WASHINGTON (AP) - Army Chief of Staff Gen. Creighton Abrams is expected to remain in Walter Reed Army Hospital for a few more days recovering from what the hospital called a mild case of pneumonia. Abrams cut short a European trip and entered the hospital last Thursday. He is nearly half way through a four-year term as the Army's top uniformed officer.

Dean Talks Of Hoffa Parole

WASHINGTON (AP) - Former White House counsel John W. Dean III says he suggested the pardon restriction that bars ex-Teamsters chief James R. Hoffa from union activities until 1980.

In a deposition disclosed Tuesday, Dean testified that he recommended the stipulation in a memorandum submitted to President Nixon before Hoffa was granted executive clemency and released from federal prison Dec. 23, 1971.

Hoffa, who served less than five years of a 13-year term for jury tampering and mail fraud, has filed a civil suit to

Support Troop Cutbacks

WASHINGTON (AP) - The U.S. Army commander in Europe says military manpower trimmed from headquarters and support elements will be used to strengthen combat units rather than being returned to the United States, Gen. Michael Davison said no net reductions in U.S. arms strength in Europe are in the works. Davison's statement in an interview countered persistent reports that the United States would cut total U.S. strength in Europe by about 20,000 support troops.

Spanish Galleon Sought

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)-A Spanish galleon believed to have sank 450 years ago with a large quantity of gold aboard may be in the area that will be searched first in a planned archeological survey of South Carolina waters. The University of South Carolina Institute of Archeology and Anthropology announced the survey Tuesday. It said it would begin around Winyah Bay in Georgetown County.

Eventually, the survey is expected to cover all underwater areas of the state.

861 Nuclear Mishaps

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Atomic Energy Commission says the nation's power industry last year reported 861 abnormal occurrences at nuclear generating

In a summmary of the data released Tuesday, the AEC said the incidents included a few involving significant property damage at two plants and release into the atmosphere of radioactive material from two other sites. However, the agency said only one nuclear plant employe was injured and none of the reported incidents posed any threat to the public's health and safety.

Search For Cyclist Curtailed

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP) An American search team, antalizingly close to the trail of missing motorcycle racer Fred Mundy a few days ago, has given up in frustration, leaving the search to a handful of Mexican covboys. "His actions appear to be irrational," San Diego

Sheriff's Lt. Robert Morse, coordinator of the search, said late Tuesday after returning from the rocky, desolate Baja California desert where Mundy became lost May 1 He said he was puzzled by Mundy's apparent failure to leave any clues for the massive search team. "He must know by now that there is a search going on for him,"

Potential Hurricane Deaths

HOUSTON (AP) - Dr. Robert H. Simpson, former director of the National Hurricane Center at Miami, Fla., says because of increased coastal population, a single hurricane could take up to 50,000 lives in this country before the end of the century.

"Simpson said concrete slab homes are often undermined and destroyed by hurricanes, while there is usually enough left of piling-anchored homes to make them worth repairing.

Simpson spoke at a havricane awareness conference sponsored by the Texas Coastal and Marine Council. The nurricane expert said building codes in coastal flood zones should carry requirements that would give homes a fair chance of surviving a severe hurricane.



Exorcist' Suit Filed

MIAMI (AP) - Warner Bros. Inc.and William Peter Blatty, author of the best-selling book and movie "The Exorcist," have been named in a \$7 million suit filed by a Greek Orthodox priest who says he was the model for the story's main character.

Father Mark A.C. Karras, archbishop of the Eastern Orthodox Catholic and Apostolic Church of Christ, also named Harper & Row and Bantam Books publishing houses as defendants in the suit filed in Miami federal court Tuesday.

The priest says his name, information about his background and his description match the story's main character and that they were used without his consent constituting an invasion of privacy.

Dolphin Slaughter Feared

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) - Rep. Lou Frey, R-Fla., says that federal regulations to protect dolphins will in fact lead to a wholesale slaughter of the playful marine mammals in Florida. In a Tuesday statement, he asked the National Oceanic

and Atmospheric Administration to reconsider a proposed rule that would allow commercial fishermen to kill dolphins and porpoises after buying a \$5 permit. The Marine Mammal Protection Act was passed two years ago in an effort to halt drownings of dolphins

trapped in the nets of Pacific coast tuna boats. The proposed regulation would let fishermen who buy the permit kill dolphins that threaten their gear or catch.

Desser From

Scotland By CECILY BROWNSTONE Associated Press Food Editor

As a change from the usual American apple pie, we find a Scottish variation of the dessert a delight. A friend of ours came on it in "The Highlander's Cookbook" by Sheila MacNiven Cameron (Ward Ritchie Press), adapted it to suit her family's tastes and passed it along to us. All our own tasters were highly approving of the adaptation which uses more apple and less lemon juice than the original.

The ingredients for the short pastry for the pie are exactly as the author of "The Highlander's Cookbook" gives them, but we use a different method: we roll out the dough on a pastry cloth with a stockinet-covered rolling pin whereas the cookbook suggests you roll it out on lightly floured wax paper. If you don't own the pastrymaking accoutrements, by all means use wax paper.
