## Housewife Fighting Water Fluoridation

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — Oviedo voters in September said "yes" to a straw ballot question of whether that city's water supply should be fluoridated.

Cassellberry voters are being asked on the December city election ballot whether they approve fluoridation of their city water.

The city of Sanford has fluoridated its water supply for nearly nine years.

But the question of whether Altamonte Springs' water supply should be fluoridated is a prescription drug with side effects, Mrs. Berendzen added that while 1.5 parts of fluoride per million parts of water is the usual safe level, it is impossible to determine how much anyone is exposed to since it will depend on the amount of water he drinks. She said persons are already receiving fluoride through some canned foods processed with treated water.

Mayor Norman Floyd answered that the city has made no decision on whether to treat the city's water with the chemical, but that the treatment has received the wholehearted endorsement and is promoted by the Orange County Dental Society.

He also said that 80,000 pounds of fluoride would have to be added per million gallons of water before the dosage level would be lethal.

## The Inflation Fighter

Food prices won't go down just because we don't like them. So concentrate instead on checking labels to get the most value for your money.

Unit pricing can be a big help: In addition to the cost of the item, supermarket shelf labels should tell you the price per ounce, pound or quart.

Then look at the item's label. Some manufacturers list the percentage of principal ingredients in the product. So if there's more sugar than wheat in the cereal you're buying, you will know it.

To defrost or not to defrost. If you're thinking of buying a large freezer to help out with the food budget, consider the pros and cons of the frost-free model before you do. Admittedly more convenient, this model uses about 50 per cent more power than the type you have to defrost yourself.

If you choose the latter model, remember to defrost it before the ice gets too thick — ¼ inch. Ice lessens the cooling power of the coils. Defrosting more frequently will also lessen the chance of spoiled food from long defrosting periods.

## School Board Orders Mid-Year Pupil Switch

Wishing a tornado strike Woodlands school was the only way one parent saw any relief from the decision of the Seminole County School Board Wednesday night to transfer students now in the Longwood Elementary School to the Woodlands building by Jan. 22.

"I hope a tornado strikes the Woodlands School," said Jim Lewis, representing parents

recommending against the move and granted.

Because Woodlands School relocation and renovation was not completed on schedule for the opening of school in September, the students scheduled to attend there were placed in other schools. Most of the students were grouped together, with a teacher who will accompany them to Woodlands when the transfer is made. There have been no parental objections to this plan.

## Schools Support Projects

Outgoing Seminole County Commissioner Greg Drummond received the support of the Seminole County School Board Wednesday evening in his effort to construct a "living memorial" to military veterans.

He sought the board's support because the children suffer a need "to instill the value of patriotism, and recognize their heritage, and better appreciate their country" besides the fact the school children will financially support the project.

Drummond explained there is no war memorial in a central part of the county, and none including those men who served during the Vietnam war.

He reminded the board of a project in which the school children saved the U.S. Constitution another landmark of America's heritage by donating pennies. He explained the children's share of the project would finance the actual memorial with donations not to exceed 30 cents.

The memorial will not be the slab of granite or marble usually erected for this purpose. Instead, Drummond said, the monument, not to war, but to the men who sacrificed to save our heritage, would be a contemporary concrete design, a "living memorial." It would serve as a playground for children, being located in a county park and next to a little League baseball field on SR 419.

## Court Continues Electricity

ORLANDO — Orange County Circuit Court Judge Frederick Pfeiffer today issued a temporary injunction against the Florida Power Corp., ordering that service not be cut off to any of the firm's 600,000 customers for failure to pay fuel adjustment charges as long as regular bills are paid.

The order was sought by a group of attorneys including J. Cheney Mason, Leon Cheek and Robert Melton and Associates on behalf of Mrs. Agnes K. Ward of Winter Park and all customers of the utility company.

Further arguments in the case will be heard Nov. 4.

