

### Lining Up

American citizens will view yezterday's bombing of the Dollar Liner President Hoover, in which one Ameri-can sailor was killed and several other U. S. citizens jured, with a feeling of bitterness over everything that is taking place in the Far East. But even yet it is doubtfull if many people realize that the events of the past few weeks have brought not only China and Japan, but the rest of the world, including the United States as well, to the very brink of war.

It has already become apparent that China is no "push-over" for Japan and that a long drawn out war will be necessary to accomplish the Japanese aims. In such a war, with the increasing damage to foreign interests, and such incidents as the shooting of the British ambassador, and the bombing of neutral ships increased many times, it seems impossible that other nations will be able to keep out of it.

The recent announcement of the conclusion of a nonaggression treaty between China and Russia indicates
where the first step will be in the tortuous way of involving the whole world. Japan and Russia have been
loug at odds over boundary disputes and the Japa aggessiveness in Manchuria and North China. The treaty




