

President Ford Attempting To Counter Reagan Victory

WEST BEND, Wis. (AP) - President Ford headed deep into dairy country Saturday as he stumped for Wisconsin farm votes in an all-out effort to put his Republican presidential campaign back on the winning road following Ronald Reagan's surprising victory in North Carolina. Ford has won five GOP primaries to Reagan's one, and Ford aides say they hope Wisconsin will provide the

Ford predicted victory in Tuesday's primary, telling campoign workers, "Wisconsin is a very important state. It will get our momentum going again, and have a tremendous impact on the states that follow."

Rep. Morris Udall, hoping for his first Democratic primary triumph, also is in Wisconsin. His chief opponents in Wisconsin, former Georgia Gov. Jimmy Carter and Washington Sen. Henry Jackson, spent Friday in upstate New York in search of votes in Tuesday's primary

Nixon Stories Denied

WASHINGTON (AF) - Richard Nixon's two sons-inlaw vehemently deny that they thought the former president was mentally unstable or would take his own life shortly before he resigned.

Edward Cox and David Eisenhower took issue with the way they and Nixon are portrayed in a new book on Nixon's last days as president by reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein, who won a Pulitzer Prize for the Washington Post with their reporting of the Watergate

In separate statements, both Cox and Eisenhower denied that they suggested Nixon might take his own life. Cox also denied saying in a telphone conversation that Nixon was giving speeches at night to presidential portraits on the White House walls.

NY Mayor Optimistic

WASHINGTON (AP) — New York City's financial health is being described optimistically by Mayor Abraham Beame, who says his city should be "selfsufficient" by 1978. But federal officials say they see several obstacles to such success.

Among the problems the city may face in the next several years are a restive labor force unhappy about frozen wages, and pending payment of \$1.9 billion in shortterm financial notes, says the U.S. comptroller general. The Senate Banking Committee ended two days of hearings on Friday after trying to determine whether New York has made progress since Congress approved a federal loan plan for the city last December.

Shots Plan Questioned

ATLANTA (P) - State public health officials and private physicians are split over President Ford's plan for nationwide immunization against a swinetype flu virus. Too much, say some; too little, say others.

About 300 public health officers and immunologists, heads of state medical associations and private physicians from all 50 states met here Friday at the National Center for Disease Control, which will coordinate the proposed vaccination program.

"I question the national scare tactics that have been used," said Dr. George Behnke of the Wisconsin Medical Society. "I think they (the government) have overreacted to this thing. I wonder how much politics is involved."

Court Battles Expected

NEW YORK (AP) - Court battles expected to last for years have begun now that the reorganization of six cankrupt Northeast railroads has been completed. Transportation properties of the lines were transferred this past week by the U.S. Railway Association to the

Consolidated Rail Corp., or Conrail, which was set up last

The assets were transferred to Conrail free and clear of all mortgages and liens. The Railway Association, a government agency, placed a "discounted net liquidation value" of \$685 million on the property.

Agency Probes Under Way

WASHINGTON (AP) - Three months into his new job as the Justice Department's house cop, Michael Shaheen says he's reviewing "80 or more matters" involving allegations of wrongdoing against department employes. A handful of those cases involve serious criminal allegations against high-level department officials. Shaheen said in an interview.

That's about all Shaheen will say about the pending investigations. He probably knows more and says less about the alleged misdeeds of his colleagues than anyone in the Justice Department.

South Gains Population

ATLANTA (AP) - The South had 51.4 per cent of the nation's population growth in the past five years and can expect the trend to continue into the 1980s, says E. Blaine Liner of Norman, Okla., the new executive director of the Southern Growth Policies Board. "If we are to avoid the other problems of other cities made in the print media and

and states," Liner said, "we have to know exactly what's happening on the economic scene and be able to respond in usable and practicable solutions by our member states and their local governments."

Teamsters Back On Road

ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, Ill. (AP)-Two-thirds of the nation's Teamsters truck drivers are due back on the roads under special contract settlements as negotiators hammer away at a new national master contract to end the union's first coast-to-coast strike.