Last week, Mason through his attorney, and law partner, Cheek, obtained a temporary restraining order from Seminole Circuit Court Judge Richard Muldrew concerning his personal bill for his Altamonte Springs home.

Mason said the next Seminole County hearing is scheduled for Oct. 31.

## Police Phase Out Follows Court?

The natural follow-up to the elimination of the municipal court system is the elimination of the city police departments, consolidating all law enforcement under the wings of the Seminole Sheriff's department locally.

This is Longwood attorney Gerald Korman's prediction of what is in store in the future throughout Florida.

An Altamonte Springs police captain sees the consolidation of law enforcement as a future happening, but not under the local sheriff.

Gunter said today that law enforcement officers are well aware that the question of police consolidation will be in the forefront in the near future.

He charged that consolidation of all police departments under the umbrella of the sheriff's department, however, is only the first step to creating a "police state."

The Florida Highway Patrol police already has been expanded to permit arrests on "things, Gunter said, and they

"When the people have to suffer the inconvenience of going to county court in Sanford for law violations in the South and cities, they will be up in arms," Gunter said.

"Someone is going to have to be courageous enough and willing to work hard enough to get Article 5 repealed," Gunter said.

Law enforcement budgets in Seminole County take a large part of the tax dollar. The people this year are paying \$4.3 million up from last year's \$3.35 million by city police departments and the sheriff's department.

Lion share of the \$4.3, some \$2 million goes to the sheriff's department. Police budgets approved and increases from last year's approved budgets are: Sanford \$882,975, up 17 per cent; Casselberry \$507,502, up 27 per cent; Altamonte Springs \$139,727, up 43 per cent; Longwood \$208,946, up 18 per cent; Winter Springs \$135,000, up 12 per cent; and Oviedo \$104,668, up 38 per cent.

The seven police departments and the sheriff's department will have a total of 305 full time employees, including 208 sworn personnel, authorized to make arrests.

The reason that will be broached for consolidation of police departments however, apparently will not be one claiming economy.

The argument will be, Korman said, that since the county judicial system will be formed, that every police officer in each county will be responsible for the same things. He noted that currently officers in the various cities have different training, different facilities, different requirements and different pay scales.

"Whether this will be for the better or worse," Korman could say.

Gunter, refuting Korman's contention about police training, said that currently all police officers in Florida must have 300 hours college training by law.

He added that when law enforcement is taken over completely by the state, the sheriff's department will be turned into a "paper service."

