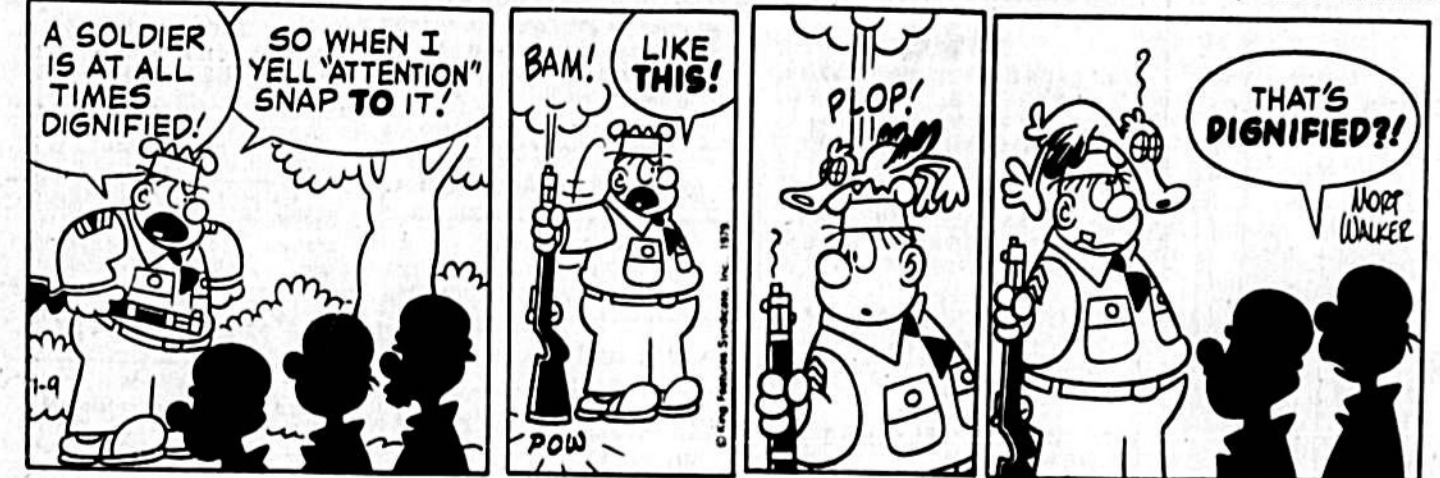
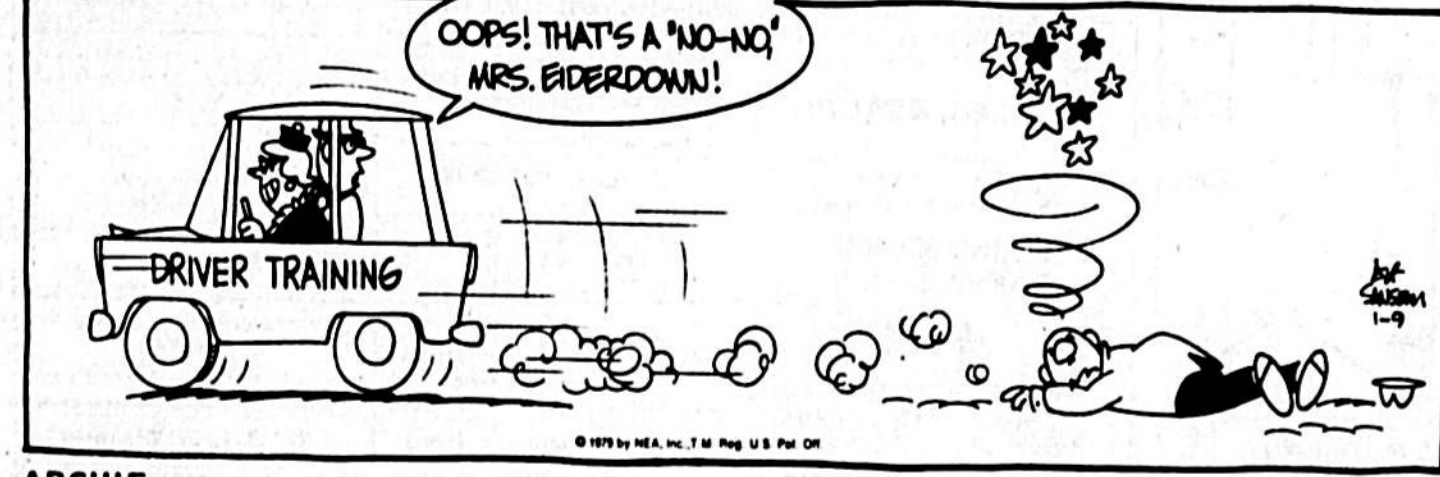

