Then came brighter and more varied colors. 



That report of the general committee, representing all sections of Osceola county, to determine which roads shall be constructed in the \$2,000,000 road building program for which a bond issue will be called, has been adopted by the local chamber of commerce.

For Killing Mate cludes 82 miles of new sixteen foot roads throughout the county and repairs to the Ocean-to-Gulf High-way from Kissimmee to the Brevard county line.

The program as adopted by the county and endorsed by the chamber provides for thirty-six miles of the Ocean to Gulf highway at Holopaw Junction through Holopaw and Menansville to the Indian River county line, where the Florida East Coast railroad leaves Osceola county and is part of a through road to Okeechobee City. Fiftee miles were agreed upon on the Lawe Wilson road, four miles on the Hilliard island road, five miles on the Marcoosee road, and eight miles to Kissimmee Park. Four and one half miles will be built through Center Park to East Lake, Tohopekaliga and along the lake shore to the city limits of St. Cloud. Ten miles will be built from the Dixie Highway through Osceola City on the pleasant Mill


