

## By Rouge Against Viets

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) — Officials of Cambodia's ousted Khmer Rouge regime today claimed they are fighting "house-tohouse" against Vietnamese invaders that have swept over the country

The report came from Thai foreign ministry officials who said they met today with three Khmer Rouge officials in the Cambodian border town of Poinet.

# Sihanouk: 'Naked Aggression'

NEW YORK (UPI) — Former Cambodian Prince Norodom Sihanouk has denounced Vietnam's "naked aggression" and vowed to present his country's case to the United Nations Security Council. "We are the victim of naked aggression," the former ruler of state told a crowded news congerences on his arrival at Kennedy International Airport.

## U.S. Freezes Vietnam Talks

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The United States, in a effort to pressure Hanoi into withdrawing Vietnamese troops from Cambodia, has put a freeze on talks aimed at establishing diplomatic relations with Vietnam. "There is no question of any movement on normalization of relations under the present circumstances," said Jack Cannon. spokesman for the State Department's Asian bureau. He said the statement referred to the presence of a massive number of Vietnamese troops in Cambodia.

### Teddy: Compete With OPEC

BOSTON (UPI) — Hoping to end Arab control of world oil prices, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy urged the United States, Canada and Mexico Tuesday to unite and compete with the Organization of Petroleum Exporting administration's energy policies, Massachusetts Defricient also recommended creation of a world oil experation fund to find new sources of oil.

### Sadat Asks Economy Help

CARIO, Egypt (UPI) — President Anwar Sadat, confident "peace will definitely be realized," plans to visit the United States, West Germany and Japan to ask their help in improving his nation's chronically backward economy. Finance Minister Ali Lotfi, who announced Sadat's travel plans, also said Egypt's budget this year allocated only 14.2 percent of its total expenditure to war as opposed to an average of 30 to 35 percent in 1973, 1974 and 1975.

### 'Quiet' Iran: Regime Reeling

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Iran's 5-day-old civilian government today reeled under the combined blow of defection by its key military supporter and sharp attacks from the opposition demanding the shah leave. But the country remained relatively quiet for the second straight day as demonstrators stayed indoors and heavy snow covered the streets that were the scene of numerous bonfires last

# Monetary Fund In The Works

NASSAU, Bahamas (UPI) Implementation of the European Monetary Fund should take place within a few weeks, says West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt, but he predicted it would have no effect on the stability of the U.S. dollar. Schmidt said he hoped it would stabilize exchange rates within the Common Market and restore the tranquil conditions that prevailed between 1948 and 1970.



# Brezhnev 'Badly Wants' SALT Treaty, Baker Says

MOSCOW (UPI) — A Republican Senate delegation that met with Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev said today the Soviet Union "badly wants" a new strategic arms limitation agreement and won't let Washington's new relations with China stand in the way of the pact.

Brezhnev, 72, appeared in ruddy-cheeked health as he received the senatorial delegation and U.S. Ambassador Malcolm Toon. "My overall view is that President Brezhnev and the Soviet government badly want this treaty," Senate Minority Leader Howard Baker of Tennessee told a news conference after the session with Brezhnev and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei

"I have found no one so far in our visit who is in a position of authority who has indicated even the slightest qualm about it. So the first mpression is that they want to have this treaty concluded." Baker said the issue of a possible summit

between Brezhnev and Carter was raised at the meeting. "I got the impression that it would be later this year," Baker said. Sen. John Danforth of Missouri said he heard Brezhnev say "I guess I'll be going to the United States," indicating the summit could take place in Washington. There has been talk in Moscow that the Soviets were trying to convince Carter to come to Moscow.





# Minimum Wage: Fair Or Not?

The federal minimum wage was established in 1938, in the words of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, to give "all our able-bodied workingmen and women a fair day's pay for a fair day's work."

Through a series of legislative increases, the original 25-cents-an-hour minimum has advanced to \$2.90 as of Jan. 1.

But is it fair? It is not, according to Dr. Walter E. Williams, a black economist, who claims that the wage floor bars youths from jobs — particularly black and minority youths.

Statistics support the argument. Unemployment figures have dropped over-all, but youth unemployment has not gone down.

And Jack Carlson, an economist of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States. insists that deferral of the Jan. 1 minimum-wage hike could have reduced consumer prices by 1.5 percent and provided 900,000 additional jobs for young and minority workers.