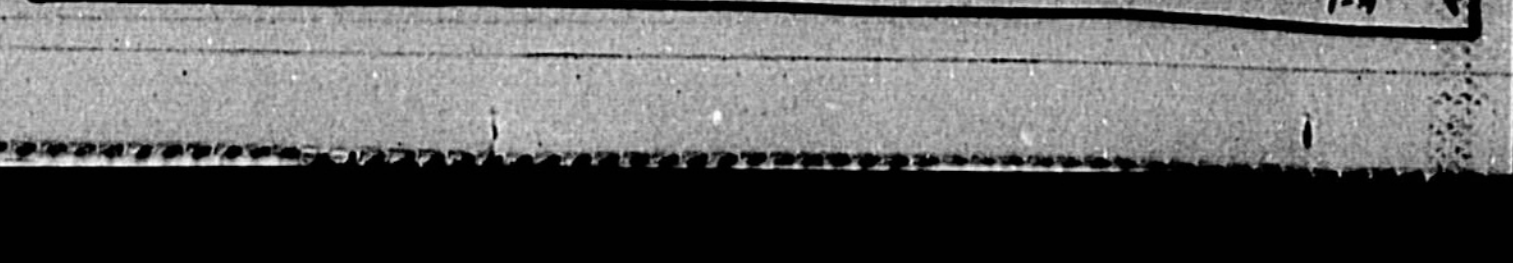

Each of the bridges would probably run about 225 feet long and would have two lanes each making the overpass a four-lane facility.

