**FILMS, RECORDS DISCOVERED**

FRANKFURT, Aug. 8.—(AP)—American Army agents have uncovered a huge cache of film strips and phonograph records of hundreds of speeches made by Nazi leaders. The collection was found in a German farmhouse. The European Intelligence Division says it includes records of speeches made by Gestapo Chief Heinrich Himmler, Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz, Field Marshal Erhard Milch and Arms Minister Albert Speer. However, no records of speeches made by Hitler were found in the collection.

## Bill Lange And Clark Griffith Discuss Baseball At Recent Meet

WASHINGTON—When two old-timers get together they like to talk about the past—and that's what happened when Bill Lange and Clark Griffith met here the other day.

Lange is 75, Griffith, 76. Lange, a gallant diamond figure before the turn of the century, was the guest, Griffith the host.

While Lange did most of the listening, Griffith, president of the Washington Senators, did most of the reminiscing about the good old days when they were rookie teammates on the Chicago White Stockings.

"He's the best outfielder that ever played behind me," said Griffith, a pitcher a those days. "He

down in San Francisco in real estate. "When I quit, Boston got permission to dicker with me," Lange said. "I was asked what I wanted to come back. I wired that I wanted \$50,000, which was like asking for \$5,000 or more today."

"Boston wired back that I could have \$5,000. Finally they boosted it to \$8,000, so I wired and begged them to stop tempting me. I said I'd quit and I meant to keep my word."

Griffith recalled one of the greatest plays Lange ever made. "It happened right here in Washington," he said. "I was pitching for Chicago. Bill missed the train

from New York and arrived in the fourth inning. We were then with the Chicago Coils and Cap Anson fined Lange \$100 before he put him in the game.

"I had a one-run lead when Al Selbach of Washington hit a terrific drive. Lange ran back hard, and when he crashed into the wooden fence his 210 pounds took him right through the planks.

"He caught the ball at the same time and held it. All we could see were his feet sticking through the fence and Bill's arm holding the ball. When he came back to the bench, he handed the ball to Anson and said:

"This ought to cancel that \$100 fine." It did, too."

Full figures are not available, but in just 89 of the 3,455 mail-fraud cases handled last year more than \$1,800,000 was filched from the public in all types of sharp practices.

Mague says there has been a gradual—but so far not alarming—increase in mail-truck and mail-train holdups, another responsibility of his service. A registered mail sack is snatched here and there.

The incidents are growing in number, Mague says, as unemployment grows and prices rise. He has alerted the inspectors against repetition of the bold forays which followed World War I, such as Gerald Chapman's stickup of a mail truck for a million dollars in New York.

Mague says post office burglaries are starting up again but that so far most of them are by small fry hoodlums—nothing like in the early '20s, when burglars got the biggest haul in all postal history, \$250,000 in stamps from the Pawtucket, R. I., post office. They were captured and sentenced to 10 years in jail.

"Sniping" of government checks from mailboxes is giving postal inspectors their biggest headache. Thefts have risen from 909 in 1944 and 1,546 in 1945 to what looks like something near 2,000 in 1946.

At first it was carried on principally by black-beep boys and girls who seemed satisfied with just enough to finance a night in a five dive. Now, Mague says, there is evidence that older and wiser heads are directing organized depredations.