True, \$2.90 an hour is hardly generous. Neither are the increases mandated for 1980 and 1981, but each increase is expected to add \$2 billion to the nation's employment costs — at a time when inflation is again a threat to economic stability. Even Federal Reserve Board Chairman G. William Miller has called the minimum wage increase last year a significant factor in the recent

worsening of inflation. An increase at the bottom of the wage scale tends to ripple upward, increasing pressure for higher wages throughout the economy, even though higher wages may not be justified by increased productivity.

Congress should take another look at the balance of the minimum wage rate timetable.

no minimum wage laws or other mechanisms to keep a contractor from disrupting a local labor market by importing cheap labor from out of town The GAO has released the results of a study showing that the

Labor Department has never figured out how to enforce the Davis-Bacon Act, and if it did, no useful purpose would be

The Labor Department, says GAO, has never developed a system to gather accurate data on prevailing wages. When it makes a mistake on the high side - as it did in 40 percent of the cases studied by the GAO — the result is to inflate the cost of a federal project by insisting that contractors pay more than what is actually the prevailing local wage.

When it errs on the low side, the wages paid by the contractor generally are the prevailing ones anyhow. .So what is Davis-Bacon accomplishing?

For one thing, the GAO figures that its high-side errors are adding \$500 million a year to what the federal government spends on construction

Further, contractors are spending \$200 million a year complying with payroll-reporting requirements under the act, while the government itself spends \$15 million in its botched attempts to carry out the intent of the law.

All Davis-Bacon does, then, is give another spin to the inflationary wheel. Mr. Carter would add to the credibility of his anti-inflation program by supporting repeal of the act by the

Abolish punctuation. Particularly the apostrophe. No difference

in it's and its. Apostrophe not useful. Verbs. Adverbs. Nouns. Ugh. Who cares anyhow? Zzz. Word meaning. Images. Ahh. That's better. Freedom for the writer! Ain't it beautiful? Words create images. People think

images. Or pictures. Not sentences. The apostles of this new discipline are Stanley Berne and Arlene Zekowaki, associate professors of English at Eastern New Mexico

"Arbitrary sentence structure is logical," Ms. Zekowski said. But the brain isn't logical. You don't think in sentences. You think in terms of patterns and images. It's random association." Grammer, she said, "is elitism. I wish to destroy what is dead.

"Grammar and spelling," Berne said, are "the property of a once privileged minority class imposing its order on a willing majority anxious to rise out of its own supposed ignorance an

"The arbitrary rules are the cause of the decline in interest in English," Berne said. "It has already caused a decline in literacy that is alarming. Teachers want to blame it on TV. But it isn't TV. It's grammar that's to blame.

"There is a declining verbal intelligence. We notice in our classes that young people don't speak what we call English. They don't articulate well.

"The language changes. We must recognize that and adapt to it.

Old English was a beautiful language. So was Middle English.

Just look at Beowulf and Chaucer. But people today can't unierstand it easily, if at all. The language has changed since then. It hasn't stopped changing. English teachers have to change We've got to gear up or go under."

# Jam Handy: Quite A Man At 93

Jam Handy is 93. He's also America's oldest living Olympic medal winner and he doesn't think that's such a big deal, either. Way back in 1904, two years before the San Francisco earthquake and eight years before the Titanic hit that iceberg, young third in the 440-yard breaststroke. "Well, as I said, I had no real athletic talent, so the only way I could win championships was by using my head. I got around the rules by taking advantage of what they hadn't covered. For example, when I was 14, no 16, I was trying to shave, I noticed there was no mouth on the top of my head and I knew the idea in swimming was to keep your head above water so you could breathe. (24-ounce) package frozen Shredded Hash

Brown Potatoes, thawed 1-3rd cup melted butter or margarine 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded hot pepper cheese

1 cup (4 ounces) shredded Swiss or Gouda cheese 1 cup (6 ounces) diced cooked ham 1/2 cup cream or milk

Grease 9-inch pie plate with solid shortening or butter. Press thawed hash browns between paper toweling to remove excess moisture. Fit hash browns into pie plate, cutting and trimming to make a solid crust. Brush hash brown crust with melted butter; be sure to brush top edges too. Bake at 425 degrees for 25 minutes.

Remove crust from oven and fill layers of cheese and ham. Beat cream with eggs and seasoned salt; pour over cheese and ham. Return to oven; reduce heat. Bake at 350 degrees F. until a knife inserted near edge comes out clean, about 30-40 minutes.
