City annexes lakefront property

Move will allow Sanford to oversee 23-acre Venetian Bay project

SANFORD — City Commissioners agreed to annex and rezone 23 acres for a future residential development, but not before obtaining a commitment from the developer to limit the project's density to 4 units per acre.

Developer Michael Murray plans to build the subdivision, Venetian Bay, on Lake Monroe just west of Regatta Shores apartments. Residents on Palm Drive and Riverview have opposed Murray's plans because they say the project is too

dense for the surrounding neighborhoods. They also argue the subdivision would change the drainage in the area, causing substantially flooding of their properties.

"That area is a wetlands area," said Riverview Avenue resident Betty Giles. "The man can't possibly hold all his

water."

Murray said he has had preliminary meetings with St. Johns River Water Management District officials, and the agency will have to approve his detention and drainage plans.

"St. Johns doesn't miss anything," Murray said. "If we don't comply with

their orders, we can't build. St. Johns is very stringent."

Murray said Palm Drive resident Louise Austin said she was concerned with Murray's plans to put 100 homes on the 23 acre project. She said the homes in the neighborhood are currently zoned Suburban Estates, and zoning incompatible with Venetian Bay.

"For somebody to come in and want to ram 100 houses down your throat is a little bit much," Austin said.

Burglar stabs home owner

Resident drops steak knife, thief uses it against him

Seminole County Sheriff's Investigators are looking into a burglary early Tuesday morning during which time a man suffered a knife wound.

When Deputy Nelson Pitre arrived at a residence on Jergo Road near Casselberry, he found Doyle L. Coats, 33, lying on the living room floor with a steak knife punctured into his left calf.

Coats told the deputy a white male had entered his residence through an open bedroom window. Upon hearing the distur-

bance in the bedroom, Coats said he got up from the living room, went to the kitchen where he obtained a steak knife, then proceeded to the rear of the house where the suspect confronted him.

He said the man attempted to strike him with a golf club, after which a struggle occurred. The knife fell to the floor and the suspect picked it up and stabbed Coats in the leg. He then fled through the window.

The deputy said it appeared nothing was missing or disturbed. Neighbors reported hearing no noise from Coats' apartment.

Coats was taken to a local hospital for treatment of his injury.

Sheriff's spokesman Steve Olson said an investigation into the incident is underway.

Seminole students add it up to ace state math test

Results of both the FCAT and SAT scores were recently announced, and Seminole County schools fared well in both categories.

In the February, 2000 FCAT (Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test) the Seminole County School Board said 30 students from 19 Seminole County Elementary, Middle and High Schools scored a perfect 500 on the math section. Approximately 11,000 students in grades 5, 8 and 10 took the test.

In addition, there were 335 students in the county who made a perfect score on the Writing Test.

High Schools — William Eriov, Larissa Gillott, Angela Goodwin, Melissa Reyes, all of Lake Brantley; Robert Simon of Lake Howell; Beatriz Faustmann, Lake Mary; Nedda Mofazall, Lyman; Kevin Crews, Seminole; and Courtney Byrd, Winter Springs.

In addition to individual stu-

dents, 14 schools in Seminole County were honored for most improved and highest district test scores. The scores were accumulated in the February Writing, Reading and Mathematics tests, and the Reading and Mathematics tests taken in March.

Schools honored were: High Schools Lake Brantley, Lake Howell, Lake Mary, and Seminole. Middle Schools Rock Lake, Indian Trails, Millennium, South Seminole and Tusawilla. Elementary Schools Sebal Point, English Estates, Hamilton, Lake Mary and Rainbow.

Each of the schools were presented a banner at a recent School Board meeting.

The students will be receiving a letter and certificate from Superintendent Paul Hagerty.

In the SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test), statistics show Seminole County high

Safehouse provides shelter for victims of domestic violence

Safehouse of Seminole is a Domestic Violence Center committed to breaking the cycle of violence in our community. Safehouse of Seminole has an emergency, confidential shelter for victims of domestic violence and their children.

Sanford Police spokesperson Cleo Cohen said domestic violence is prevalent in our community.

"Our officers respond daily to domestic violence calls," Cohen said. "I go through the arrest and incident reports daily, and hardly ever a day goes by that we don't have one

or more such calls."

She added that Safehouse is a haven for those suffering from domestic violence as well as a great assistance to law enforcement.

"They know they can move a victim out of a bad situation and into a safehouse," she said, "and what a blessing this is to everyone concerned."