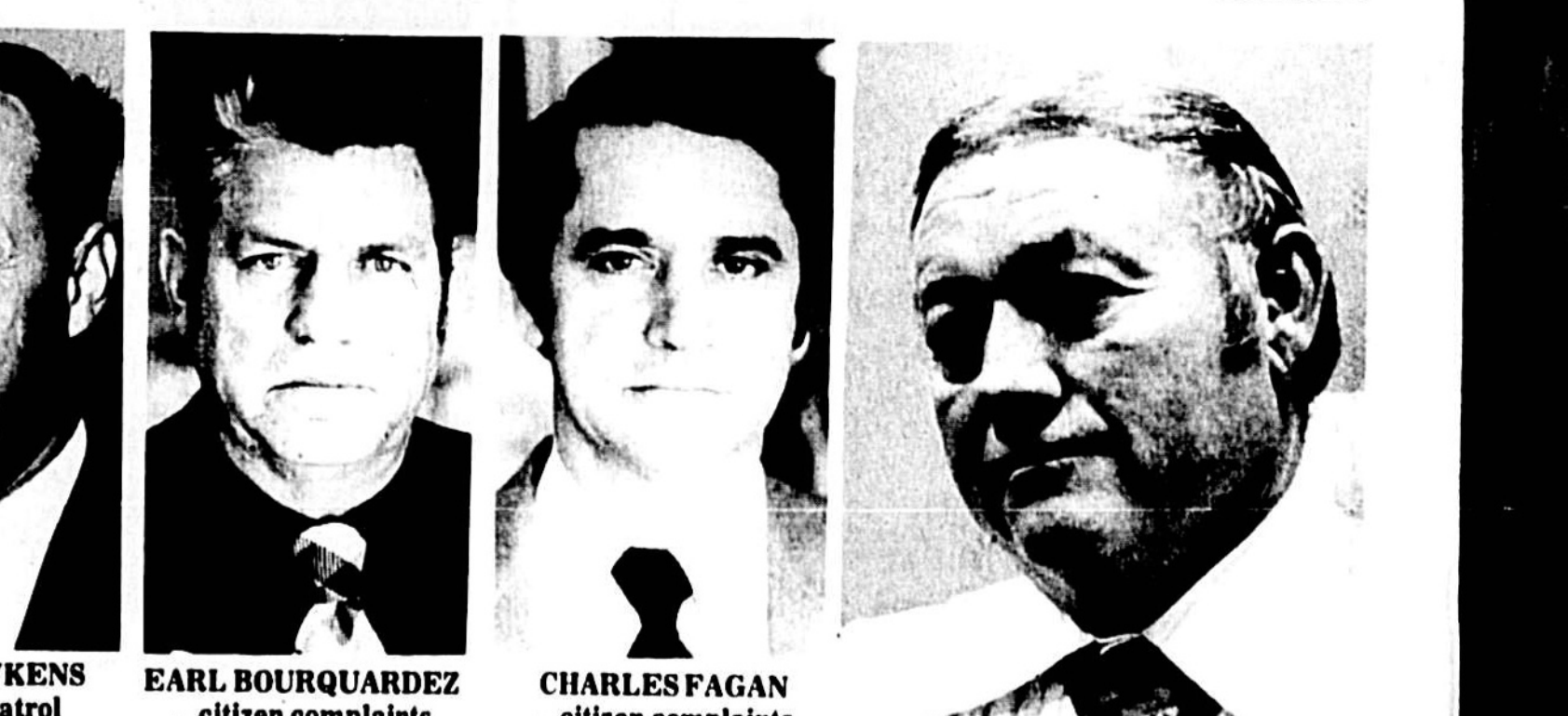

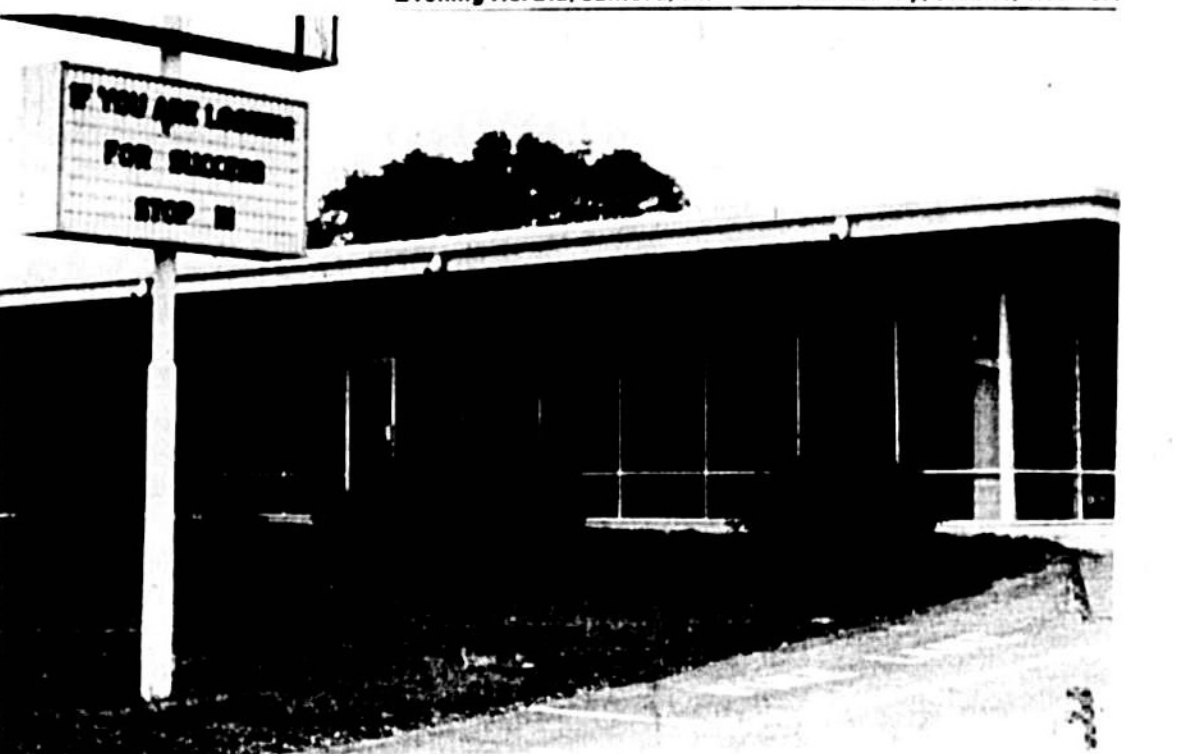

Pair Wants 'Grammarless Language'

'Did God Give Grammar To Moses?'

Sentences. Grammar. No longer practical. Old habits. Abolish them.

If two English teachers at Eastern New Mexico University get their way, American students soon will be taught to write much like that — no rules, no sentence structure.

Johnny can't read. Why? Because Johnny won't read. Don't change Johnny. Then what? Change grammar. Better yet. Abolish rules.

Abolish punctuation. Particularly the apostrophe. No difference in it's and its. Apostrophe not useful. Verbs. Adverbs. Nouns. Ugh. Who cares anyhow? Zzz.

Word meaning. Images. Ahh. That's better. Freedom for the writer! Ain't it beautiful? Words create images. People think images. Or pictures. Not sentences.

The sponsors of this new discipline are Stanley Berne and Arlene Zekowski, associate professors of English at Eastern New Mexico University. Between them they have published 15 volumes of novels, short stories, poetry, plays and criticism.

They want a new "grammarless language." They say the 300 or so rules governing English grammar are arbitrary and are so complicated they drive students away from literature, both reading and writing.

Abolish the rules. Then Johnny will read. And write. They say.

They want grammar abolished and they're going on educational television with a series to demonstrate the need for the change. KENW-TV, Portales, N.M., an affiliate of PBS, will produce and distribute the series to educational television stations.

In an interview in New York, the professors discussed their proposals and their latest books on the subject, Ms. Zekowski's "Image Breaking Images" and Berne's "Future Language."

"Who needs grammar?" Berne asked. "Did God give grammar to Moses on the mountain?"

"It's the whole cancerous structure of the English language," Ms. Zekowski said.

But what about the grammatical language?

"It's already been adopted," Berne said. "We're professors of English. We're concerned with the idea of expressing feelings. Arbitrary rules of grammar prohibit that. If English teachers don't realize it and begin teaching that way, they're going to lose touch with the reality of the language. They're already in danger of losing touch."

