris warned a year ago that it would be a lengthy process but that the county would succeed in its mission to regulate adult entertainment and sexually-oriented businesses.

"While some people are not fond of adult entertainment clubs, they are protected by the Constitution," said Sassy's Merlot's owner Doug Bangle. "I have not broken any laws." On Monday, the court agreed.

be held Thursday, April 9 beginning at 3:30 p.m. and ending at 4 p.m. with refreshments.

Unhealthy behaviors and environmental conditions contribute the most to premature death, resulting in approximately 70 percent of all deaths before age 75 in the United States according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

It is one of the responsibilities of the Health Department to assess and monitor the health and safety needs of the

community helping to ensure a pollution free environment. This is done through data collection and analysis, problem investigation, and development and monitoring of safety programs.

Fifty percent of the factors contributing to premature death are within the individual's control according to Polkowiak. These factors include behavior choices such as drug and alcohol use, diet and exercise, and sexual activity.

The Health Department works to assure the health and safety of the community by providing health education, intervention and prevention pro-

grams, and emergency response and recovery efforts. Central Florida's high rate of tourism brings in large numbers of people from other countries and with them increased exposure to diseases. Polkowiak stresses the importance of immunization, and confidential screening and testing programs provided by the Health Department.

"It is our goal to ensure good health outcomes for the entire community," said Polkowiak. For more information concerning programs provided by the Seminole County Public Health Department call (407) 322-2724.

## GFC has deal for freshwater license buyers

**SANFORD** - The Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission (GFC) has a deal for anglers who buy a 5-year freshwater fishing license during April and May.

With the purchase of a 5-year freshwater license, anglers will receive a bonus package with product samples and magazines with an excess of \$50. In addition, the package will include special deals and rebate offers worth hundreds of dollars more. In effect, you get five years' worth of freshwater fishing, virtually free.

"Major national manufacturers and local companies combined to provide this offer for the first time anywhere last year," said Bob Wattendorf, of the GFC's Division of Fisheries.

The result was a six-fold increase in five-year freshwater fishing license sales during those two months. That is extremely important to the GFC because it allows the agency to invest the money for fish and wildlife conservation programs. At the same time manufacturers, publishers and other participants got to put their products in the hands of dedicated anglers who are likely to spend thousands of dollars on their sport during the next five years.

This year, the sample value is nearly doubled. Lure manufacturers such as Cotee, Culprit, Phantom, Rapala, Reaction, RJ Tackle and Storm are providing samples. Popular magazines like "Bass Destinations," "Florida Fishing and Boating," and "Florida Wildlife" will be included. Coupons will let you get a free copy of "Florida Sportsman" along with a free pass to one of its boat shows, and a free copy of "Outdoor World," discount coupons for BassPro Shops and a free fishing lure and special discount offer from Luhr-Jensen.

Other offers include discounted memberships in "Fishing Made Cheap," (a wholesale club) and in the International Game Fish Association, both of which provide free lures and incentives to join.

Sierra Games will include a demo CD for their most popular fishing games, Champion, Ranger and Tracker boats are each including special offers, as are Humminbird and Apelo (Raytheon) electronics. Ocean Waves sunglasses, Larson Outdoor Press, Quantum Reels, Motor Guide and other special deals complete the package.

To receive the bonus package all you need to do is buy a license that includes at least five years of freshwater fishing privileges (lifetime licenses and five-year combination licenses that include freshwater fishing privileges are eligible) through the instant license number at 1-888-FISH-FLORIDA (347-4356) or through the county tax collector. The cost of the license is \$61.50 plus \$3.95 surcharge for using the instant license service. Five-year and lifetime licenses automatically cover any fee increases that may occur before the license expires.

Fishing licenses are a bargain, and the monies are used to fund many useful programs.

### FISHING FORECAST

The river is still very high, and fish are tough to locate. Your best bet is to fish local lakes for bass, as fish are contained to distinct areas. Shiners and plastic worms are typically productive this time of year for bass.

Snook are running at Sebastian Inlet. Large live shrimp are the top bait for snook to 18 pounds. A few flounder, redfish, trout and jack crevalle are also mixed in with catches.