"We are hopeful by Monday we could have all the trucks rolling," said Labor Secretary W.J. Usery Jr., who met with both sides into today's early morning hours.

IN BRIEF Miami Hotel Fire

Kills 7, Injures 13

MIAMI (AP) - Seven persons were killed and 13 others, some of them elderly residents forced to leap from the thirdfloor of an aging hotel, were injured early Saturday in what police said may been a deliberately set

Officials said they expected to find more bodies, since not all 32 residents of the hotel were accounted for. Witnesses reported hearing a whoosing sound just at the fire began, and one survivor reported hearing an explosion. Fireman said a man was taken into custody. Four hours after the fire erupted in the three-story Avondale Hotel, one severely burned woman was pulled alive from the flame-ravaged second floor.

Lebanon Needs Forceful Figure

getting his fingers burned in his attempt to provide both the armed strength and the political leadership to end the strife between Christians and Moslems in Lebanon. The breakdown of the Syriansponsored truce and the attempted coup by a Moslem military leader have revealed a factionalism within the Moslem camp which makes it difficult for Mr. Assad to piece together a new governmental structure that is likely to last.

Ever since Egypt's President Anwar Sadat adopted his less belligerent posture toward Israel, it has been presumed that Syria would become the source of leadership for maintaining unity among the more hawkish Arabs. Mr. Assad is not the first to discover that when there is not a direct call to arms against Israel, Arab groups are prone to be jealous of power and prestige within their own

The Lebanese civil war presented an opportunity for Syria to extend its influence into an Arab country which has been "soft" toward Israel during the episodes of war since 1948. The problem for Mr. Assad has been to play his cards in a way that does not provoke Israel, which could regard a Lebanon too heavily "Syrianized" as an intolerable

With Egypt no longer to be counted on to embattle Israel in the south, Syria would be courting a one-front war if its policy in Lebanon stirs a military response from Israel. Thus Mr. Assad faces the Lebanon crisis with a compelling need for restraint on his side, as well as a need to keep militant Palestinians in Lebanon from gaining positions on their own that would menace the Israelis. Mr. Assad is finding that the mantle of eadership in the Arab world may not fit comfortably — if indeed he is destined to wear it.

The "old" Lebanon is disappearing in the roar of cannons. President Suleiman Franjieh has clung to the hope that something could be salvaged of the power-sharing principle which gave the country a Christian-Moslem government for nearly a generation. What shape the new Lebanon will take is still hard to say, except that the government is bound to have a more Moslem cast. Its attitude toward other Arab states, toward the Palestinian cause, and toward Israel are the issues which will be significant for the future of the Middle East.

As of now, however, the question is whether Lebanon can be made governable at all without a forceful figure commanding the respect of the splintered Christian and Moslem armies now wreaking havoc on the country. If Mr. Assad's diplomacy cannot turn the trick, even bloodier days may lie ahead.

It is painfully sad that the United Nations Security Council, while Lebanon burns, is diverting itself with the Palestine Liberation Organization's obviously exaggerated charges that Israel is using "Hitlerite" tactics against Arabs in occupied Jordan. What is the U.N. really concerned aboutpeace in the Middle East, or embarrassing Israel?

A Wise Move

District of Columbia should have has been a persistent and nagging issue for more than a decade, indeed perhaps as far back as when the nation was born. Our Founding fathers considered Washington a city of all the people. They gave Congress the right to oversee its affairs, but did not spell out the exact political rights of the District's residents.

In 1964, the 23rd Amendment gave citizens of the district the right to vote for president and vice president. And in 1973 the District acquired partial home rule.

But the passions of Washingtonians for full voting representation in Congress has never been dampened. Committees reported but the House never considered a constitutional amendment to have the District seat senators and representatives in Congress in 1969 and 1972. This year an identical amendment reached a floor vote recently for the first time in history — and was soundly rejected.

The issue is sensitive, but we believe that the majority in the House acted wisely. The proposed amendment would have been unnecessarily divisive in a year when the nation has problems of far greater priority with which it must cope.

