BLEASE LEADS J. F. BYRNES IN RUN OFF RACE

Former Governor South Carolina Ahead; Representative Byrnes in Tuesday's Election; Is Hotly Contested

Elections Held In States Hold Interest Gillett Leading in Massachusetts While Cousins Trails in Michigan Senate Contest

COLUMBIA, Sept. 10.—With only 43 boxes missing out of 1,364, Cole L. Blease, former governor, retained a lead of 2,000 votes over Rep. James Byrnes for Democratic nomination of United States senator from South Carolina in yesterday's run-off primary.

COLUMBIA, S. C., Sept. 10.—With 83 of the 1,364 precincts in South Carolina accounted for in the second Democratic primary held Tuesday, former Gov. Cole L. Blease was leading Representative James F. Byrnes by 1,550 votes for the nomination for the United States senate. The vote, with 1,261 precincts reported, was: Blease, 96,297; Byrnes, 94,747. These returns included all the 46 counties, many complete. The closeness of the contest for the nomination, equivalent in South Carolina to the official count by the executive committee of the state Democratic organization, is Second Primary.

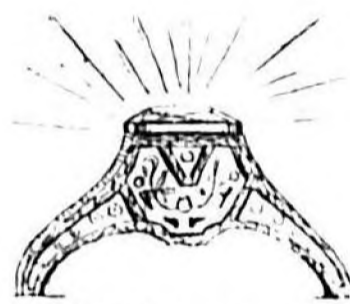

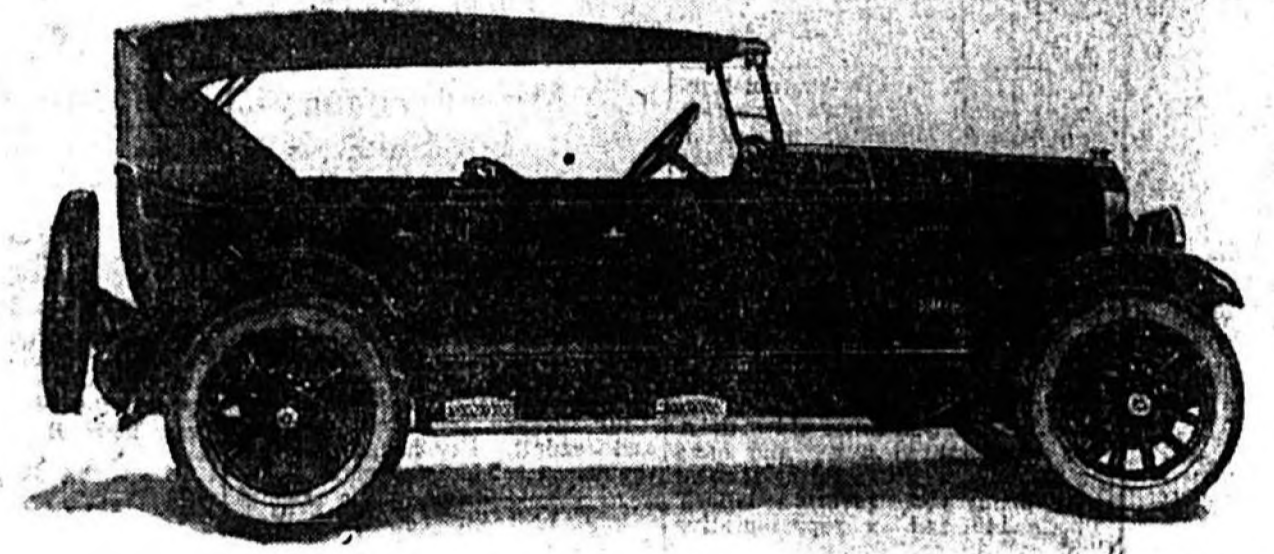
