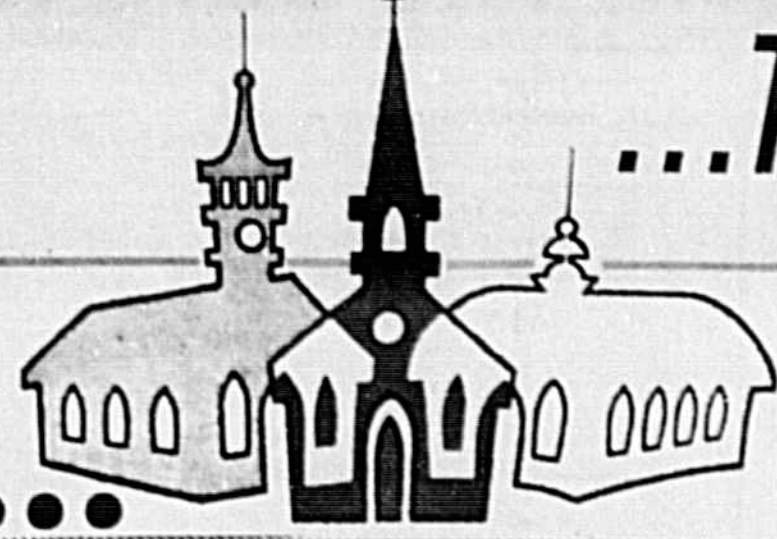

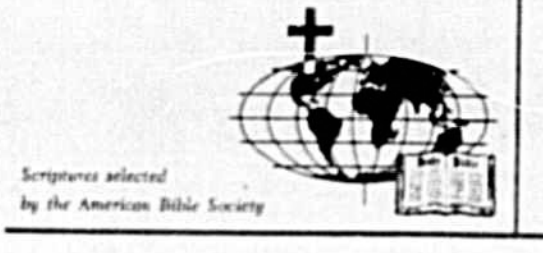


When an aviator encounters a storm, he directs his plane through the clouds and goes higher. In that clear, rare atmosphere he is free from fear and difficulty.

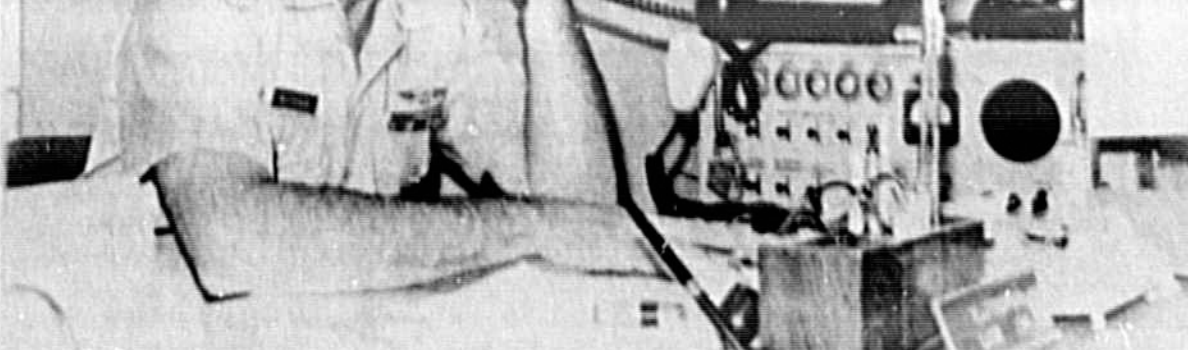

Father's Death Accelerated Rape Victim Tells Own Story

"To be held at knife point, have a hand with a glove on it covered your mouth, have your clothes taken off, your face covered by your clothes and then raped is a horrible experience. Not to mention what during the operation she had and went into her head. She is not acting right," she said.

The couple displayed by this girl, who we call Ellen, is unusual. National statistics, made available by the Federal Bureau of Investigation shows that only 10 out of every 200 rapes are reported to the authorities. Of these 10, only three are prosecuted, and in Seminole County, with an excellent record of convictions of rapists shown by the State Attorney's office, 24 of the three are convicted and sent to prison.