Victims Services Coordinator Hazel Hastings said at the shelter, victims will find a safe and supportive environment where they can meet their own needs, take time to make decisions about the future and receive assistance and advocacy as they strive for new beginnings.

For those unable to, or who do not wish to take advantage of the shelter, Safehouse of Seminole also provides crisis counseling, case management and outreach support groups for women and their children.

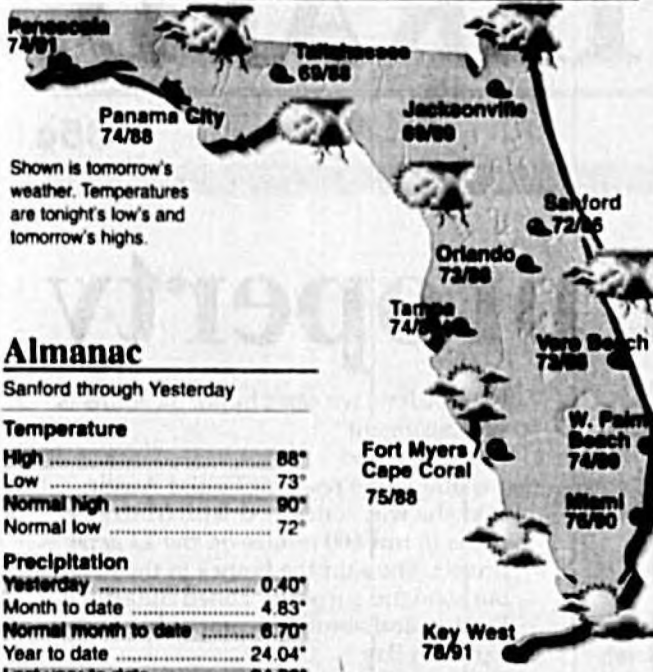

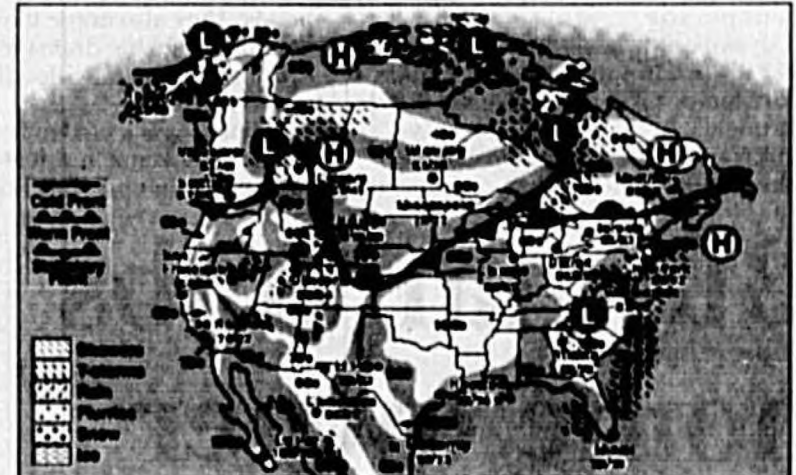

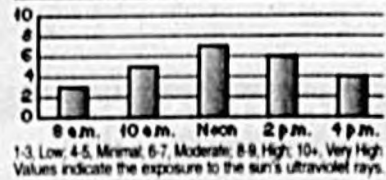

According to the will, anyone contesting it would get nothing. The two sisters have never gotten along, and this will really make them enemies. We both read your column and trust you implicitly. What do you think?

MARRIED TO THE LESS-LOVED SISTER

DEAR MARRIED: Your wife might suggest to her mother that she name an impartial

("without prejudice") person to be executor of her estate, in order to prevent a problem now or in the future. However, if she is aware of the antipathy her firstborn has for her younger sister and ignores it — she's condoning it, and that's a shame.

If that's not agreeable, your wife's fears might be eased were she to consult a lawyer who is knowledgeable about wills and trusts in the state in which her parents lived. When someone who has a will dies, that will is filed with the court for probate. The purpose of the probate (a court supervised administration process) is to ensure that the wishes of the deceased are carried out. For instance, if the will says the estate is to be divided 50/50, that's how it must be. As executrix, your sister-in-law may be entitled to a fee, but if it's out of line there may be legal remedies.

