WASHINGTON, May 10 .-(A.P.) - President Hoover said today he is greatly encouraged over the hope of speedy action in the Senate on the revenue bill. Determined to block large slashes in army appropriations the House Military Committee invited Secretary Hurley to testify behind closed doors on pending war department supply bills. A program for the appointment of a special committee to frame a non-partisan economy bill was accepted by chairman Jones of the Senate Appropriations Committee.

The Work Of The Saivation Army

In calling attention to the Salvation Army drive which egins tomorrow and extends through Thursday, and in urging our readers to contribute to the very limit of their ability, we would remind them that out of this year's budget of \$6,383.00, a total of \$5,521 femalis in Santia of Only \$862.00 goes out of fown. The rest is spent here to feed and clothe the poor and to give spiritual aid to floundering souls.

The two day drive itself centers upon an effort to hide \$4,561.16. The balance of this year's budget will be raised during the course of the year through the activities of the Army itself. This may seem like a considerable sum in view of present economic conditions, but this very adverse situation makes the raising of so large a sum all the more imperative. Probably never before in the history of Sanford has there been greater need for charitable contributions.

Those who have never had occasion to seek the shelter of a Salvation Army home probably fail to realize the importance of this organization to those who are absolutely destitute. One case we have in mind concerns a poverty stricken family whose name we omit to avoid unnecessary embarrassment. Laid off during a retrenchment program of the concern for which he worked, the head of the family saw his cupboard empty as he looked for other work. Then sickness seized the younger members of the family. The Salvation Army stepped in, obtained the services of a physician, filled prescriptions, and furnished them with food.

Another case was that of an outcast girl of keventeen who finally came under the protecting arm of the Salvation Army, Her mother and father had refused to recognize her as their daughter any longer. But the consecrated women of the Salvation Army took her in, protected and she cred her in her re-habilitation, and finally prevailed upon her mother and father to forgive her and give her another chance. Today she has regained her faith in humanity and is prepared to face the future with courage and uprightness.

Such cases as these are common to Salvation Army workers. The public generally known too little of them. But the work of the Salvation Army must go on. The very existence of our civilization demands its continuance. Those of us who have anything at all cannot afford to see its services lapse. 
