Sanford To Sue L. Mary

City Attorney Vernon Mize has been authorized by the Sanford City Commission to file a civil suit against the City of Lake Mary over a 290-acre parcel of land annexed by Sanford, but incorporated by Lake Mary, according to City Manager W.E. Knowles.

Knowles said the agricultural and, which he described as "a large orange grove on a hill west of Rantoul Lane," was annexed by Sanford in 1973, but was included in the boundaries of Lake Mary in August of that year when Lake Mary was incorporated.

CONCORD, N.H. (AP) - President Ford edged out Ronald Reagan in New Hampshire's leadoff primary, and Jimmy Carter strengthened his claim to frontrunner status with a comfortable triumph in the crowded Democratic field. With only partial returns from one precinct missing in what had

Former Georgia Gov. Carter defeated four major candidates on Tuesday's Democratic ballot. His percentage total dropped one point to 29 per cent in late returns today. Arizona Rep. Morris K. Jdall was second with 24 per cent and Indiana Sen. Birch Bayh

Ford said today his victory in the New Hampshire primary is a great springboard" to the Republican nomination and to victory in the November presidential election. "If we win a couple more, and I think we will, we'll be ready for



Agreement Found On Tour

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger found basic agreement with American foreign policy during his Latin American trip, including his concern over new Cuban aggression.

A senior American official told newsmen on the flight home Tuesday night that Kissinger found no sense of confrontation in any of the six nations he visited, including the one he thought might be troublesome, Peru. He also visited Brazil, Venezuela, Colombia, Costa Rica and

Kissinger's nine-day visit in Latin America was his first trip to the area since he entered the government in 1969. His last stop was a two-heur layover in Guatemala, where he examined earthquake damage in Guatemala City. Before leaving, he promised to do his "utmost to respond to the courage of the Guatemalan people."

Both studies are expected to give new impetus to the Ford administration's drive to give the nation's airlines more freedom to raise and lower fares and to start and stop service.

Ford Orders Non-Compliance

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford ordered the Justice Department and Defense Department to refuse compliance with a House subcommittee subpoena for records about government interceptions of cables sent to and from U.S. citizens, congressional sources say. A spokesman for the House government information subcommittee said Tuesday the panel had been told that Ford was prepared to invoke executive privilege to keep the subcommittee from obtaining information on Operation Shamrock, the now-defunct cable interception

Four FBI agents and a National Security Agency empioye who were involved in Operation Shamrock were scheduled to testify today before the subcommittee, which is headed by Rep. Bella S. Abzug, D-N.Y.

Tax Hike Is Stymied

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford's plan to raise Social Security taxes by as much as \$1 a week per worker apparently is dead, a victim of the battle between Congress and the White House over economic policy. The Senate Finance Committee's action rejecting Ford's proposal came as no surprise. And while the decision could be reversed by the Senate and the House, the prospect in this election year is unlikely.

Without a formal vote, the Finance Committee agreed Tuesday that its spending and tax plans for 1977 would not include an increase in Social Security payroll deductions. The panel delayed until later this year a decision on whether money should be taken from elsewhere in the federal budget to pump up the Social Security system.

Senate Ponders Extension

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate is debating whether Daylight Saving Time should be extended to eight months. as i'was last year, or whether it should run for six months

Unless Congress acts, the country automatically goes DST. This means Daylight Saving now is set to run from

If Daylight Saving is extended to eight menths under a bill before the Senate, it would run from March 7 to Nov.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Pentagon is locking into the possibility that fraud and bribery have been involved in the purchase of beef for the armed services. The probe by officials of the Defense Investigative Service and agents of the Army, Navy and Air Force has been under way since last fall.