It's sad that there's so much ill will between the sisters — but whatever enmity the elder has for the younger, she's legal-

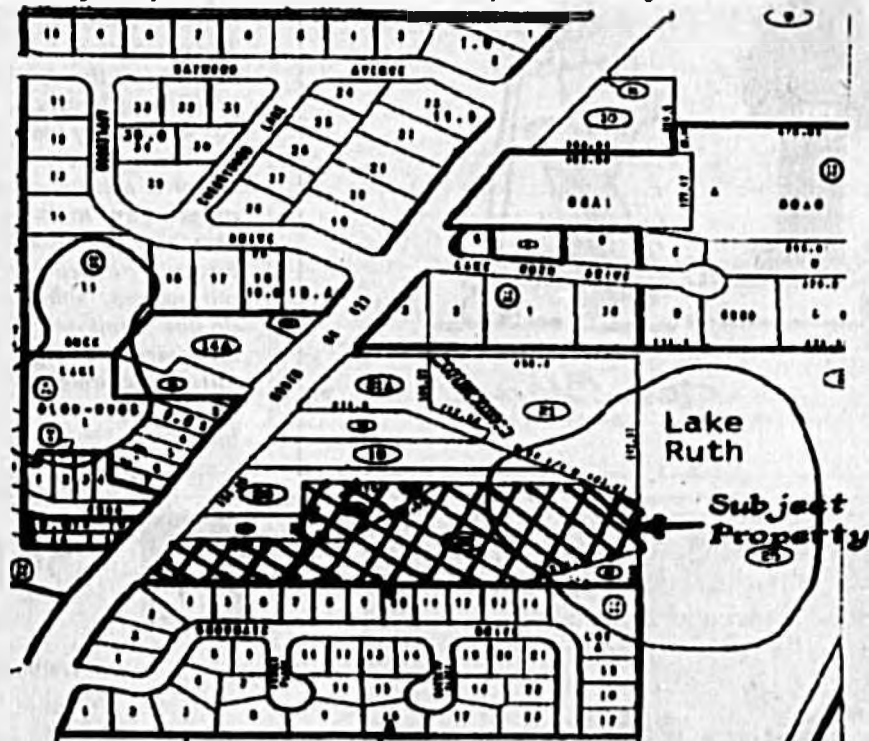

Clinton's speech

The one syllable that speaks volumes

Even weeks later, I keep thinking about President Clinton's masterful speech at the Democratic Convention. He always reminds me of Frank Sinatra, taking an ordinary string of words and turning them into something magical.

But of course, nothing is ever simple and straightforward with Clinton. He's always stubbing out the cigarette in the champagne glass, always doing something that feeds your ambiguity about the guy, despite his successes as president. In this case, it was a single syllable.

It came near the end of the speech, and it was an ad lib in so far as it didn't appear in the advance copy of the speech handed out to the media.

On this syllable hangs the answer to a central question about Clinton, the man for whom I voted twice: Is he, in the end, a noble rogue or a self-involved prima donna with a messiah complex?

Is he Rhett or Scarlett?

"You must think hard, feel deeply, choose wisely," Clinton said in closing. "And remember, whenever you think about me, keep putting people first."

Whenever you think about me. Like Christ at the Last Supper. It is a phrase so self-reverent that many people still don't believe he said it. They insist he said the more gracious "Whatever you think about me." Even the New York Times originally reported he said "whatever," then ran a correction the following day to change the word to "whenever." The Democratic Party's official transcript has "whenever."

No matter. For the past week, based on one misheard syllable, Clinton has been getting credit for being honest and humble, for delivering a gracious farewell. Examiner columnist Chris Matthews, for example, referred to "whatever you think of me" as the "most unforgettable phrase of the evening" and praised Clinton for finally recognizing "that it's not about him. ... It's about the country."

But it is about him. That's what that single syllable tells us. It's not about us, or Al Gore, or the damage Clinton's done to the country with his abhorrent behavior. It's him. So in that way, his glorious visit to the convention was the only appropriate exit. He took center stage in Los Angeles as if it were the porch of Tara, holding court for his suitors. When detractors criticized him for siphoning money from his loyal vice president in weekend fundraisers for himself and his wife, he waved them away with a dismissive "Fiddle-dee-dee."

Then there was his long walk through the hallways of Staples arena — more John Travolta than John Kennedy. This was not someone likely to ad lib the self-deprecating phrase, "whatever you think about me."

