## Break With Mexico Is Subject Of Many Washington Reports

Governors Pass Despite Denials From State Department And Reports From Mexico

Telles To Return Say Calles Chiefs

Government Officials Aroused By Attacks On State Secretary

WASHINGTON, March 5.—(INS)—Alarming rumors of a diplomatic break with Mexico were current in the capital today, as the State Department continued its policy silence on all phases of the Mexican controversy.

Despite denials of the State department that the United States requested the recall of Sen. Manuel G. Telles, Mexican ambassador, on personal grounds, the announcement in Mexico that Telles would return to post here, the belief generally exists in official and diplomatic circles that Telles' mission, in addition to official and diplomatic matters, has been ended.

State Department officials have not told for some weeks over what Mexican policy, and relations upon Secretary of State

It has not been suggested that Telles had anything to do with propaganda, the fact that he is coming from Mexican sources.

America, according to the same sources, will be relieved if the surgery assault made upon his colleague in the Senate. To have refused any time during the present session of Congress would have risked his being "under fire" and both Secretary Kellogg and President Coolidge were unwilling to have any such impression get about.

The Senate has now fled away from Washington for nearly nine months, and state Department officials, concurring with this assumption, a long period in which their policies will not be subjected to the examination just ended. Hence a resignation early in the summer could not be construed as a recognition "under fire."

Royal Air Force Cost Put At \$77,500,000

LONDON, Mar. 5.—(INS)—The chancellor of the exchequer today announced that the estimates for the royal air force for the year 1927-28 total £55,000,000 pounds up approximately £77,500,000 on an expenditure of 10,000,000 pounds (approximately \$10,000,000) in the fiscal year just closing.

The estimates provide for an increase in the royal air force of six squadrons during the forthcoming year.

Dry Question Not To Be Democratic Issue

WASHINGTON, Mar. 5.—(INS)—Senate democrats, meeting today to organize for the next Congress, decided not to make prohibition a party issue. Each Senator will be allowed to vote as he pleases on the wet and dry question.

The conference recommended that the Read campaign fund committee continue its investigation during the summer, although the Senate refused to extend its bill.

Fifty Dry Aides Stage Gun Battle With Five Notorious Rum Runners

CHICAGO, Mar. 5.—(INS)—More than 50 detectives and federal prohibition agents today staged a gun battle with five members of a notorious bootleg gang, capturing four of them and probably wounded a fifth, who escaped with more than \$300,000 in pre-war gold.

The fight occurred at a bonded rum warehouse after authorities learned attempts would be made to steal the stock.

The rum runners, all members of the William "Klondike" O'Donnell gang, had rigged up elaborate equipment and were pumping liquor though more than two dozen kegs to a nearby house they had rented when the fight began.

The warehouse contained the only real post-war whisky in Chicago, agents said. More than \$300,000 of the whisky had been shipped into barrels when the shooting began.

Police and Samuels were wait-

ed in Illinois in connection with a \$17,000 payroll robbery in which several bandits were killed.

## MANY SLATED TO MAKE RACE FOR GOVERNOR

With Election Over Year Off State's Leaders Begin To Think Of Successor To John New Held By John Martin

Catts Will Run On Anti-Smith Platform

Secretary Of State To Quit Because Of Ill Health In Short Time Cabinet Head Wern By Official Worries

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Mar. 5.—(INS)—With the expiration of Governor John W. Martin's term of office in the spring, and Florida's constitution prohibiting any more consecutive terms as governor, half a dozen prominent politicians in the state are casting longing glances at the coveted gubernatorial chair and are already testing their political strength for their political ranks.

The reason probably will be poor health. Secretary Kellogg is approaching his seventh year, and is now in South Carolina taking a vacation which has been urged upon him by President Coolidge. His health, never robust, has suffered severely this winter under the strain of carrying a heavy load in the Mexican and Nicaragua controversies.


