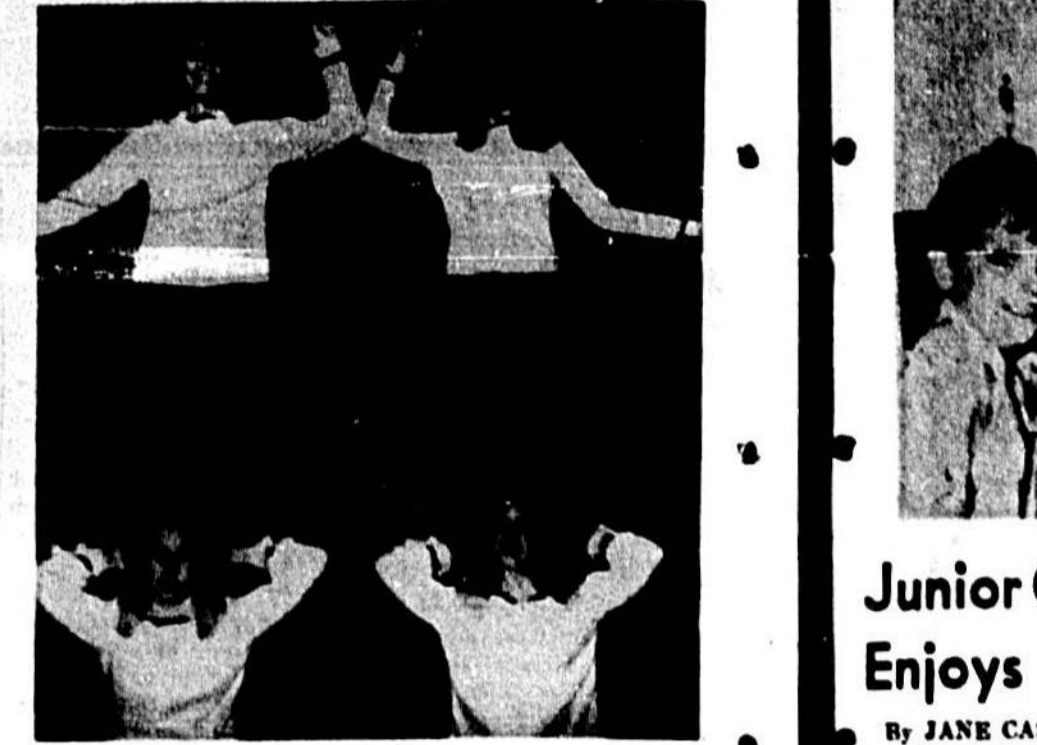

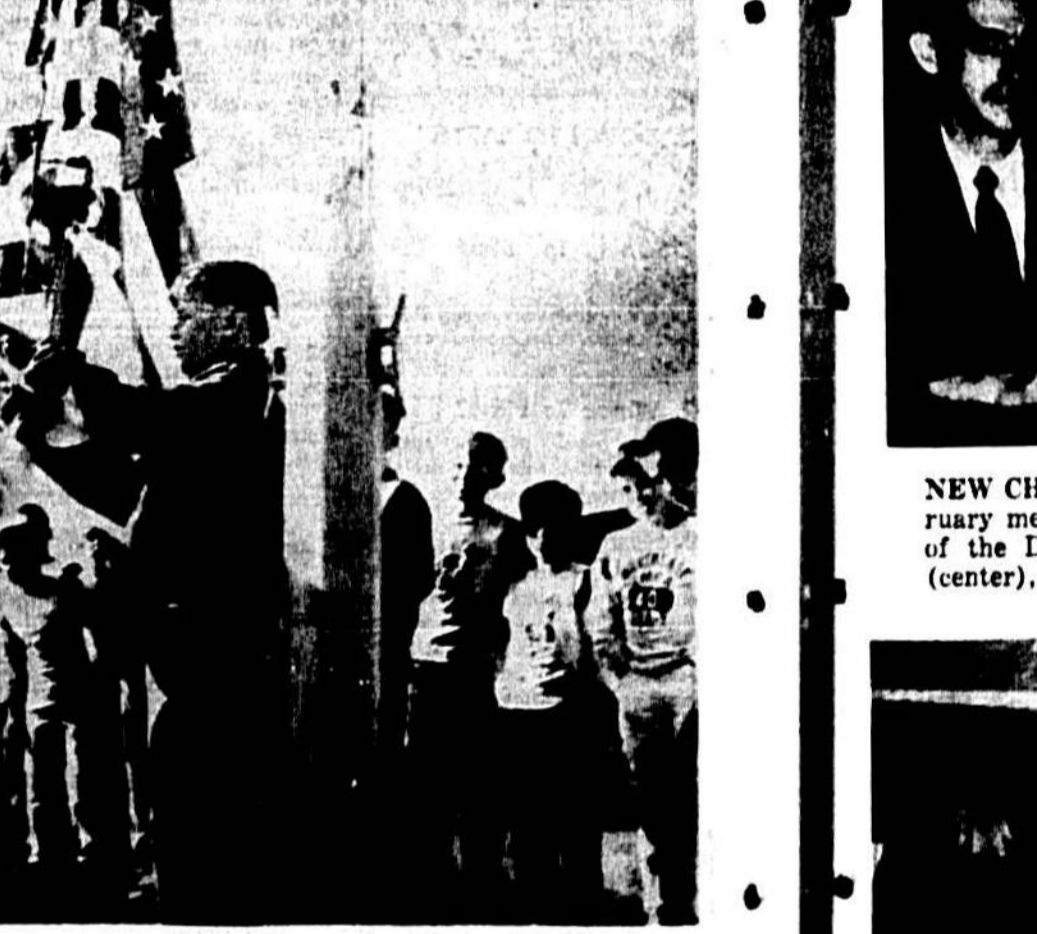

"A History of the Life