Perhaps we hear what we want to hear. We want Clinton to be apologetic, to show some sign that he truly understands what he put the country through. We want him to be more than he is, and we can convince ourselves — despite compelling evidence — that he truly is more. I suspect if Clinton were allowed to run for a third term, he might win. And not too long ago, I might have been among those pulling the lever.

But after eight years with the man, I'm not as quick to mistake charisma for character. Clinton has accomplished much as president, but I suspect it might be the little things that will endure and define him: a certain look, a gesture, a single self-serving, look-at-me, unapologetic syllable.

WHE: Never you think of me.

In January, when the American people turn to a new president and walk out of Clinton's life, I picture him standing in the doorway of his new home in Chappaqua, N.Y.

"But what shall I do?" I hear him saying. "Where shall I go?"

Frankly, Bill ...

There's no justice in Reno's department

Was there ever a doubt? Did anyone really believe that Janet Reno would dare seek a special prosecutor to investigate Al Gore's fund-raising activities in 1996?

The attorney general has been stonewalling on behalf of her bosses, the president and vice president, for the past four years.

No way was she going to drop a political bomb on Gore a mere 12 weeks before this year's presidential election.

So Gore has gotten away with his illegal backtracking.

And if he somehow manages to get himself elected — with a big assist from the child-snatcher at Justice — one perjurer will follow another into the Oval Office.

What particularly galls is Reno's profession of impartiality. How dare anyone suggest, she said, that her dereliction of duty — that is, her failure to uphold the laws of the land — was politically motivated.

"I don't do things based on politics," she harrumphed. "I realize that politics will be hurled around my head. I just sit there and duck as it comes."

Yes, of course. This attorney general is above politics.

Then why, may we ask, did the former alligator rasserler wait until now to announce a decision that she actually made several weeks (if not months) earlier?

Well, Reno conceded, she delayed her announcement until this week because she didn't

want to step on the Republican and Democratic conventions. That sure sounds a lot like political calculation on her part.

But that's precisely how Reno has operated since the careerist — with no place else to go — begged a reluctant Bill Clinton to reappoint her attorney general after his reelection in 1996.

As a condition of her reappointment, she obviously agreed not to do any more independent counsel on her White House bosses, no matter their wrongdoing.

So this marks the third occasion that Reno has refused to seek an outside counsel, unless hidden to the White House, to ascertain whether Gore broke the law with his fund-raising activities in 1996.

In so doing, the attorney general has repeated, yet again, the recommendation of a prosecutor she hand-picked to head the Justice Department's investigation of the now 4-year-old crime.

Indeed, the head of Justice's campaign-finance unit, Robert Conrad, advised Reno back in June that she should appoint an independent counsel to investigate whether Gore lied to him about his fund-raising exploits. His recommendation was based on an April interview he had with Not-So-Honest-Al.

At issue was the vice president's role in the notorious fund-raising coffees at the White

House and the infamous fund-raiser at a suburban Los Angeles beachfront temple.

When asked about the 103 coffees, which were held for campaign dinners in 1995 and 1996, Gore stated they were not "fund-raising tools" to generate loot for the Democratic Party.

Yet, the individuals who attended the coffees contributed a total of \$2.7 million within one month of having attended them.

As to the April 1996 luncheon at the Hsi Lai Temple, Gore claims that he had no idea that it was a fund-raiser. Despite the fact that it raised \$100,000 for his reelection bid. Despite the fact that several of his trusted aides were well aware that they were shaking down the monks and nuns for campaign contributions.

The reason Gore adapted the Clintonian defense (deny, deny,

deny) in his interview with Conrad is that he knows that it is illegal to raise campaign funds in the White House, just as it is illegal to raise campaign dough on the grounds of a religious institution.

And the very last thing he wanted to do was acknowledge that he knowingly and willfully broke the law.

That's why Gore ought to send Reno a box of barbours (or three). If Tipper Gore were attorney general, she couldn't have done more to derail the federal probe of the vice president's illegal fund-raising activities.

There is no justice at Justice. Bill Clinton saw that, upon his re-election, when he forced Janet Reno to sell her soul to keep her job.

