belongings packed. At midnight he was out of office - no longer one of the five county commissioners.

Adams walked down the hall to say so long to Commission Chairman Randy Morris.

"Are you ready to move?" Adams asked.

Morris, wearing a dress shirt and blue jeans, nodded.

Adams had no office at all and Morris might have a new one early this afternoon. If Carlton Henley, who replaces Adams as District 4 Commissioner, is appointed chairman today, Morris will move to another office on the third-floor.

These housekeeping moves are trivial when compared to the reorganization of the Board of County Commissioners and of the leadership on key commitices such as the Metropolitan Planning Organization and the Economic Development Council.

The power base of the commission shifts from Morris. Adams and Daryl McLain to Henley, Grant Maloy and Dick Van Der Weide. Maloy and Van Der Weide championed Henley's campaign against Adams. At 1:30 this afternoon, Henley will take his oath of office.

The fireworks will follow. "Anything's liable to happen. but what everyone expects is that Henley will be appointed chairman." Morris said. "That seems to be the consensus. He'll get nominated. In theory, all five commissioners could get nominated."

Morris has been the chairman for three of four years. He put the county's plans into action and was the most visible and busiest of the commissioners. This did not enable him to overwhelm Bob West in the District 2 primary. Nor does it prevent Henley or perhaps Maloy to be the new chairman.

This position is usually rotated." Morris said. "I was appointed my first year but Van Der Weide had it the next. I got it back and kept it. I don't expect to be asked this time."



The surgery on Monday lasted approximately 90 minutes, University of Kentucky Medical Center spokeswoman Vicki Franklin said. rocks, dirt and dead tissue were removed from Watts' forearm during the surgery.

Dr. James Lovett, a plastic surgeon at the UK hospital, repaired some tendons and closed a 30 centimeter wound. Franklin said. The cleaning will be repeated today, and as often as necessary to prevent infection.

"It depends on what we find," Lovett said. "If after doing the procedure tomorrow we feel we can leave it closed, we will."

No other injuries were found. Franklin said.

Watts was driving a truck with two passengers on a deerhunting trip on Sunday, according to wire reports. The truck flipped on the rural highway, killing both passengers. Arthur Steinmetz, 19, a defensive lineman, and Scott Brock, 21, were pronounced dead at the scene, wire reports said.

Watts is a 6-foot-3, 271 pound three-year starting center for Kentucky. About two dozen teammates visited Watts in the emergency room Sunday night, according to wire reports.


Watts walked to a nearby farmhouse for help, according to wire reports.



# Shade tree contains toxic compounds

A native of southwest Asia, the tree known as chinaberry is a shade tree that is regarded as sacred in Ceylon but in many parts of the world, it is considered a pest tree. It has taken over many waste areas and other disturbed soil areas, becoming naturalized in many southern areas. including Florida.

Most parts of this tree contain toxic compounds that are highly narcotic and sometimes even lethal. Chinaberry is also called Lilac Tree, Bead Tree, Paradise Tree and Pride of India, it belongs to the mahogany plant family that includes the Neem tree, which also contains similar toxic substances. It can be seen right now in the central Florida area bearing its characteristics yellow berries.

The plant: The tree can grow

up to 30 to 40 feet in height and a spread of 15 to 25 feet wide at maturity, growing rapidly 5 to 10 feet during the first and second year after seed germination. A deciduous tree, it has alternate bipinnately compound leaves with serrate margins. Leaflets are oval and less than 2 inches long. During the fall they acquire a yellowish color which gives the tree a rather nice appearance. The individual flowers are small,

delicate, fragrant, lavender in color, and borne in racernes. The fruit is round, about the size of a cherry, 0.5 inch long, fleshy and changing color from green to a golden yellow and persist on the plant during the fall and winter seasons and long after the leaves have fallen. The fruits are smooth at first but become wrinkled as they age. Each fruit contains a single seed. The fruits are eaten by birds without any apparent harmful effect.

Toxicity: The leaves, bark, and fruit are toxic to some degree. Eating 6 or 8 berries can be lethal to a child. One of the toxins, tetranortriterpene, a

neurotoxin is known to cause irritation of the digestive tract and degeneration of the liver and kidneys. Symptoms are often delayed and can be expressed as lack of coordination. confusion, faintness or severe

symptoms like vomiting, diarrhea, difficulty in breathing, convulsions, partial or complete paralysis, and even death may occur with one day. A person may be poisoned from drinking "tea" made from the leaves of this tree.

Poison treatment: The recommended treatment is to induce vomiting, or perform gastric lavage. This treatment is followed with activated charcoal and a saline cathartic. Electrolyte replacement may be necessary to relieve the patient from symptoms of poisoning.

Culture: The tree grows well in partial shade or full sun. It tolerates most types of soil and can grow in soils with acidic or alkaline pH but does not grow well in wet soils. I will grow best in well-drained soils. It requires little if any fertilizer to grow. It is easily propagated by seeds and root cuttings. The Texas Umbrella-Tree is a selection of this tree.

Pruning: the tree branches tend to droop as the tree grows. and will require pruning for vehicular or pedestrian clearance beneath the canopy. It should be prined to a single leader to develop a strong structure be-

stomach pain. More serious cause the wood itself is weak and tends to break. With proper pruning it can produce a tree with a well-formed trunk and branch structure, and to increase its life-span, prune to open up the crown to encourage development of a few wellspaced major limbs.

> Use: This shade tree is not recommended for planting in your landscape or gardens but grows well in locations with poor drainage or compacted soil. It is also fairly drought tolerant and cold hardy. The wood has been used in cabinet making and the seeds are strung for rosary beads in southern Europe. The fruits are used to make insect repellent and flea powders. Fruits are sometimes used around flowers to keep insects away. Leaves are placed in books to keep insects from chewing on the paper. Flowers are used on temple altars in Ceylon, where they are considered sacred.