Captain Jack at Port Canaveral reports that high seas have kept boats in Port. Expect dolphin, cobia and king mackerel when seas subside. In the meantime, sheepshead and flounder are rated as fair on the Port. Trout and redfish are beginning to roam the flats of the Banana and Indian Rivers.

Sheepshead continue to be the mainstay at Ponce Inlet. Fish to 8 pounds will readily bite live shrimp or fiddler crabs. Also count on bluefish, drum, jack crevalle and a few redfish. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.

# Alcohol linked to breast cancer

DEAR DR. GOTT: Is there any way that I can modify my daily habits to avoid breast cancer?

DEAR READER: A recent report in the Journal of the American Medical Association (Feb. 18, 1998) reached a surprising conclusion: Women who consumed significant amounts of alcohol had a much higher incidence of breast cancer. The study, which involved more than 300,000 women, showed that the consumption of two to four shots of liquor, 2.5 to 4.5 bottles of beer or three to five glasses of wine a day led to a 30 to 40 percent higher risk of breast cancer than that in non-drinkers.

Although researchers were puzzled by this phenomenon, they hypothesized that the alcohol interfered with the metabolism of estragen, with resulting higher blood levels of the hormone. These higher levels overstimulated breast tissue, leading to cancer.

While infrequent and moderate alcohol consumption does not appear to affect health, regular and significant drinking does. Therefore, based on this study, you might choose to avoid alcohol or keep its consumption to a minimum.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have an elderly friend who was recently diagnosed with intestinal angina. What is this?

DEAR READER: When muscles are deprived of oxygen due to poor circulation caused by arteriosclerosis, they cramp. When the coronary arteries are affected and pain results, physicians diagnose angina pectoris. But the same muscle cramping can also occur in the intestinal lining, when the arteries supplying the bowel are blocked by arteriosclerotic plaque.

Called "intestinal angina," the condition is marked by periodic abdominal spasms, usually occurring after a meal. Patients may also experience nausea, vomiting, distension and altered bowel habits. In severe cases, the angina may progress to bowel damage or even gangrene, for which emergency surgery may be necessary.

The diagnosis is made by X-ray studies. Treatment is primarily surgical. If appropriate X rays (of the bowel circulation) show potentially dangerous obstructions, bypass grafting has to be considered.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I read with interest your column on stones in the salivary glands. I agree that it is prudent to drink plenty of fluids (especially lemonade) during meals. In addition, I've discovered a useful maneuver that often relieves the pain of salivary stones. When I feel the area around my cheeks become very sensitive, I

firmly massage the gland around the stones and have found that I can significantly reduce the pain and swelling.

DEAR READER: Stones in the salivary glands can cause dry mouth, pain and swelling. Generous intake of fluids will help overcome this. So will lemon juice, which causes an increase in the flow of saliva. When the stones block the salivary ducts, the pain and swelling may be severe. In such instances, the early application of gentle massage may alter the position of the stones, allow drainage and soothe the inflamed tissue. Therefore, there is ample theoretical and practical justification for your maneuver. Thank you for writing.

## WIN AT BRIDGE

### Twin No. 2

By Phillip Alder

Allan Falk has written and published "Bermuda Bowl Challenge" (Zookeeper). Like the Marshall Miles book reviewed yesterday, this is full of difficult deals. But it is different because it contains 80 questions (instead of 54), it costs an extra \$4, and the text is more verbose and flowery. You must be happy with analysis like: "There is a lurking Restricted Choice factor, but it must be discerned in an unfamiliar milieu."

In this deal, look at the West and North hands only. First, what do you think of your double of four spades? Next, assuming partner has nothing useful, you lead a deceptive club four-jack, 10, three. Declarer calls for dummy's diamond, which is covered by the three, jack and ace. What do you do now?

I think the double is crazy. You have no good lead, and why tell declarer where all the cards lie? Even if the layout were such that South would go two down undoubled, he will probably escape for one down doubled.

You have only one winning play at this stage: the spade king.

After explaining how other switches don't work, Falk writes, "So a trump represents the only hope. Low will not do the job — South wins cheaply in hand and has 10 easy tricks: two high spades, three heart ruffs in hand, the diamond king, two diamond ruffs in dummy, and two clubs." After the spade king, though, "Two diamond ruffs in dummy promote your jack-eight of spades into high winners ... and you still have to score the spade three one way or another."