"Arbitrary sentence structure is logical," Ms. Zekowski said. "But the brain isn't logical. You don't think in sentences. You think in terms of patterns and images. It's random association."

Grammar, she said, "is elitism. I wish to destroy what is dead, lifeless and snobbish."

"Grammar and spelling," Berne said, are "the property of a once privileged minority class imposing its order on a willing majority anxious to rise out of its own supposed ignorance and vulgarity."

"The arbitrary rules are the cause of the decline in interest in English," Berne said. "It has already caused a decline in literacy that is alarming. Teachers want to blame it on TV. But it isn't TV. It's a grammar that's to blame."

"There is a declining verbal intelligence. We notice in our classes that young people don't speak what we call English. They don't articulate well."

"The language changes. We must recognize that and adapt to it. Old English was a beautiful language. So was Middle English. Just look at Beowulf and Chaucer. But people today can't understand it easily, if at all. The language has changed since then. It hasn't stopped changing. English teachers here to change. They don't articulate well."

"Look in any newspaper or magazine," said Ms. Zekowski. "Look at the advertisements. They must communicate to sell. Many advertisements don't use sentences or grammar. They use words to create images. And they are successful."

"Do you believe in progress?" Ms. Zekowski asks herself in her latest book. Then she answers: "Once upon a time ago. But now nevermore."

You know? Mind-boggling? Exactly!

The two authors want to merge poetry with prose, using words to create images. They aren't the first to do it. Lewis Carroll, for example, wrote in the mid-1800s:

"Twas brillig, and the slithy toves
Did gyre and gimble in the wabe;
All mimsy were the borogoves
And the mome raths outgrabe."

Ahh, but alas. You know, even then words is a sentence. Y'know what I mean?

Extra \$\$\$ Earmarked To Spur 3 Rs In Florida Schools

TALLAHASSEE. (UPI) — Striving to do a better job of teaching students the "three R's", the governor and cabinet have approved a public school budget that puts priority on improving instruction in kindergarten through third grade.

The proposal asks the Legislature to earmark \$73.6 million to upgrade teaching at this level — as part of a total \$184 million injection of funds to improve the quality of instruction throughout the public school system.

The officials also provided extra funds to improve community colleges and universities in an overall \$4.5 billion two-year education budget.

It would give public schools more than Education Commissioner Ralph Turlington asked and universities \$114 million less than recommended by the Board of Regents.

However, the total figure, which represents a total two-year increase of \$31.8 million or 23.7 percent over educational spending in the current biennium, is far from final.

Gov. Bob Graham said he is not promising to pass it to the Legislature intact, and Chancellor E. T. York said he'll try to talk the Legislature into restoring the \$114 million cut from the Regents budget.

Graham is committed to spending extra dollars in the lower grades to better prepare students in the fundamentals of reading, writing and arithmetic.

He said he opposes taking the additional money from a half-billion dollar revenue surplus because "this is going to be an ongoing program that should not be funded by a one-time surplus."

Before the final vote, Turlington agreed to increasing his original recommendation for the university system by \$11 million and for community colleges by \$5.7 million.

He said he was glad to have the additional \$36.8 million for public schools.

Treasurer Bill Gunter said starting children out right would reduce the need to spend vast sums of money for remedial education after they reach high school.

The total two-year asking budget for public schools, amounting to \$3,061 billion, is an increase of \$341.8 million or 26.58 over 1978-79.

80 spending. The proposed community colleges budget, \$484.7 million, is up \$67.2 million or 34.9 percent.

The university system budget, totaling \$962.8 million, represents an increase of 29.5 percent.

The rest of the recommended appropriation would go to fund the Department of Education, Deaf and Blind School, teacher testing and other special accountability programs mandated by the last Legislature.

