Harper & Row-he is a splendid guide for cooks who want to 5 learn how to prepare authentic Chinese dishes in a practical and convenient way. To become a painstaking guide, he sought the help of a professional Chinese chef-Jim himself teaches ceramics in a

New York junior high schooland he spent four years in the preparation of his book. All this . adds up to the fact that "Jim Lee's Chinese Cookbook' contains loads of information given in an interesting, personal way and the recipes are well-chosen and clearly written. Jim Lee is a merry man and his exuberance shows delightfully in his writing-whether he's advising on how to shop in a Chinese grocery store or now to

involve children in growing bean sprouts. Jim lived in China until he was nine years old and says he can "recall that there were contests in my village among the children to see who grew the best sprouts, which they shaped and arranged to resemble miniature gardens."

One of the most useful features of Jims book are the paragraphs devoted to "Substitutions and Variations" after many of the recipes. There's a brief list of grocery stores in major cities where Chinese ingredients may be had. Listed, too, are a couple of stores that Not long ago I had lunch with Jim and his wife Isabella who contributed the charming and decorative illustrations to Jim's

book. The Lee house on New York's Lower East Side is a fasinating place which the Lees converted from a matzo factory into a series of hospitable rooms -more evidence of their creative abilities and fine taste, Among the dishes Jim cooked for lunch was the best fried shrimp I've ever eaten, and here's his fabulous recipe. JIM LEE'S PUFF SHRIMP

AU JAH HA 12 large shrimp-about 11/2 1/2 teaspoon garlic juice-extract from a garlic press 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon monosodium gluta-

11/2 cups white flour-do not use unbleached flour-it turns gray instead of golden brown 1 tablespoon baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup vegetable oil

1 cup cold water Oil for deep frying-2 to quarts Chinese parsley, watercress, or lettuce leaves, optional Remove shells from the shrimp except for the last tail section. With a sharp knife, cut the shrimp from the under side

almost through to the back. Be careful not to sever the halves completely. Remove black veins and rinse the shrimp well. Place on paper towels and pat dry. Arrange shrimp on a plate or platter, with split side up. Rub a little garlic juice on each. Sprinkle a touch of salt and monosodium glutamate on each. Put aside. Place flour, baking powder and salt in a mixing bowl. Mix thoroughly. Add the half cup oil, a little at a time, while stirring with a wooden fork or spoon until all the ingredients form a

ball and the sides of the bowl are clean. Add water a little at a time while stirring, until the dough becomes the consistency of pancake butter. The thicker the batter, the thicker the crust will be on the cooked shrimp. Place the shrimp and the batter conveniently near your cook-

deep-frying utensil, to 350-360 degrees. You can also test the temperature of the oil by putting a drop of batter in it. If the batter sizzles, puffs up, and floats, the oil is ready. Take each shrimp by the tail, and dip it into the batter. Put shrimp directly into the hot oil one at a time. As each turns a golden brown, remove from oil with tongs and place on paper towels to drain. Arrange on serving plate and garnish with parsley or watercress. A few leaves of lettuce under the shrimps help to make the dish look fuller and prettier, and

### Have You Had Any Soul Food?

By CECILY BROWNSTONE Associated Press Food Editor Eight cookbooks devoted to soul food now grace my shelves. Of these collections of traditional Negro recipes, I find "A Good Heart and A Light Hand" by Ruth L. Gaskins-Simon and Schuster-the most interesting and authentic. Ruth Gaskins, a resident of Alexandria, Va., collected her recipes by gathering them from her Negro friends - most of whom now live in Alexandria but originally came from other parts of the South, Many of these contributors are professional cooks, though Miss Gaskins is not. "A Good Heart and A Light Hand" is charmingly if lustrated with black and white drawings, and the recipes are

When I asked a black friend who was born and raised in Pennsylvania which recipe in the Gaskins' book appealed to her most, she chose the White Potato Pie. I, too, was interest. ed in the recipe because other white potato pies I had made were designed to accompany the main course and this one was sweet-a dessert pie. On testing the recipe. I found it had a most appealing and almost baffling texture. If pressed for a description, I'd say it was a cross between an old-fashioned lemon sponge ple and cheese

clearly written and efficiently

One suggestion for those who make the pie, you may wish to in it instead of the lemon extract called for in too powerful uantity. Interestingly enough, emon extract shows up over ind over again in soul-food compilations-more so than in any other group of cookbooks.

RUTH L. GASKIN'S WHITE POTATO PIE


