

#### Get Pies-In-Faces

NEW YORK (AP) - Stalking their targets in classrooms and cafes, on campus and maybe even on Capitol Hill, the pie throwers are pushing gooey pies in the faces of unsuspecting citizens. The fad started almost a year ago with the establishment of Pie Kill Unlimited in New York. Rex Weiner, the organizer, was a former political prankster who decided that "politicians shouldn't have a monopoly on dirty tricksters." For a fee of \$40 and up, Weiner and his crew threw pies in offices and at conventions and parties. The practice appears to have spread, with some of the pie throwers operating on an amateur basis and others organizing into moneymaking groups.

#### Killed For Dip In Pool

MIAMI (AP) - "Help, help my friend is shot!" Domingo Guiterrez cried after an afternoon swim by five boys in a private pool ended in the fatal wounding of one of the youngsters. Domingo, 12, said he and four friends slipped into the pool of a private apartment building Wednesday to escape the 80-degree heat. He said Maria Otero, owner of the building, got angry at them. "She screamed for us to get out of the pool, and we were going to," he told newsmen later. "We started running away, and she shot at us and hit Johnnie." Mrs. Otero, 56, surrendered to police and was charged with first-degree

Every day, nearly 300 million worth at today's price - is vented to the atmosphere from active U.S. coal mines. And still, with the increasing depth of mining, most mine ventilation systems are being overloaded. The result is the need for frequent and costly suspensions of mining activity until the gas can be cleared.

Experts agree that the deeper and more gassy coal seams cannot be mined in the future unless some degasification technique is applied before mining is begun. The U.S. Bureau of Mines has demonstrated that it is possible to degasify virgin coal seams by drilling vertical holes into them from the surface.
