### Pigs Should Be Marked

Pigs which are to be raised for breeding animals should be marked by the time they are ten days old. Otherwise they will become mixed with other pigs and their identity will be lost. This is especially true where a large number of sows farrow about the same time, and where the owner is away long enough for the pigs to outgrow their parental resemblances. Careful breeders always maintain some system of marking.

They cannot afford to market a pig of unknown parentage. In the first place they need records to obtain registration papers. In the second place a system of marking inspires confidence in buyers. Anyone who is careful with his records is a safe man with whom to deal. Consequently marking insures sales.

Buyers hesitate to purchase pigs where the breeder can furnish no better proof of a pig's parentage than his memory or perhaps his word. Slip-shod methods in breeding are costly.