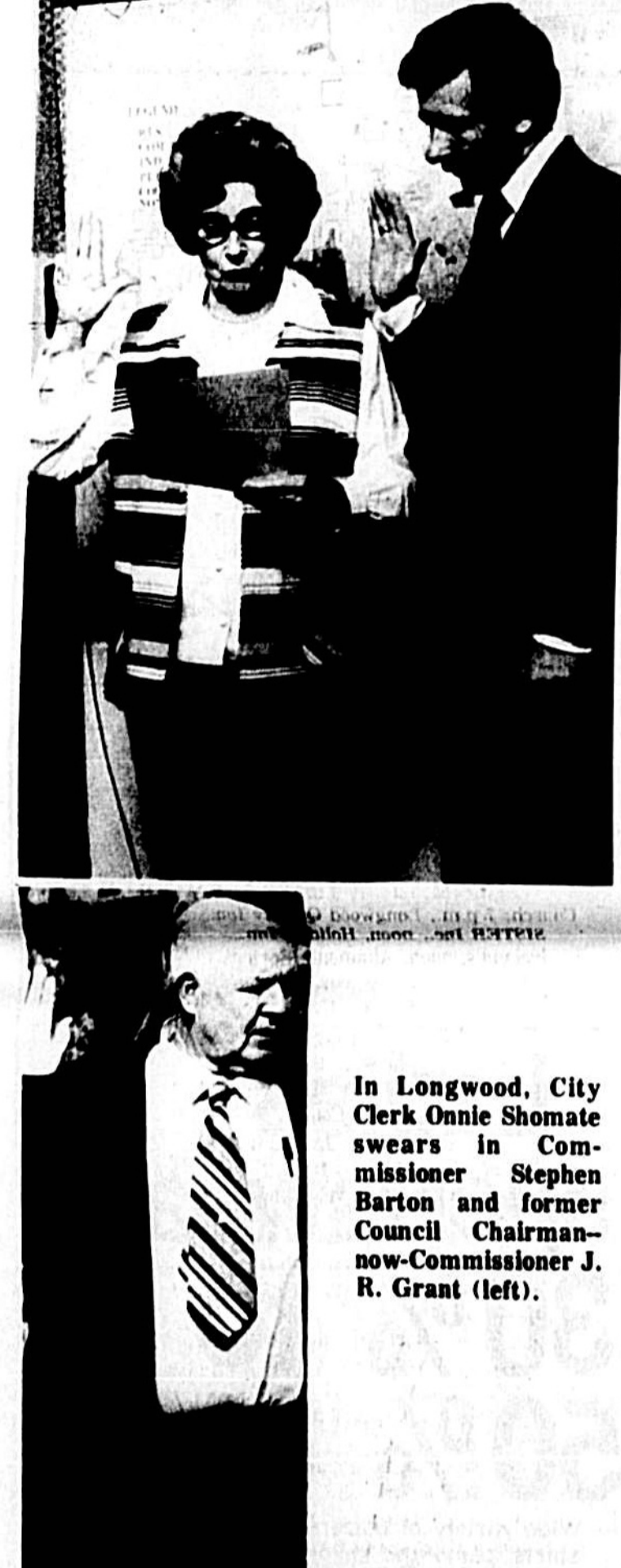

Shops Win Round In Sanford Panel

The Sanford City Commission has approved an amendment to the current permitted uses under RMOI (residential, multi-family, office and institutional) zoning to include shops that would be operated within structures now zoned RMOI.

RMOI permits facilities such as hospitals, and residential structures like Bram Towers. This move allows shops to operate within such structures.

In other action, the commission authorized Mayor Lee P. Moore to sign a contract with Nymad Construction Co., Orlando, for sewer repair work not to exceed \$44,000.

The repairs would consist of fixing pipes cracked during evaluation of the city's sewer system. The evaluation is a check of the sewer system for damage over the years.

The program will be held each Tuesday for eight weeks beginning at 9:30 a.m. and last 30 minutes each, according to Sandra Gallagher, librarian.

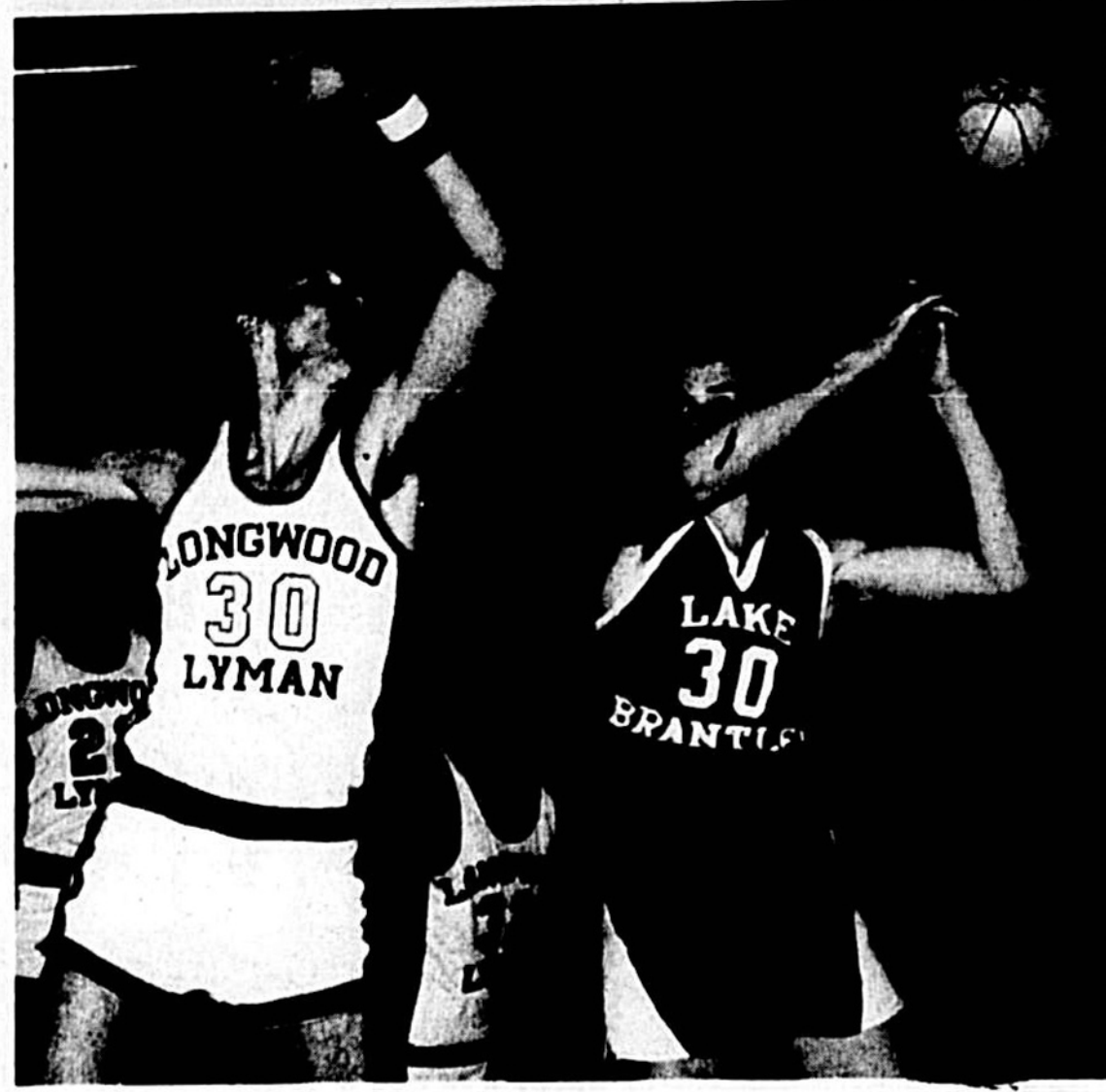
Mrs. Gallagher said the activity will include story-telling and games for the kids overseen by library personnel.

