## United GOP Taking Over House

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States House of Representatives appears to be passing the baton to the House of Representatives and United Republican Party.

The result of the past week's vote on the bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, which would have increased the tax rate on income over \$100,000, was a 217-191 vote.

"For they didn't have any knowledge of germs nor did they possess our modern antibiotics and other miracle drugs."

"That's ancient physicians were basically versatile practitioners. They used all sorts of weird concoctions, such as snake rattle, spider webs, and even dried dung of alligators."

And those drugs produced miraculous cures.

For it usually isn't the medicine, even in modern times, but the belief in the doctor that does the job.

To be specific, 50 per cent of the 30,000,000 medical patients which we physicians see each week in our office are undiagnosable physical ailments whatsoever!

And among the 50 per cent who do have some organic trouble, many of them will get well, even in spite of their doctors!

As long as the patient possesses unlimited faith in his physician and the latter uses some tangible "ritual" on which the patient can fasten his belief, then 50 per cent of the patients will recover, regardless of whether they get shots of penicillin or merely colored water!

"Dr. Crane," you may protest in amazement, "aren't you afraid that such statements will eliminate most of the medical profession?"

No, indeed, for the average American is so chicken about his health that most of our television programs are financed in large part by various brands of aspirin and other tonics!

Since I am both a physician as well as former professor of "Sales and Advertising Psychology," I am forced to admit the superlative techniques of patient medicine vendors.

And I don't resent them the way most doctors do, for I also realize that the drugs we official members of the American Medical Association employ are largely to ally the patient's fears and build up his confidence.

### Fighting U.S. Makes Ho Bigwig

WASHINGTON (NEA)—What has North Vietnam's Ho Chi Minh to lose by coming to the conference table?

If he has nothing to lose, or relatively little to lose, by continuing to fight, and a great deal to gain, then it's folly to talk about peace negotiations.

Consider these facts:

1—Ho is a man who has for more than three decades believed he has a mission to install Ho-ism—the Ho brand of communism—in a major chunk of Southeast Asia—all of former French Indochina, parts of Thailand and neighboring Malaya.

2—This burning dream or ambition is not something he will give up in the closing years of his life.

3—What could the United States or any other government offer in return?

Even if Ho's defeat were certain, as defeat has seemed certain during much of his life, he could not give up this ambition.

4—From a Communist ideological standpoint, as long as the war goes on as it is now, Ho is in his element. He is standing alone against the world's most powerful nation.

5—He holds the center of the Communist world stage. So long as he continues his fight, his prestige grows in the Communist world.

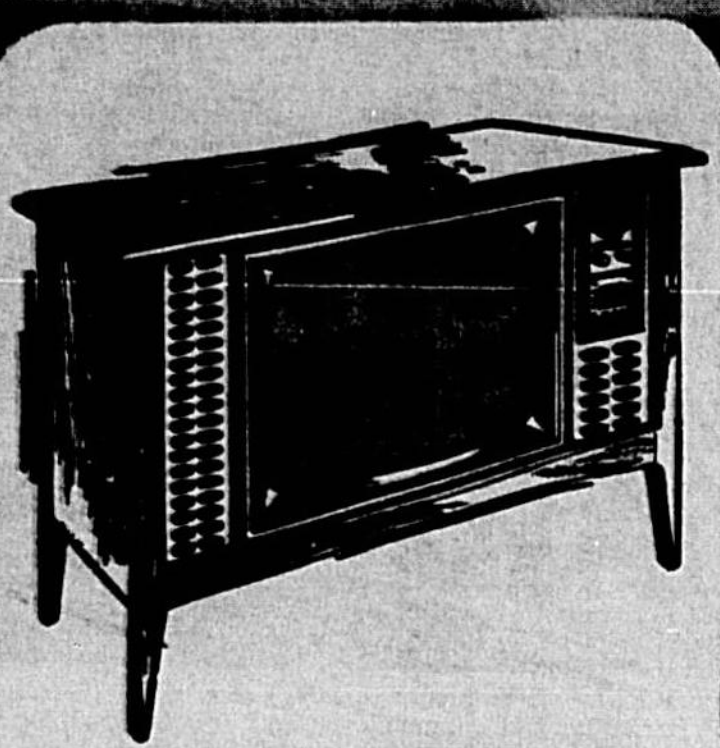

## New Engine Could 'Light Up World'

SARASOTA (AP)—A new engine which could "light up the world" and outdo the internal combustion engine in efficiency as the invention of a scientist here.

Wallace E. Minko says he and associates at Sarasota Research and Development Corporation devised the steam-and-freon machine called the "Minko Engine" for lack of a better name.

Minko told a news conference recently that it would mean cheaper, safer and non-polluting automobiles.

The exhaust, produced from heat from an open flame in a combustion chamber, contains only carbon dioxide—a compound exhaled by humans. Carbon monoxide, unburned hydrocarbons, nitrogen oxides, lead fumes and other noxious by-products common to internal combustion engines would be gone.

