Ridiculous! And yet, almost any man will concede that the gal who picked him out as the object of her affection certainly knew what she was doing. So . . .

## Price Of Compassion

In the United States, too many bystanders are looking on with enthusiastic anathy and rich, warm indifference as thugs and gunmen rob and beat up old ladies, young girls and anyone else they choose to rob or beat up.

In England, a suggestion by Scotland Yard that the man in the street "have a go" at marauding criminals has evoked so vigorous a compliance that a 12-year-old schoolgirl and her sister helped break up a recent bank robbery attempt.

Somewhere in between these two extremes in public attitude is the sane, sensible, satisfactory behavior most of us would like to see.

No one wants schoolgirls or schoolboys to give battle to armed thugs, or even unarmed thugs. But neither is anyone pleased or proud to see witnesses to criminal acts or violence react with a shrug.

In simple fairness and realism. however, it should be pointed out that a courageous and compassionate onlooker who does rush to the aid of a victim of criminal brutality is in many instances begging for trouble. Too often, the Good Samaritan is threatened by phone, letter or even by personal visit.

Even if he isn't, he spends hours of his time attending court hearings. only to see the accused thug get one continuance after another through all sorts of flimsy excuses and legal shenanigans until the volunteer Samaritan has had it up to here.

If we are to get citizen behavior compatible with the standards we expect and desire in this country, we must arrange for Good Samaritans to have the protection and consideration they deserve.

Otherwise, we will continue to see many people put practically ahead of compassion and valor and take a walk when their instincts urge them to go to the rescue.