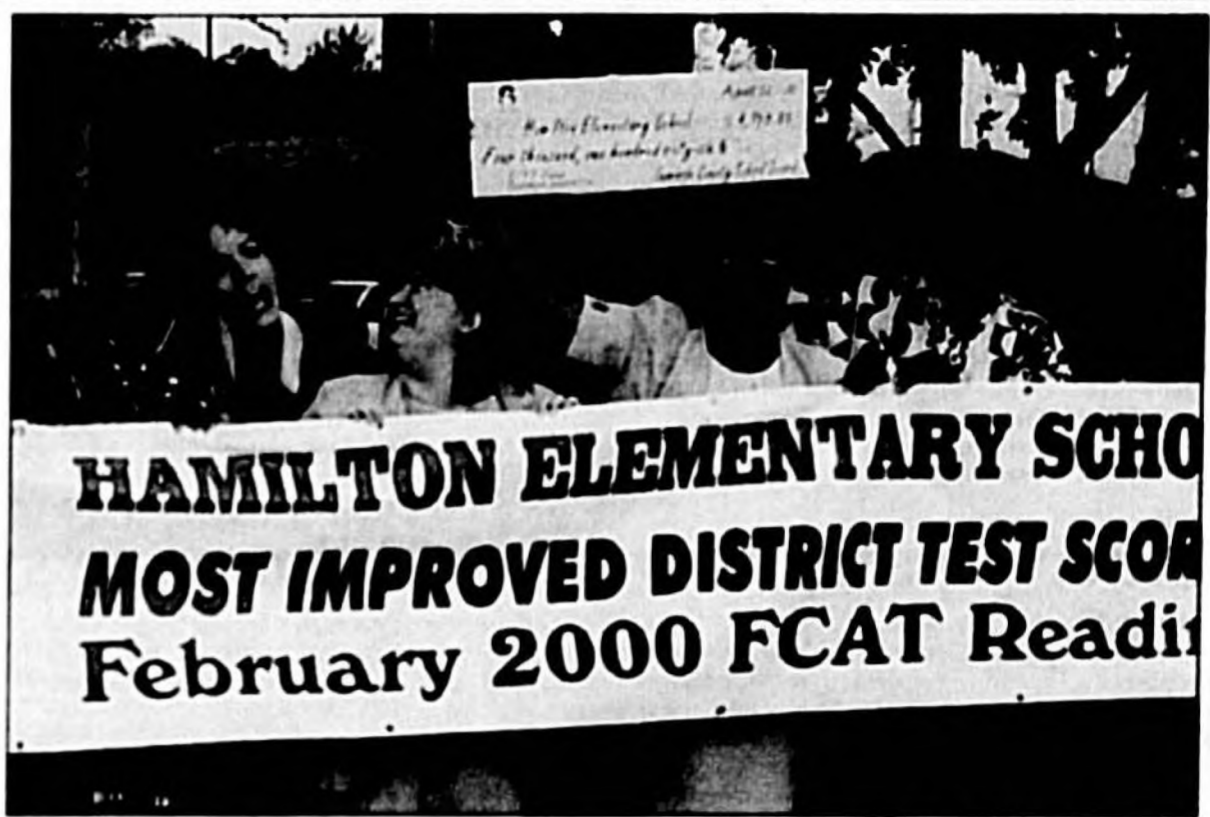

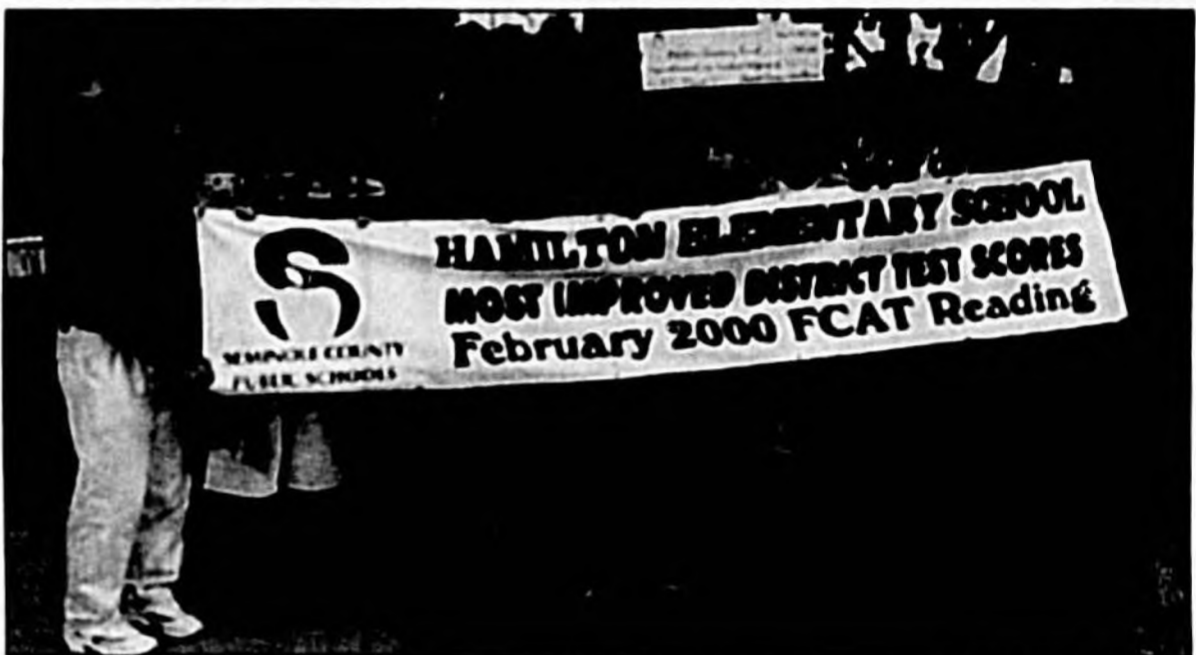

Continued from Page 1A schools are above previous years, and that includes every one of the schools. Scores, in fact, were seven points higher than in 1999 for math, and one point higher in verbal testing. Statewide, Education Commissioner Tom Gallagher said the overall score was up one

percent. "The focus on reading, writing and math is continuing to pay off," Gallagher said. "These test scores are an encouraging sign that our teachers and students are working harder and harder to increase academic achievement." For the SAT scores, Lake Brantley had the largest improve-

ment going from 539 to 557, up 18 percent over last year. Seminole High School climbed from 496 to 509, up 13 percent from 1999. Lake Mary High School improved only one percent, but the scores were already high. It climbed from 543 average to 544.

Continued from Page 1A Murray pointed out that his project will have a density of 4.2 units per acre. He said the Palm Drive residents have a density of 4 units per acre, while Regatta Shores has a density of 20 units per acre.

"We're a very nice buffer between the two," Murray said. Commissioner Brady Lessard said he favored larger lots in the subdivision. "Why won't 70- or 80-foot lots work?" Lessard asked. Murray said the subdivision needed close to 100 lots to make money. Lessard countered, saying lakefront property is a strong selling point. "Bigger lots along the lake front, there's a value in that," he said.

Mayor Larry Dale asked if the developer could match the density of Palm Drive and Riverview Avenue.

"Could you limit it to four (units per acre)?"

"Yes, I could," Murray responded.

The commissioner approved a second reading of an ordinance to annex the 23 acres and OK'd a first reading to rezone the property from A1-Agriculture to PD Planned Development, with Commissioner Velma Williams directing Murray to meet with residents and explain how the property will handle drainage.