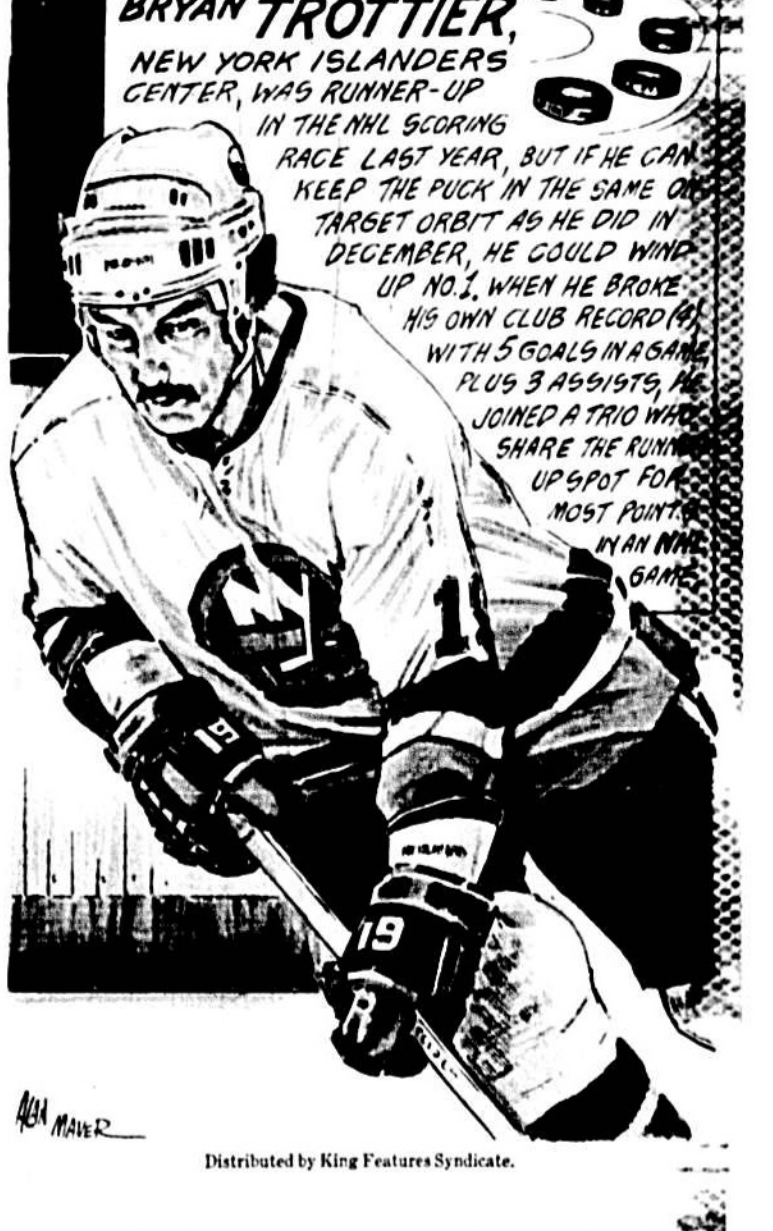

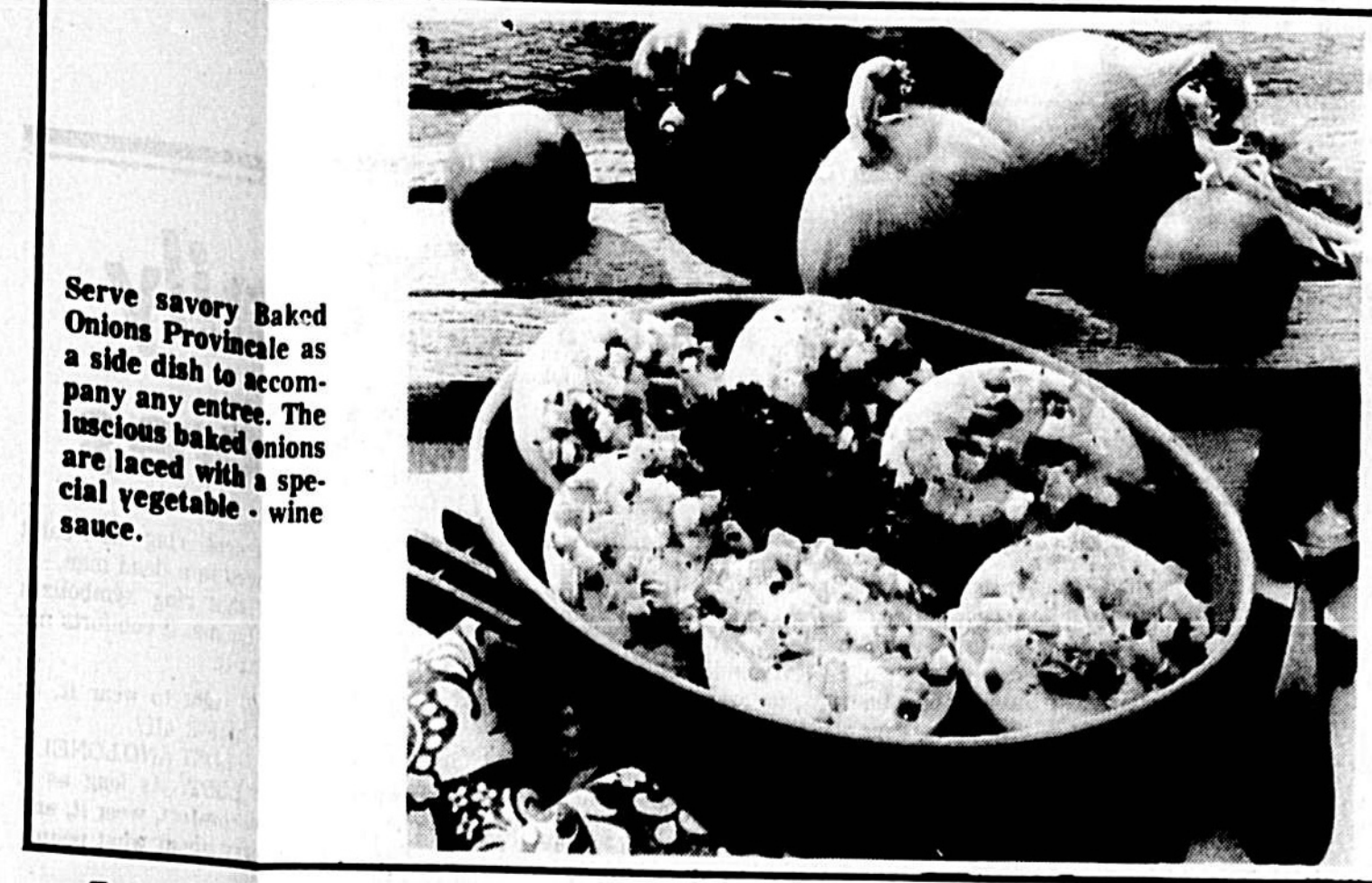

 3 med. Sweet Spanish onions
 3 tablespoons olive oil
 1 clove garlic, minced
 1 cup chopped green pepper

Place, cut sides up, in a shallow baking dish. Sauté garlic, green pepper, tomatoes and celery in oil for 5 or 6 minutes. Stir in wine, salt, pepper and basil. Pour over onions.

Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes, or until onions are tender, basting occasionally with liquid from baking dish. Makes 6 servings.

Microwave method: Peel and halve onions. Arrange in a flat microwave-proof casserole, cut sides up. Place oil, garlic, green pepper, tomatoes and celery in a microwave-proof dish. Cover and microwave on high for 3 to 4 minutes, stirring once.

Stir in wine, salt, pepper and basil. Spoon over onions. Cover and microwave on high for 14 to 16 minutes or until onions are tender. Give dish one-quarter turn every 3 minutes. To serve, spoon juices over onions.

Celery Adds Pizzaz To Almost Any Dish

Tender sweet Pascal celery... Now through March is the time to take advantage of this crunchy vegetable that is grown principally on the mucklands of the Everglades with lesser amounts grown around the sandlands of Sanford.