and Death, Virtues and Exploits of General George Washington, Honourable to Himself and Exemplary to his Young Countrymen."

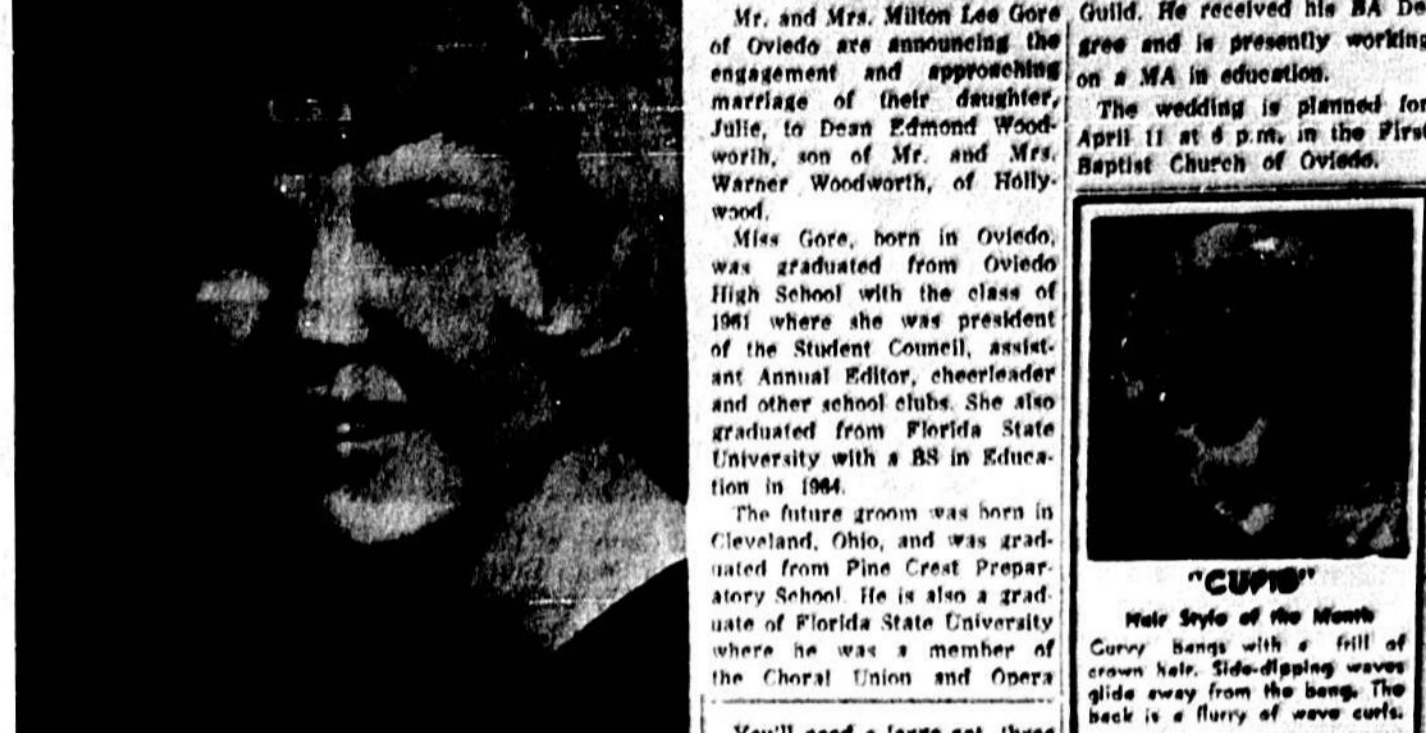

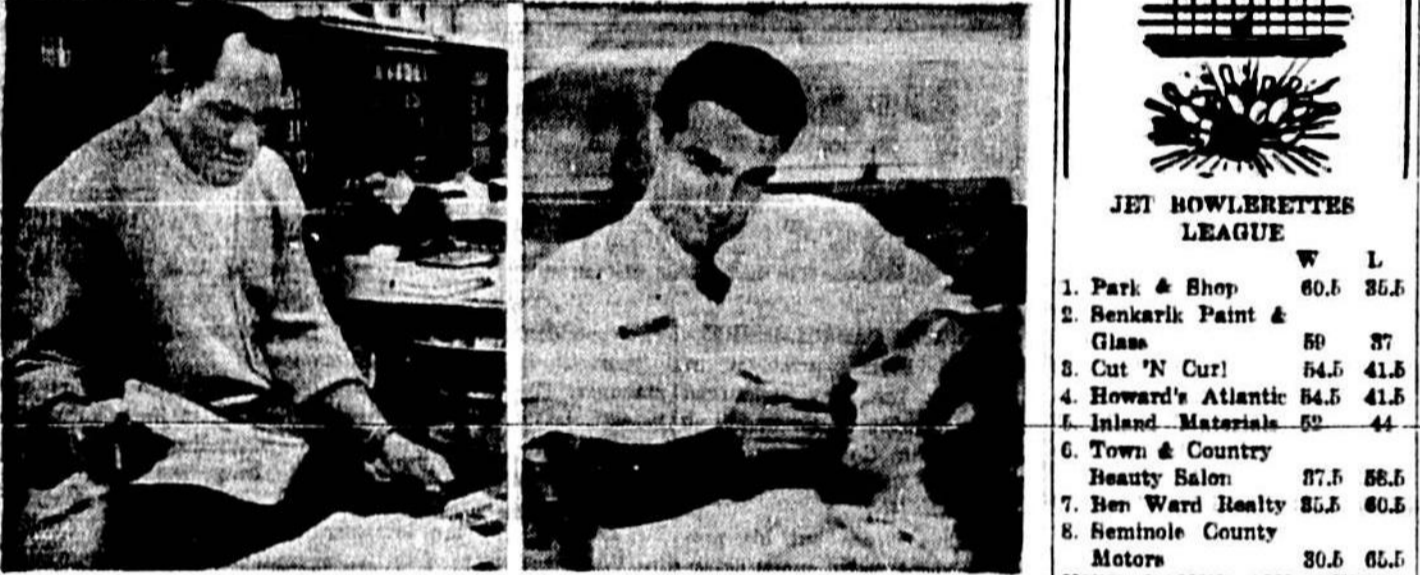
