Sharp Rise Is Noted In Trade With Americas

Latin-American Exports In May Are Nearly Double Figure For Last Year

WASHINGTON, July 9.—A sharp spurt in United States exports to Latin America was noted in May.

The increase came at a time when the Roosevelt administration has discontinued its surviving inter-American trade pact by setting up a \$1,000,000,000 cartel to control all exports and imports of the American nations with Europe.

The Commerce Department said recently that exports to South America nearly doubled to \$40,200,000 in May, compared with \$20,000,000 in May, 1939. Shipments to other Latin American countries totaled \$77,200,000 in May, compared with \$32,300,000 in May, 1939. Meanwhile, sales from these countries to the United States also soared, but not quite so much as United States exports. Some of the large increases in United States exports history, figures for May, 1939, and May, 1940, included:
