## Cyclist Killed By Drunk Driver

A motorist who left a bar and drove the wrong way onto U.S. Highway 17-92 Saturday night struck and killed a Sanford motorcyclist.

The driver was initially charged with driving under the influence and other charges may be brought.

According to the Florida Highway Patrol, Patrick A. Stephen, 25, of 2404 Myrtle Ave., was northbound on U.S. Highway 17-92 at about 11:15 p.m. when his motorcycle was hit by a car head-on. The car was traveling south in a northbound lane two-tenths of a mile south of Airport Boulevard.

Stephen was pronounced dead at the scene.

Lloyd Edgar Albritton, 42, of Chiefland, had just left the nearby Islander Tavern, 3207 Orlando Ave., the FHP said. Albritton was charged with driving under the influence of alcohol and with a suspended driver's license. He was released from Seminole County jail after paying \$500 bond.

Stephen, who had worked at Starline Enterprises of Sanford since July 12, made and installed ambulance cabinets.

Starline President Earl Smith said today Stephen was a good worker, quiet and responsible.

"He was very well thought of by the company and the employees."

He started worked at Starline July 12th.

Mike Owens, sales coordinator at the firm, said:

"Pat had such a good attitude. He was such a nice young man. I only knew him for a month. Everyone said he was always working hard and always had a good word for everybody. He was willing to work for you even though he was punched out on the clock."

Owens said he was angered that the driver of the car that hit Stephen's motorcycle "can get out with just \$500 bond. This is a serious malfunction of the judicial system."

But a Seminole County jail spokesperson said the \$500 bond Albritton posted is just the standard bond set for persons charged with driving under the influence. If other charges are brought, Albritton may have additional bond to meet.

Stephen, who was a member of the choir at First Baptist Church in Sanford, had previously worked for Custom Installations of Lake Mary and Pittsburgh Testing Laboratory in Port Charlotte.

Stephen is survived by his wife Deena and a son Christopher, both of Sanford; his mother Mrs. Faye Stephen of Oxon Hill, Md.; and his father Edward S. Stephen of Port Charlotte.

## Is Marina Dredging Worth \$50,000?

Sanford city commissioners are expected to decide today whether they want to pay \$50,000 for maintenance dredging in the west basin of Lake Monroe.

But City Manager W.E. "Pete" Knowles, in a written report to the commission, says the Monroe Marina functions do not generate enough revenue to support further municipal funds being invested.

In fact, he says, the combined marina-motel operation is not generating sufficient revenue to defray even the interest costs.

Commissioners are scheduled to discuss the issue at 7 p.m. in city hall, 300 N. Park Ave.

In addition to the dredging costs, Knowles says the city would have to provide an area to hold the 10,000 cubic yards of dirt to be removed from the lake and ultimately dispose of the soil in some fashion.

Knowles is also seeking an answer to the question of whether the commission wants to undertake a solution to beach erosion at the marina, estimated to cost another \$107,000.

In a written report to the commission, Knowles noted that dredging in the east basin is expected to be completed by Sept.

15. The commission earlier agreed that the city would reimburse Charles Volk, marina operator, for the \$67,000 cost by waiving the lease fee for the property at the rate of \$10,000 per year.

The original plan was to create "spoil dikes" (dikes containing soil removed from the floor of the lake during dredging) on the existing beach areas with the city shaping the beach and removing the excess spoil to its trash landfill on Art Lane. A small section at the northeast corner of the paved parking lot was to be used in the original plan for temporary storage of the spoil.

However, while Knowles was away on vacation in late July, the plans were changed at the request of the state Department of Environmental Regulation and the entire north area of the parking lot was diked for use as the spoil area.

"The city now has the entire spoil material to move," Knowles said, in addition to backfilling and reshaping the beach plus restoring the paved area.

From a dollars and cents viewpoint, Knowles says the marina cost \$1.05 million funded through a bond issue in 1965. —Donna Estes

# Blind Mosquito Research To End

After five years of research into blind mosquitoes at Sanford, the program is coming to an end.

Dr. John Darby, head of the University of Florida's Agriculture Research and Education Center in Sanford, said today the Legislature will not fund the research program any further.

But, additional research may not be necessary. "We have found some simple solutions to at least part of the midge problem," he said.

And either the city or county government will most likely have to implement some type of solutions quickly.

Dr. Arshad Ali, who has been conducting the research at the center at 2700 E. Celery Ave., is predicting, from his knowledge of the blind mosquito cycle, that the insect "will swoop" into the Sanford downtown in hordes next summer. Darby said. At about the same time Ali will be leaving the area.

Ali said today that among the simple and relatively inexpensive ways of to control the midge are:

- Dim lights along the lakefront and at businesses near the lake.
- Install bright lights on the channel markers in the lake to attract the insects back into the lake. "This is the best bet and would cost only the price of energy needed for the lights," Ali said.
- Reduce midge larvae in the lake by stocking with four species of sun fish and cat fish between April and September when the problem arises.
- Adulterate the lakefront areas during the times when the adult midge population is out of hand.
- Use insecticides for spot relief — those that have been tested in Ali's laboratory.
- Change the ecological environment in the lake to create an unfavorable environment there so that it will not support the midge.

Ali is still studying the sediment and water chemistry in Lake Monroe to make final determinations on how this can be done.

"I am studying the data and must analyze it," he said.

He said he appeared at a luncheon meeting of the Sanford Kiwanis Club Wednesday at the Sanford Civic Center to show slides and detail the recommendations.

Ali said that he is preparing a comprehensive report of his findings in layman's language to the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce in about 30 days.

Darby said the research is being phased out because the Legislature did not include funding for the work as a line item in the budget.

"Former State Rep. Robert Hattaway was the prime mover in getting the funding and when he lost his election to the Legislature, there was no real support in Tallahassee for the program," Darby said.

"In the beginning we expected the program would take five years," Darby said, adding a great deal of information was collected during the period.

"I think government should close out a project when it has done its work. Research could go on forever. Dr. Ali has found out enough about the insect to be able to make some recommendations to the county and the city of Sanford to take it up from there. We have done our part," he said.

Darby praised Ali for the excellent job he has done, saying Ali will continue to work with the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Science (IFAS) either with a research unit at Vero Beach or at the university itself. "He is considered one of the best men we have."

Darby said it is likely that Ali's next field of research will be aquatic insects in cooperation with the research unit in Vero Beach.

"Officially the midge research program has been terminated here. Dr. Ali is wrapping it up now. But he will still be available to us (at the Sanford center) and will help in any way he can," Darby said.

## Gas Tax: State Gets \$205,200 Off The Top

The state of Florida will be a major beneficiary of the 4 cents per gallon gasoline tax levied by Seminole County beginning Sept. 1.

The state will be receiving 6 percent of the revenues or \$205,200 off the top of the \$3.4 million in estimated receipts in fiscal 1983-84 beginning Oct. 1 for what is labeled "administrative costs."

So, when the state takes its 6 percent off the top and 35 percent of

# Phone Strike Pact May Clear Backlog

Southern Bell's Sanford Manager Larry Strickler today expressed relief that a tentative national settlement has been reached and is hopeful it will be ratified locally. He expects striking workers to be back on the job on Thursday.

With a tentative nationwide pact already in place — one that might mean higher prices for consumers — union and Bell System officials sought to work out local agreements today to end the 16-day telephone strike.

Representatives of the three striking unions and the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. signed

the accord Sunday night. Union officials said the walkout by 675,000 operators and service technicians could end by Thursday morning if 34 local bargaining units resolve their outstanding contract disputes.

"From the customer service standpoint, the one service not back to normal now is phone installations. With management substituting we have repairs and business office activities caught up," said Strickler. He said that the telephone company has been screening applicants for new phones and asking them to wait until the

strike was settled if possible. Emergency situations, such as a cancer patient in Oviedo who needed a phone, were given priority.

He said that normally 16 people work at installing phones, but last week in the Sanford area two foremen and three engineers were doing the job.

"We were severely crippled," Strickler said, "but by taking care of emergencies and with customer patience, we did a credible job. It took management's working six and seven days a week and 14-16 hours a day to do it."

He expects it will take two weeks

to catch up with the installation backlog.

The three-year pact, which is still subject to ratification by rank-and-file members, provides for a 16.4 percent average wage increase during the life of the agreement.

The document was signed at a Washington hotel by Glenn Watts, president of the Communications Workers of America, and Rex Reed, vice president for labor relations of the American Telephone & Telegraph Co.

Reed called the agreement a "balanced settlement" but said it

could result in higher telephone rates.

"Wage increases do impact on phone rates," Reed told reporters. But he emphasized an increase of productivity might enable the Bell System to hold down the costs.

"We hope to have local negotiations wrapped up by midnight Wednesday and we will call an end to this strike just as quickly as possible," Watts said.

"Assuming those local contracts are completed... CWA members can begin returning to work," he said.

Calcium Not Good Stomach Antacid



DEAR DR. LAMB - I would like some information on antacids. I have acid stomach frequently and have always found that I can relieve the condition by taking Tums. As a result I take Tums every day. Are they bad for you? Would I be better off taking some other antacid? What one would you recommend?
I have heard that calcium is not good for you as an antacid. Why? I know Tums are calcium carbonate. And I have also heard milk is not good for an acid stomach. Why?
DEAR READER - As the years have passed and more information has become available about antacids I have become less and less enthusiastic about any of them.
Yes, it has been said that calcium is not a good antacid because it stimulates the stomach to produce more acid. So it does. But the same thing happens if you use any antacid that is really effective in neutralizing stomach acid. It is as if the illness that caused the increased acid production has set the acidity level that is to be maintained, like setting your thermostat. If you succeed in neutralizing the acid, the stomach just produces more to get back to the acid level it is trying to maintain.
Calcium is no different from other antacids in that regard, just more effective in neutralizing stomach acid. Milk with its calcium content has the same action.
Aluminum products may cause problems. Too much magnesium is harmful in older people and the bicarbonate preparations can upset your chemical balance. There is NO antacid that is free of problems. That is why a do-it-yourself antacid program is not wise. If you have acidity you should see a doctor and let him manage your program.

DEAR DR. LAMB - I have always heard that the male determines the sex of the child but I am wondering if that is always true.
I am the mother of four healthy boys and I love them all but I have always wanted a daughter. I have a slight to moderate hormone imbalance, too much male hormone. I have noticed through the years that any other woman who also displays symptoms of having a hormone imbalance usually has all male children. It seems to be true too often to be just a coincidence. Is there anything to that theory?
DEAR READER - We have two chromosomes that determine our sex. A female has two X chromosomes (XX) and a male has one X and one Y chromosome (XY). One chromosome comes from the mother and the other from the father. A woman always produces X chromosomes, that is her ova all carry one X chromosome.
When the cell selection occurs to form sperm cells, some sperm cells will get the father's X chromosome and others his Y chromosome. If a Y sperm cell unites with the X carrying ovum it will produce an XY child or male. If an X sperm unites with the X carrying ovum it will produce an XX child or female.
There is no evidence that a woman's hormone balance has anything to do with it. If a man is prone to producing lots of Y sperm cells he is more likely to produce males but if he is more prone to produce X sperm he will father females.