"I think that is very important," Williams said.

In other action, the commission:
• Approved a first reading of an ordinance to rezone 178 acres

adjacent to the Central Florida Zoo from AG-Agriculture and M1-2 Medium Industrial to PD Planned Development for single family homes.

• Approved a first reading of an ordinance to rezone 9.5 acres near Silver Lake from SR-1A, Single Family Residential to R1-1, Restricted Industrial.

• Overturned a decision of the Historic Preservation Board which denied a request to return load-bearing structures to a house at 901 S. Magnolia Avenue.

• Approved a request for a 60-day extension to complete repairs and upgrade irrigation at Mayfair Golf Course.

• Appointed Mayor Dale to serve on the Firefighters' Retirement System and the Police Officers' Retirement System.

Elderly patients with weak immune systems are more prone to pneumonia

DEAR DR. GOTT: Why, if pneumonia is such a killer, aren't people being immunized against it, instead of restricting the serum to the elderly?

DEAR READER: Pneumonia, infection of lung tissue, is caused by an astounding variety of microorganisms, ranging from viruses to yeasts and bacteria.

Some pneumonias are the result of inhalation of toxic compounds, such as oil-based products and gastric contents. But most pneumonia is the result of living microorganisms. Thus, the miracle of our immunity is not that we get pneumonia but that we are afflicted with it so infrequently.

You're right that pneumonia is often a killer. Before the advent of antibiotics, it was a dreaded illness — regardless of cause — that carried a high mortality rate. Today, thanks to antibiotics, it is far less a problem. Nonetheless, people still get pneumonia, and some may die from it, despite treatment. For instance, viral pneumonia is still serious business because viruses are not affected by antibiotics.