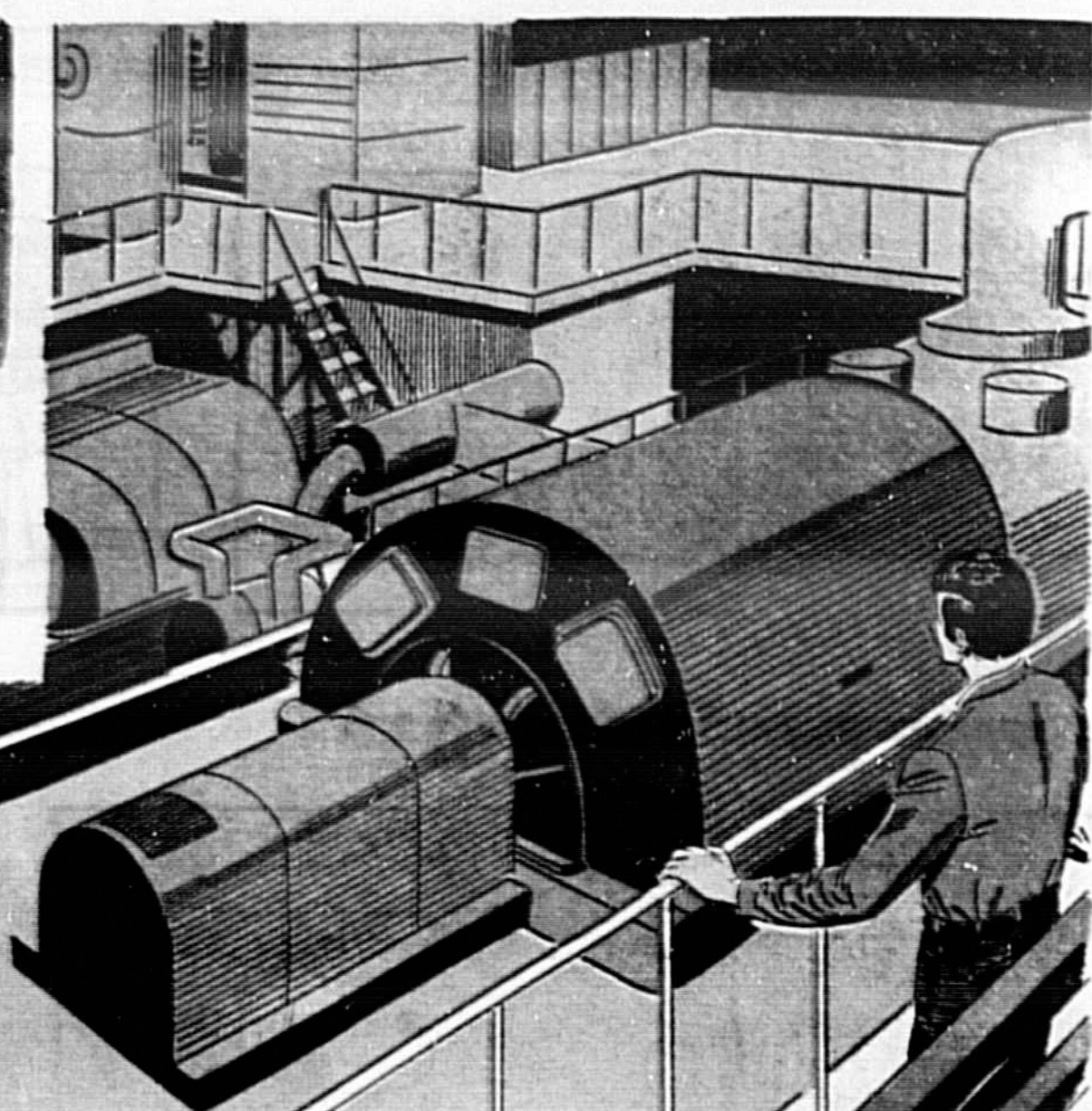