Q. "I just had my second CB stolen from my car. Short of spending \$100 for a burglar alarm, what can I do to keep the next set?" --- J.T. A. Spend \$10 for a slide-in mobile mount. The mount is

the only effective way I know to thwart a CB thief, allowing you to take the set out of the car at night with no fuss and then simply slide it in and turn it on in the morning. Plug-in connections make it simple and, as CB thefts continue to rise, the mounts are available at most radio Q. "An amateur radio friend of mine was appalled

that my \$250 CB ease rig was not grounded. There's no provision for a ground on the set so I figure it really isn't necessary. Is it?" - D.G. A. I think so, though obviously not all the manufacturers do. I'd suggest that you run a length of copper wire from a handy screw on the back or underside of your rig to

a nearby ground. The screw securing electrical wallplug covers is a good ground, as is a water pipe. That way, if a condenser suddenly blows in your CB, the ground will help prevent further damage.

The Federal Communications Commission in Washington reports a whopping 275,000 backlog in CB license applications. Electronics manufacturers estimate that a quarter-million CB sets were given as Christmas presents last year. CB radio has room for them all, provided the new enthusiasts learn the rules of the airwaves. By 1977, the FCC hopes to open up two new CB

CBers operating on 23 channels that are getting espicially crowded in urban areas are objecting to the FCC's recent designation of Channel 11 as a call channel

Since the rule did not go into effect until last fall, it's still too early to tell how serious the FCC is about enforcing it. Clearly, however, the new rule states that Channel 11 is a national calling channel "to be used only to establish communications and arrange to move to another channel." While it's still okay to call other stations on other channels, the FCC doesn't want Channel 11 used for conversations.

Judging from what I'm hearing and what readers are telling us, though, nobody is much paying attention to the new law. Chief objection is that limiting Channel 11 to making contacts with other CBers adds to the congestion on the rest of the tiny band. Channel 19 long has been a trucker channel and 9 an emergency channel. Readers point out that most CBers already have a stand-by channel, be it 14 or 18 or whatever, which they and most of the airwave buddies monitor by mutual agreement. The FCC concedes it's getting lots of flak on the rule





WASHINGTON (AP) - Senate resistance to the sale of six military cargo planes to Egypt apparently is crumbling in the wake of administration assurances that there are no commitments for U.S. re-armament of the Middle

Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger offered the assurances on Friday in testimony before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

Sens. Hubert H. Humphrey, D-Minn., and Jacob Javits, RN.Y., two of the three committee members who have been most suspicious of implications of the deal for the six C-130 planes, said they would accept Kissinger's assurances and will not seek to veto the transaction.


Riding in the parade will be officers in the local unit: Irene Brown, president; Edith McNeil, vice president; Connie Fox, recording secretary; Helen



Wedding Ensemble Recaptures 1800s, May Capture Prize

Mary O'Day steps right out of the pages of history when she models the 1920s wedding wasemble which 10 local Junior Woman's Clubs will be entering in an up-

coming Bicentennial costume contest. The contest, sponsored by the Florida Federation of Woman's Clubs (FFWC), will lead to the selection of a district winner, then a state winner. This Florida representative will compete in the national costume

contest finals in Philadelphia, in June. District 7, FFWC, is made up of 10 clubs, including the Sanford Junior Woman's Club, of which Ms. O'Day is a member. When Ms. O'Day's proposal to recreate a wedding gown and accessories out of the 1820s was heard by the other nine clubs, they agreed she should represent

gown may still be viewed in the Jamestown Museum. "Being the Bicentennial, we thought most of the costumes would be the Betsy Ross, Martha Washington sort of thing," Ms. O'Day explained. "In the contest, they give points for the most original, and we thought this

wedding gown was just the thing." The contest also gives points for the best period adaptation; best original design; most unique; most elegant; best accessorized; best over-all and most

"We think we qualify in all categories-except most practical," said Ms. O'Day. "But then again, what's more practical for a wedding, than this gown. . . .?