Also, old and debilitated patients, whose immune systems are often deficient, suffer pneumonia more readily. Such an infection is more severe in these people, is less responsive to therapy and is more likely to lead to

death. This result is not altogether a terrible thing, however. A well-respected surgeon in my community used to call pneumonia "the friend of the aged," because it is a painless cause of death in the very elderly whose quality of life may have become severely compromised.

Scientists have developed a pneumonia vaccine (Pneumovax) that protects against 23 of the most prevalent forms of pneumococcal bacteria, a common cause of pneumonia. The vaccine is recommended for patients in the following categories: those older than 50; those with chronic, non-terminal illness (such as kidney diseases, emphysema and diabetes); and those who have had their spleens removed or who have splenic disease, such as that caused by sickle-cell anemia.

Healthy young people don't need the vaccine because their defenses are usually strong enough to fight off lung infection. In addition, because so many types of infectious agents cause pneumonia, it would be a literal impossibility to compound a vaccine that would encompass all of the possible culprits.

Finally, I would be remiss not to mention the relationship between AIDS and pneumonia. The AIDS virus literally torpedoes the immune system, opening the way to infection by microorganisms, both unusual and exotic as well as ordinary.

Pneumonia is capturing medical headlines because, in part, it is a common and fatal consequence of HIV infection.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Following a biopsy of my thyroid gland last week, I was diagnosed Hashimoto's disease. What is this? My doctor is reluctant to provide information.

DEAR READER: Well, he shouldn't be. Hashimoto's thyroiditis is a

common thyroid disease, marked by inflammation and swelling of the gland, leading to hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid) that causes fatigue, constipation, weakness, slow metabolism and other symptoms. Hashimoto's disease is now believed to be an auto-immune (self-allergy) disorder that is frequently associated with other auto-immune conditions, including pernicious anemia, lupus, rheumatoid arthritis, Addison's disease (underactive adrenal glands) and

hypoparathyroidism (underactive parathyroid glands, which control calcium metabolism).

Hashimoto's thyroiditis is diagnosed by blood tests and biopsy. Fortunately, the treatment is straightforward, simple and inexpensive: life-long therapy with thyroid supplement pills.

You should suffer no future consequences from the affliction (provided you take the medicine), although your doctor will probably insist on testing you for other auto-immune diseases as well,

which would need treatment if discovered. To give you related information, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Lupus: The Great Imitator." Florida Sports Profiles: Steve Spurrier

ORLANDO - In the fall of 1989, the University of Florida needed a miracle. They had spent the middle part of the decade on NCAA probation and had just fired their head coach for other alleged rules violations.

The Gators were sending out an S-O-S.

The universal signal for help also represents the initials of the man Florida needed to establish integrity on the Gainesville campus.

Stephen Orr Spurrier, the 1986 Heisman Trophy winner for the Gators and an innovative, offensive-minded coach, was summoned home to Florida and his return ushered in the greatest decade in the history of Gator football.

In its third installment, **FLORIDA SPORTS PROFILES**, a new series from Sunshine Network, tells the story of the prep star from East Tennessee, who went on to win the Heisman and then coach a Heisman winner at Florida, and led the Gators to their first national championship in 1996.

The story is told by Sunshine Network's Florida Gators sideline reporter and expert Larry Vettel, along with series host Paul Kennedy.

The show will be seen statewide in over 5.2 million homes on Sunshine Network.

Included in the show are interviews with Spurrier's college coach, Ray Graves; his USFL quarterback, John Reaves; UF Athletic Director Jeremy Foley; former star Gator quarterbacks under Spurrier.

Solar Bears re-sign Mark Beaufait

ORLANDO - During a press conference at the RDV Sportsplex, newly appointed Solar Bears Director of Hockey Operations Hubie McDonough announced the re-signing of the International Hockey League (IHL) club's all-time leading scorer, center Mark Beaufait.

The 5-foot-9, 170-pound Beaufait has been with the Solar Bears since the team's inaugural season in 1995-96 and ranks as the franchise's all-time leader in points (434), goals (138), and assists (298). Per team policy, terms of the deal are not disclosed.

"Mark Beaufait has emerged over the last five seasons as one of the top players in the IHL and the cornerstone of the Solar Bears franchise," said McDonough. "I had the pleasure of playing alongside Mark for five years and have always admired his all-around ability. He is a leader for us on the ice, and we are fortunate to have him back for a sixth season in Orlando."