A small portion is also grown in the Sarasota area. During the 1977-78 season, celery farmers in Florida planted 11,200 acres of celery, most of which went to markets east of the Mississippi and north to Canada.

Crunchy celery has been around for centuries. Chinese used it as a blood purifier. The Greeks used it for its sedative effects. Today celery seed oil is still used in sedatives. Diet-conscious Americans include a lot of this crisp, low-calorie, vegetable in their meals - 1 stalk has only five calories! Studies have shown that celery also is useful in stopping hunger pangs during weight reduction.

Bring to a boil then simmer until celery is tender-crisp, about 10 minutes. Add cream soup and milk blending well. For a thinner soup, add more milk. Heat thoroughly and serve. Makes 4 servings.

SOUTHERN CELERY AND TURKEY CREAM SOUP
 1/2 cup butter
 2 cups celery, thinly sliced
 1/4 cup onion, coarsely chopped
 2 1/2 cups flour
 2 1/2 cups milk
 1/4 cup light cream
 10 1/2 oz. can condensed chicken broth
 2 1/2 cups cooked turkey of chicken, diced
 3/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
 1/2 cup pimiento, drained and chopped
 In a large saucepan, melt butter. Add celery and onion; saute 5 to 6 minutes or until celery is tender. Blend in flour. Gradually stir in milk, light cream, and broth. On a lightly greased and floured cookie sheet, shape meringue into 3-inch round shells, building up sides of shell to form a center about 1/4 inch deep. Bake in 275 degree F. oven 1 hour. Cool on wire rack. When thoroughly cool, remove shells from the cookie sheet with a spatula. Store in air tight container until ready to use.

Grease 9-inch pie plate with solid shortening or butter. Press thawed hash browns between paper toweling to remove excess moisture. Fit hash browns into pie plate, cutting and trimming to make a solid crust. Brush hash brown crust with melted butter; be sure to brush top edges too. Bake at 425 degrees for 25 minutes.

HERB FRIED HOME FRIES
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup chopped onions
1/2 teaspoon dried leaf oregano, crumbled
1/2 teaspoon dried leaf savory
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon ground pepper
4 Idaho potatoes, peeled, sliced 1/4-inch thick
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

4 Idaho potatoes, peeled, sliced 1/4-inch thick

In plastic bag, combine seasoned coating mix, cheese and parsley. In large skillet, melt butter; toss potatoes in butter to coat. Drop potatoes, a few at a time, into plastic bag; shake to coat. Place slices on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake in 375 degree F. oven, 30 minutes, until tender. Yield: 4 to 6 servings.

1-1/3 cups milk
1 cup water
1-3/4 cup honey
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1 tablespoon salt
5/8 to 6 cups all-purpose flour
3 pkg. active dry yeast

Frost combined milk, water, honey, butter and salt in 1-qt. saucepan over medium heat just until warm (about 120 F.); stirring occasionally. Add milk mixture to combined 2 cups flour and yeast in large mixing bowl; beat at medium speed on electric mixer about 2 minutes or until smooth. Add corn meal; continue beating about 1 minute. Stir in enough remaining flour to make a stiff dough. Knead on lightly floured surface 8 to 10 minutes or until smooth and elastic. Shape to form ball. Place in greased large bowl, turning once to coat surface of dough. Cover; let rise in warm place about 1 1/2 hours or until double in size. Punch down dough. Cover; let rest 10 minutes. Divide dough in half; roll out each half to form 18x12-inch rectangle. Roll up starting with narrow end; press together ends and seam to seal. Place in 2 greased hot inch loaf pans; brush with vegetable oil. Let rise in warm place about 1 hour or until nearly double in size. Bake in preheated hot oven (400 F.) 35 to 40 minutes. Remove from pans; brush with oil. Cool completely on wire rack. Makes 1 loaf.

CORN MEAL BATTER BREAD
1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons enriched corn meal
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup water
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup vegetable oil
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cups all-purpose flour
3/4 pkg. active dry yeast
1 egg

Generously grease 1 1/4 qt. round casserole dish; coat evenly with 2 tablespoons corn meal. Heat combined milk, water, sugar, oil and salt in 1-qt. saucepan over medium heat just until warm (about 120 F.); stirring occasionally. Add milk mixture to combined 1 cup flour and yeast in large mixing bowl; beat at medium speed on electric mixer about 2 minutes or until smooth. Stand in egg; stir in remaining corn meal and flour to make a stiff dough. Cover; let rise in warm place about 1 hour or until double in size. Bake in preheated moderate oven (350 F.) 30 minutes. Cover loosely with aluminum foil to prevent over-browning. Remove from oven; brush with melted butter; cool on wire rack. Immediately remove brown crust; remove foil. Cool completely on wire rack. Makes 1 round loaf. Variation: Add 1/4 to 1 teaspoon oil seed to batter.