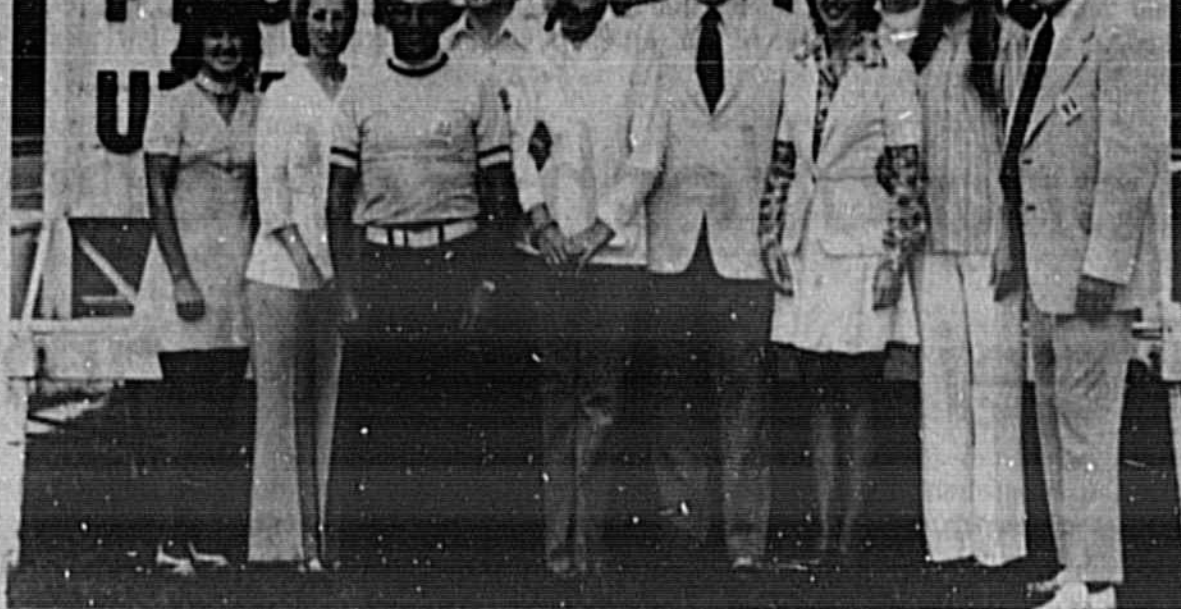

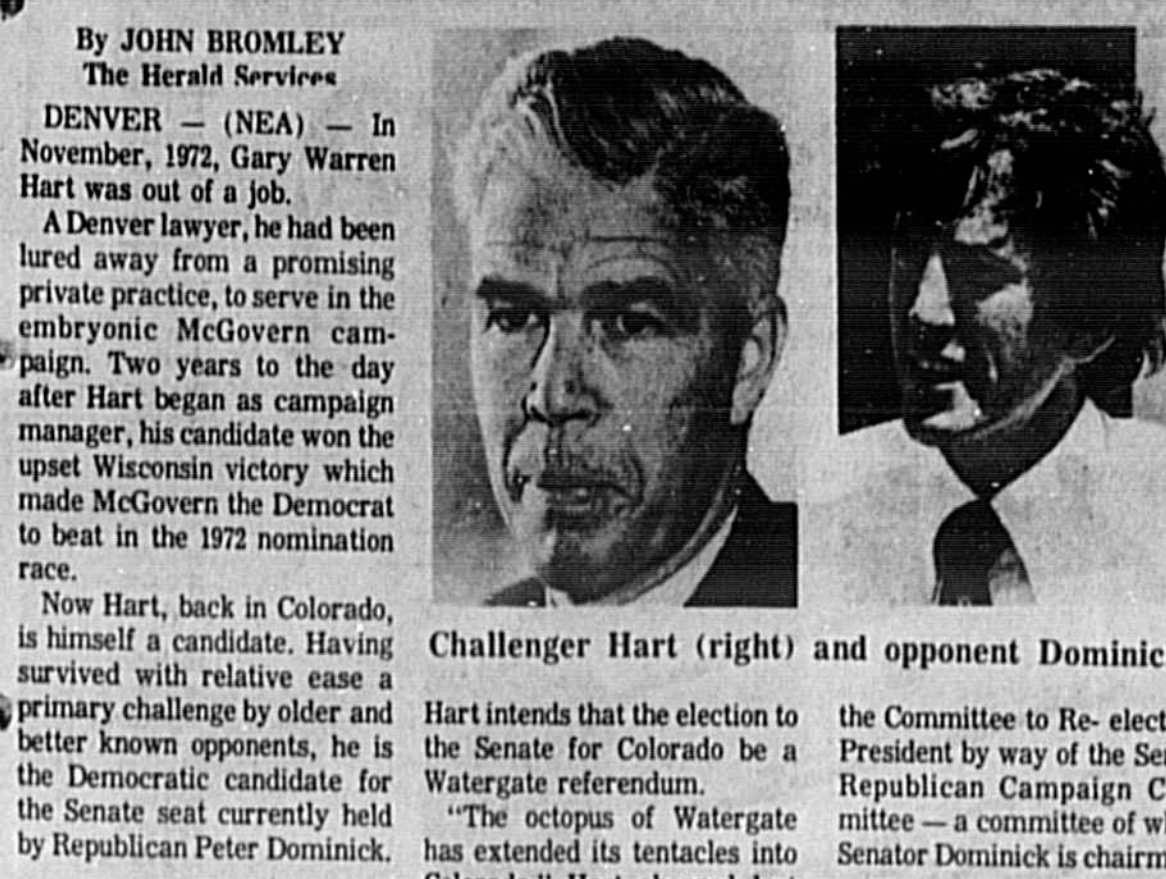

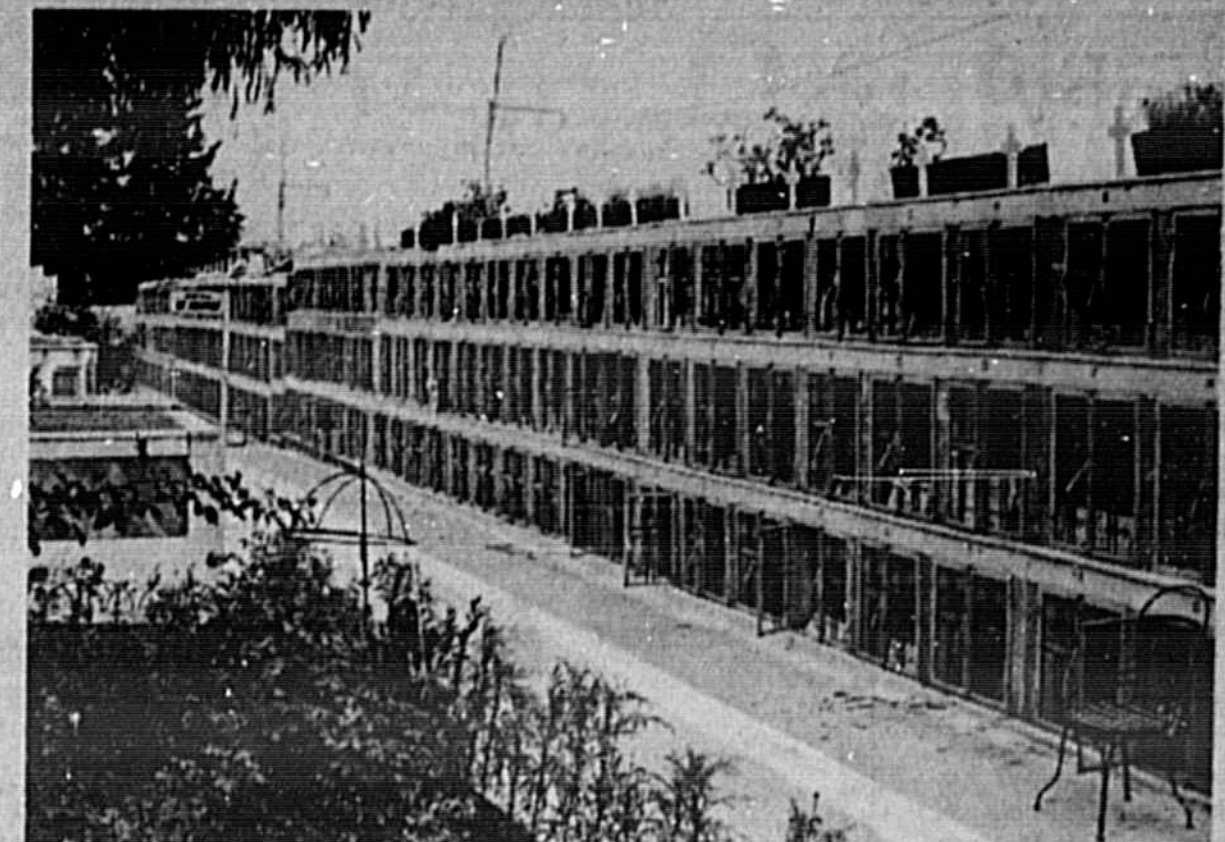

A decision by the Casselberry city council that would keep Arnold P. Smith from housing underprivileged children in his "crisis home" on Lake Triplett Drive may be overturned by a state ruling...