It was prompted by complaints from a Senate subcommittee headed by Sen. Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., which heard reports of improprieties in the baying of meat for military

Betty Ford Addresses Rally, Speech Is Touched By Irony

JACKSONVILLE (AP) - There was a subdued, ironic political note to the non-partisan patriotic rally that Betty Ford addressed here in her quest for votes for her husband in the Florida primary. The rally Tuesday night was part of a campaign trip

Mrs. Ford hadn't been expected to make as recently as a

week ago. Today she planned to dedicate a Melbourne school that teaches the basics, then cross the state and visit a senior citizens center at Port Charlotte. At the rally, she delivered a ringing speech on American values and fitted in a tribute to two military officers who had been Vietnam prisoners of war, Marine Col. Howard Dunn and Navy Cmdr. John McKain Jr. Dunn's wife was with him as Mrs. Ford acknowledged the men's service. But McKain's wife was home in nearby Orange Park, where she heads Ronald Reagan's effort to beat Gerald Ford out of Republican delegates in the March 9 Florida primary.



Security Justifies **Arms Request**

One way to calculate the degree of damage to the security of the United States of America is to read the columns of statistics. Another is to listen to the changing semantics of the annual defense budget debate. Neither was reassuring as Congress DON OAKLEY began its discussion of defense appropriations for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1.

The administration has asked for a defense budget of \$101.4 billion, about \$8.9 billion more than the appropriation for the current year. That increase dissipates, however, when inflation, the rising cost of military hardware, and the percentage of national treasure devoted to security are factored in.

The defense budget request is 5.4 per cent of the gross national product. This year military spending was 5.7 per cent of the GNP. In 1965 the figure was 8 per cent.

Words that package the national defense budget presentation tell the same story. During the Truman years the United States discouraged foreign adventurism with a policy of "deterrance." We were so strong that nobody dared to test us. President Eisenhower advocated "massive retaliation" - clear-cut strategic superiority over any who would challenge us. By the end of the Kennedy administration, the United States stressed "flexible response." President Ford asked Congress for "essential equivalence." Recently, Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld defined the security goal as "rough equivalence."

What the declining figures and reduced

rhetoric mean can be seen readily. Adm. James L. Holloway, chief of naval operations, told the House Armed Services Committee that the United States has only a "slim margin of superiority" over the Soviet Union and has lost control of the Sea of Japan. The Soviet Union is continuing to improve its navy while the U.S. Navy recently was forced to drep its goal of 600 active ships - it now has only


On a larger plateau of defense, John Collins, respected Library of Congress expert on military affairs, suggested in a study that Congress should reassess the United States' position of global leadership because the military balance of power is tipping toward the Soviet Union.

On still other plateaus, the United States now has no mechanism for the immediate mobilization of manpower because draft registration was dropped. Abroad, the United States is losing flexibility of operations because of restrictions on our bases in Turkey, Spain and the Philippines. Military morale is likely to drop if Congress freezes pay and pensions of the military, as suggested by the administration for economy reasons. And while our research and development may be respectable. the United States is not making the investment to put the new weapons into operations on the scale

The United States is threatened by the Soviet Union with superiority in almost every category of defense, which is another way of saying that the safety and stability of the entire world is threatened.

As Congress deliberates over the defense budget, it must remember that the success of military budgets is measured by the degree to which the weapons that the money buys is not put to use. Peace, not war, is the objective. "Equivalence" may buy us a period of relative peace. But the weapons will remain silent only if the United States has unquestioned superiority in every category and the unquestioned resolve to back its foreign policy.

Plundering HEW Extra Income

WASHINGTON - Intolerable levels of graft in the \$5 billion a year Supplemental Security Income Program for the aged, blind and disabled have been well documented and

And excuses duly rendered by the Department of Health, Education and welfare. The agency was new, it was said. It inherited a motley conglomeration of files and backup information from the states. The program is so arge and so complicated there will inevitably be a certain amount of fraud, mistakes and slipups. Hogwash. These statements are true so far as they go. But they ignore a depth of sloppy mismanagement not related to newness, size or

A recent federal government study of the program suggests in fact, that if present agency practices are continued we may be in for future fraud of a magnitude which will make past reports of maifeasance, by comparison, seem out like a child's game of marbles.