Beaufait appeared in 78 games for the Solar Bears in 1999-2000, leading the team in scoring for the fourth consecutive season. The Royal Oak, Michigan native tallied 78 points on 28 goals and 50 assists to finish sixth in the league scoring race.

For his efforts, Beaufait was named 1999-2000 in the Crease Minor Pro Player of the Year.

In his eight-year professional career, he has been named to three IHL All-Star Teams (1993, 1997, and 1998) and was tabbed as All-IHL Second Team in 1996-97.

Beaufait began his professional career in 1992-93 with the IHL's Kansas City Blades after the National Hockey League's (NHL) San Jose Sharks selected him with the seventh overall pick in the 1991 NHL Supplemental Draft.

The former standout at Northern Michigan University was a member of both the 1993-94 USA National Team and the 1994 USA Olympic squad.

Orlando opens its sixth IHL season on Friday, October 6th at the TD Waterhouse Centre with a 7 p.m. contest against the Manitoba Moose.

NFC East: 'Skins feature top names

The Washington Redskins have acquired some big names on defense in an effort to fend off challengers in the NFC East. Even so, New York and Dallas feature enough talent to put up a fight.

Going into the 2000 season, here's a look at the division (with the teams listed in their approximate order of strength):

1. WASHINGTON REDSKINS: Coach Norv Turner's offense, led by quarterback Brad Johnson (4,005 yards, 24 touchdowns), was second in the NFL in points scored last season.

Running back Stephen Davis (1,405 yards, 17 touchdowns) and fullback Larry Centers (69 catches) are threats. Rookie offensive tackle Chris Samuels can boost the blocking. Quarterback Jeff George was acquired to back up — or start, if necessary.

In 1999, the 'Skins were just 24th in the league in points allowed. So they brought in cornerback Deion Sanders, defen-

sive end Bruce Smith and rookie linebacker LaVar Arrington. Defensive tackle Dan Wilkinson led the weak defense with just eight sacks.

2. NEW YORK GIANTS: Rookie Ron Dayne, the Heisman winner, will run behind a rebuilt line. The Giants were tied for 20th in scoring in 1999. They were 27th in average gain per rush.

Quarterback Kerry Collins (2,318 yards, 8 touchdowns) must click more with wide receivers Amani Toomer (79 catches) and Ike Hilliard. Otherwise, coach Jim Fassel might be in trouble before long.

On defense, New York was 23rd in points allowed. Linebacker Jessie Armstead, the best stopper, had nine sacks. Defensive end Michael Strahan and safety Sam Garnes have talent. But New York's special teams need to improve.

3. DALLAS COWBOYS: New coach Dave Campo wants to bring back the glory days. The Cowboys were 11th in the NFL in scoring last season and fifth in points allowed. But they haven't won a playoff game since 1996.

Quarterback Troy Aikman (2,904 yards, 12 touchdowns) has fast targets: Joey Galloway was imported to join Rocket Ismail. Running back Emmitt Smith (1,397 yards, 11 touchdowns) is still a workhorse. All-NFL star Larry Allen leads the blocking.

The Dallas defense features defensive linemen Greg Ellis (7 sacks) and Chad Hennings, along with outside linebacker Dexter Coakley and safety Darren Woodson.

4. PHILADELPHIA EAGLES: Unproven quarterback Donovan McNab inherits a tough job. Not since 1990 has anybody led the Eagles in passing yards for two seasons in a row.

In 1999, Philadelphia was tied for 25 in points per game. Running back Duce Staley (1,273 yards) is solid. So is offensive tackle import Jon Runyan. Key worry: Only two teams turned the ball over more than the Eagles. But coach Andy Reid's team has the easiest NFL schedule in 2000.

Defensive backs Brian Dawkins and Troy Vincent pace the

defense. Defensive end Hugh Douglas is also a vet. Yet Philadelphia was 22nd in points allowed last season.

5. ARIZONA CARDINALS: What happened? Arizona went 9-7 in 1998 and won its first playoff game since 1947. Last season, coach Vince Tobin's Cards beat themselves, tying for the most turnovers in the league.

Quarterback Jake Plummer threw 24 interceptions and only nine touchdowns.

Arizona was 30th in scoring last season and 27th in points allowed.

Rookie running back Thomas Jones is the new hope on offense. Plummer still has Rob Moore and Frank Sanders, a pair of talented wide receivers.

Defensive ends Simeon Rice (holdout) and Andre Wadsworth (knee surgery) had preseason woes.
