



## Allied Heads May Name New Commanders

General Eisenhower Is Mentioned As Leader For New European Offensive This Fall

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13. (AP)—The prospect of new Allied offensives in northern Europe and southern Asia in the next few weeks apparently poses for President Roosevelt and Winston Churchill the problem of selecting some new commanders at the Quebec conferences.

Most important is that of the commander-in-chief of the European theater because of its direct bearing on the drive for final victory in Europe.

Next is the commander of the forces which, probably this fall—

will have the task of reconquering Burma from the Japanese.

Possible European commanders are: Gen. Dwight Eisenhower, Gen. Sir Harold Alexander, Eisenhower's deputy; Gen. Sir Bertrand Spender, chief of British forces in Africa and Sicily; Lieut. Gen. Joseph Stillwell has been mentioned to head the Burma campaign.

OTTAWA, Aug. 13. (AP)—British prime minister temporarily shifted his base of operations away from Quebec yesterday, while British, Canadian and an advance guard of American military men continued a review here of the master war strategy of the Allies.

Prime Minister Churchill and President Roosevelt will meet in Quebec later on for concentrated war discussions and a meeting of the British-American chiefs of staff.

## U. S. Is Seen As Leader In Foreign Trade

### ShipBuilding Program Plus Airplane Superiority Aids Post-War Trade Planning

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13. (AP)—Rear Admiral Howard L. Vickery last night pictured a post-war America as queen of the foreign trade routes through a gigantic shipbuilding program complicated by United States controlled aluminum.

The soft spoken vice chairman of the United States Maritime Commission, who also is chairman of the commission's post-war planning committee, outlined peacetime shipping and ship construction programs designed to place this country into the front rank of world commerce.

Asserting the post-war planning of the Maritime Commission is not just an overnight development and visionary effort, Vickery emphasized.

Lawton, director of a modernized system of the County Board of Public Instruction. Teachers will be on hand at the schools, Thursday and Friday, Sept. 2 and 3, in order to enroll new children and answer questions, Mr. Lawton said.

The annual school report for the fiscal year July 1, 1942 through June 30, 1943, was made at the meeting and the school budget for 1943-44 adopted.

An increase of 14 mills levy for the general school fund has been necessitated in order to increase salaries of teachers, drivers and school janitors, which amounts were brought to public attention at a meeting held July 24, which was attended by citizens and school officials. Mr. Lawton stated.

## Social Security Rolls Continue To Grow

More than 95000 workers in the seven counties served by the Orlando office of the Social Security Board have social security accounts, and are accumulating wage credits which count toward old-age and survivors insurance benefits. For the country as a whole some 45,000,000 employees earned wages and salaries last year in jobs covered by the system. Total payroll taxes \$1,100 a year of retired workers, 100,000 workers, 291,000 young children and 8,500 aged parents of deceased workers. More than \$12,100,000 went out in monthly payments of benefits to families and individuals whose wage earner and dependents have died. The size depends on the earnings of the insured worker from jobs covered by the system.

The figures alone barely suggest what the social security payments mean to American people in added security, contentment and well-being. Family With Four Wage Earners Instead of One, Figure It Out Themselves









## Visit Is Made By Churchill To Hyde Park

### President And Prime Minister Confer 3 Days Preparatory To Quebec Meeting

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16. (AP)—President Roosevelt returned to Washington today after a conference with Prime Minister Churchill and the White House said he would join the war conferences in Quebec "this week."

QUEBEC, Aug. 16. (AP)—Prime Minister Churchill was back in Quebec today after a three-day visit with President Roosevelt at Hyde Park and the American Chief Executive is expected here shortly for the opening of their war strategy conference.

Allied military strategy for Europe presumably occupies the top spot among all matters the Allied leaders must examine. Other points apparently slated for consideration include the conduct of the war in the Pacific and immediate and long range political problems.

President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill conferred for three days at the President's Hyde Park, N.Y., home.

The two Allied leaders issued a joint statement Saturday on results of the anti-submarine campaign against the Axis during the past month.

Mr. Roosevelt, in his statement, simply "reassured" Churchill "that they had met in advance of their scheduled major talks with Allied staff chiefs in Quebec this week."

No Hint Given

No hint was given as to the nature of the Roosevelt-Churchill talks, but it was believed doubtful that it was much time to discuss military or political matters at this early stage. Their "informal discussions were nevertheless of international significance."

The prime minister of Great Britain, with his daughter, has been visiting the President and Mrs. Roosevelt at Hyde Park for three days and has now returned to Quebec," the announcement said.

"The President is returning to Washington but he will join the Conference of the British Commonwealth of Nations, which is to be held in Canada this week."

President Churchill's daughter, Mary, a subaltern in the British army women's auxiliary, heightened the likelihood that the visit was primarily social. Nothing was said of the whereabouts of Mrs. Churchill, who also accompanied the prime minister to Canada.

Information Sought On Game Resources