Item - The computers, tapes and peripheral equipment of the electronic data processing operations — the heart of who's paid what and how much - are so poorly guarded and supervised they can be manipulated at will by almost anyone in the system.

Badges and passes authorizing entry into the facility are uncontrolled and readily available The area housing the computers and associated equipment is virtually unattended, allowing easy ccess. Once inside the facility, unauthorized personnel or staff members with empezzlement in mind could remove or exchange tapes con-

taining critical information with little effort. BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) - President Isabel Peron's foes in Congress were trying to rally a two-thirds majority today to impeach her or declare her unfit to

The lower house of Congress was to meet for the special session that the government canceled last week in an attempt to avert a showdown. Although the session was called to consider bills still pending, the deputies could decide to discuss action against the embattled president. Top officials of the Peronist movement met Tuesday after Mrs. Peron rejected their demand that she purge her cabinet and circle of advisers of men linked to Jose Lopez Rega, her chief adviser and confident who was forced into exile last summer.

Some leading Peronists urged that the movemen abandon Mrs. Peron and join dissident Peronists and the opposition parties in a vote to remove her now, 15 months before the end of her term.

Cuban Constitution Hailed

MIAMI (AP) - Cuba's first day under its new socialist constitution has been marked by the acclaim of Prime Minister Fidel Castro's brother, who says the charter will inspire other Latin Americans. First Vice Premier Raul Castro, head of the country's

armed forces, analysed the constitution in a Tuesday nationwide broadcast monitored in Miami. "The people have expressed their approval of (the Castro government's) international policy. . . and solidarity with the brother people of Angola," Castro said.

Sterilization Plan Announced

NEW DELHI, India (AP) - Acting to encourage sterilization, the Indian government has announced a plan to penalize government employes and Delhi residents who do not limit their families to two children.

The plan, similar to those the government is promoting in state assemblies across the country, also provides incentives to couples with one sterilized spouse or with one who has signed a pledge to undergo sterilization after having two children.

The penalties, which the government said would become effective "almost immediately," directly or indirectly curtail a couple's access to almost the entire range of government assistance — from government jobs and housing to loans, medical care, schools and drinking

In his trial last May, the actor testified that two hitchhikers gave him marijuana after he saved their souls. The attorney said he last heard from LaRue, a former Tampa, Fla., resident, several months ago in Hollywood, where he was seeking employment.







Patti McKinney Often Cooks For Crowds

ROME (AP) - Seven Italian air force widows whose husbands died in Lockheed's crashprone Starfighter jets are suing the American aircraft company for \$3.5 million. The women will be represented in U.S. courts by attorney Melvin M. Belli, who said he got \$1.2 million for

relatives of 32 West German pilots in last October. Belli is in Italy to meet with the seven Italian women and contact others widowed by Starfighter crashes. He plans to search out other Starfighter widows in The Netherlands, Japan and Turkey.

"We have been selling so much materiel to foreigners that they should know they can have a suit for breach of warranty in the United States," said the 68-year-old


lawyer in an interview. He noted that approximately 250 of West Germany's 750 Starfighters crashed, and he said, "You would certainly think that an impartial government board would have had an investigation and sued for their own nationals. And

here the Italian government should be suing, but it isn't." Italian newspapers have accused two former defense ministers and other high-ranking government officials of receiving payoffs from Lockheed during negotiations for the purchase of 14 Hercules cargo planes in 1970. No such charges have been made in connection with Starfighter purchases by Italy, but the company has been accused of paying \$16 million in West Germany to Franz Josef Strauss' right-wing political party in the early 1960's while Strauss as defense minister was buying Starfighters for the West German air force.

Belli refused to name the Italians suing Lockheed. He explained that the West German government had tried to stop his first suit for a German widow and even threatened to block his clients' air force pensions.

He said he had been invited to Italy by the brother of an air force major who died in a Starfighter and who read about the Germans' suits. Belli said he would begin proceedings early in March

and "it'll probably take about a year to get into court." He said six of the Italian cases would be tried in federal court in San Francisco and the seventh, involving a death in the 1960s, probably in North Carolina.