The elegant creation is fashioned out of pure white slipper satin with puffs of "old fashioned, has-to-beironed" organza in the sleeves and ruffles around the skirt

The tassles trimming the dainty puff sleeves each took a spool of buttonhole twist to make. The loops for the

covered buttons down the back were hand-crocheted by Ruth Gaines, another Sanford Junior. The same delicate crochet work trims the long muslin

slip and period pantaloons worn under the gown. Most remarkable of all, however, is that every stitch on the entire ensemble is hand sewn - finished French seams, cathedral length veil - everything has been

stitched by Ms. O'Day's nimble fingers. The fresh garden flowers which adorned the original headpiece have been replaced with silk flowers, but Ms. O'Day's shoes, discovered after weeks of hunting through Goodwill stores, are authentic Queen Anne style. Seminole Prices Are Florida's Best

minole grocery stores sported lower prices than upermarkets in 10 Florida cities during March. Spot checks in 10 cities by the Associated Press and a random survey of Seminole stores by the Herald showed Seminole shoppers are - relatively speaking - enjoying some of the state's best buys.

Jacksonville socked customers with the fattest prices at the grocery store checkout counter, paying \$15.26 for a 15-item shopping list.

Seminole residents paid just \$11.80. Here's how other Florida cities stacked up: Tampa \$14.78; Lake Wales, \$14.72; Daytona Beach, \$14.68; Cocoa, \$14.53; Orlando, \$14.29; Fort Myers, \$14.24; Miami, \$14.19; Tallahassee, \$13.89, and Pensacola, \$13.54. The biggest price differences were at the meat

\$1.09 in Pensacola and as much as \$1.69 in Jacksonville and Tallahassee. The Seminole price, an average of chain and locally-owned supermarket prices, was \$1.11. One pound of center cut pork chops ranged in cost

from \$1.34 in Seminole to \$2.29 in Lake Wales. And there were price variances in many staples, such as milk, butter and sugar.

A quart of milk cost 59 cents in eight of the cities checked, but Miami shoppers paid only 52 cents. Seminole's average price was 57 cents. Putter is no bargain in Seminole, which topped the list

with an average price of \$1.25 for a pound. Prices were as low as 99 cents in Miami. A dozen medium white eggs cost 55 cents in Pensacola and 59 cents in Tampa, but in the 60-to-70 cent range elsewhere - including Seminole, where prices averaged

Fort Myers and Seminole offered the best buys for a five-pound bag of sugar at \$1.17. Prices ranged as high as C.29 in Tallahassee and Pensacola.

And what about orange juice? A six-pound can of frozen Florida sunshine cost 20 cents in Tallahassee, 23 cents in Orlando and 24 cents in Lake Wales but jumped to at least 30 cents in all other areas checked - including Seminole, where prices averaged 33 cents. The most expensive orange juice was found in Miami and Pensacola, where shoppers paid 35 cents.

March Prices Boost Family Grocery Bill

Supermarket shoppers who had been enjoying lower prices in the first part of 1976 found during March that the narketbasket survey shows.

Increases for a wide range of items boosted the family grocery bill last month, although prices generally were ower than they were at the start of the year. The AP drew up a random list of 15 commonly pur-

chased food and nonfood items, checked the price in one supermarket in each of 13 cities on March 1, 1973, and has The latest survey showed a few price Gecreases during March - pork chops declined in eight cities, for example, and eggs in 10. But increases for butter, all-beef frankfurters and coffee offset the savings.

The marketbasket total at the checklist store was up during March in eight of the cities surveyed, increasing an average of 2.8 per cent. The total was down at the checklist store in four cities, decreasing an average 3.2 per cent, and was unchanged at the survey store in the 13th city, Miami. On an over-all basis, the marketbasket total at the start of April was a little less than 1 per cent

During February, in contrast, the marketbasket total declined at the checklist store in 12 cities for an over-all

A comparison of prices now and at the start of the year showed encouraging news. The marketbasket total was down at the checklist store in 12 cities, with an average drop of about 3 per cent. The only increase was at the checklist store in Dallas, where the marketbasket total went up a little less than 1 per cent.






Planet carrot is a round, beetshaped carrot with deep orange flesh and green top, described as good for canning or pickling or as a gourmet item. The soil should be hilled over the carrot to prevent green shoulders. Stokes also introduces two