Minko's plan calls for a type of freon called F11 which boils at 77 degrees Fahrenheit. It is an odorless, colorless gas commonly used as a refrigerating unit.

The principle difference between his design and the conventional, impractical steam engine of old is that freon is used in the closed circulatory system instead of water, he said.

It boils much faster and therefore is more efficient. He says the engine could run on almost any kind of fuel, and is capable of propelling a car 45 miles on a gallon of kerosene.

The cars would cost less because the steam engine doesn't have "all those widgets going."

The scientist claims that, since the engine can re-use steam, it could also increase electrical power plant production. "I think low pressure steam is tapped before it enters a condenser for conversion to water."

## Sanford's Greatness Coming

Sanford, confronted by the challenges and opportunities of a 345 per cent growth between 1965 and 1990, is "one area that has taken the bull by the horns and is getting going." In making this statement Harlan L. Hanson, director, Orange-Seminole Joint Planning Commission, predicted that "the greatest 10 years in Sanford's history is coming up."

Hanson appeared at the weekly meeting of the Sanford Civitan Club in the Trophy Lounge yesterday.

His statements regarding the present situation in the city and Seminole County came only after he had been warned, on his arrival in this county 15 months ago, that "Sanford is stagnant." He termed "fantastic what has been going on here under strong leadership" and emphasized that "the opinion I just heard expressed here is valid." He urged civic groups to get behind the local leadership to inform themselves what is in the future and take steps now to "determine for yourselves what kind of a Sanford you want to have come about."

Here are some of the statistics which the planning commission has developed as they sought answers to the tremendous challenges of population growth and ways to cope with it with adequate transportation, highways, water and sewer systems and general proper land use.

First he defined the Sanford area as consisting east of I-4 south of Lake Monroe; west of Cameron Avenue, the Naval Air Base and SR-471; and north of Evans Rd., in Lake Mary. In 1963 20,000 persons lived in this area. By 1990 this will increase to 60,000 persons at a moderate rate of 35 per cent. "After 1980," said Hanson, "Sanford will feel the impact of suburbanites who will live in Sanford, shop in Sanford, seek recreation in Sanford, but work in the Orlando area."

Using charts to show the high ways in being planned, Hanson emphasized the need for better north-south routes, changes in the Sanford Avenue access with the Lake Jessup causeway handling increased traffic from the Florida Technological University environs. East-west routes were described with the enlarged SR 46 along 20th Street and taking care of the growth which is expected when the NAS is given up and air-oriented industry comes in a regional airport a major improvement.

He proposed special up-dated statistics for Sanford indicating that when the 65,000 total is reached for Sanford it will consist of 46,150 adults and preschool children, 13,000 elementary students, 3,250 Junior high school students and 2,600 high school students. Basic needs would be 18,570 housing units, 14 elementary schools, 2 or 3 Junior high schools and one or two high schools. There would be needed 26 miles of arterial streets and the same number of collector streets and 200 miles of local streets. And 130 firemen and 200 policemen would be required.

Statistics offered brought gasps from the Civitans. To properly construct basic sewer and water facilities in the Sanford area to cope with the growth would require about \$5,000,000, he said.

The report criticized several aspects of the plans for each of the schools.

The county's financial controller, J. H. Beckwith, said today that the state report says, "Budgets were well prepared and complied with in total. Records were well kept and generally adequate. Finances were well managed."

"The county road program continued appropriately planned and expenditures were made on a county wide need basis."

The county received \$30,000 for interest on time deposits, in the audit period. "Minutes were complete, approved, signed, attested and entered. Prescribed records were accurately kept."

Beckwith today stated that the county's appreciation of recommendations and suggestions in the report. Recommendations included that record of road and bridge material supplies be perpetual inventoried and that pre-numbered receipts be issued at the sanitary landfill for payment of charges. Current practice is to have the receipts issued through the county clerk's office.

### Union, FEA Ties Chill Local Official

Comparison between unions and the Florida Education Association "runs cold chills down my spine," Mrs. Cindy Crane, chairman of the Classroom Teachers Department of the Seminole Education Association declared at the meeting of the School Board Thursday afternoon.

The remark was made following a statement by Vice Chairman John Evans pointing out some of education in New York state and Michigan indicate "a drive toward unionization of state and federal employees. Who is to control education," Evans asked, "parents, the voters and elected officials or professional unionized teachers?"

Mrs. Crane said, "FEA is so strong against unions. FEA does not want the unions or teachers unionized. With a union, teachers would no longer be represented by persons working in education, but instead by persons paid for the job of arbitration. We do not want this."

In a round robin discussion between members of the School Board, School Superintendent William Phillips and a half dozen members and one father announced at the meeting time, lack of adequate communication between the Board, teachers and parents was hit as one of the causes of the current school crisis.
