PATTEN ATTACKS SMITH VIEWS ON DRY AMENDMENT

Says Governor's Plan Would Only Complicate Present Issue

Over his own signature, James A. Patten today issued a statement attacking Governor Al Smith's views on the prohibition question.

Mr. Patten declares in effect that the election of the New York Governor would be in favor of the man who is sincerely opposed to prohibition.

Mr. Patten is generally regarded as the world's greatest trader in grain.

He is noted as one of the staunchest exponents of better education and has contributed liberally to educational institutions.

Important, however, from the viewpoint of his statement is the fact that he is regarded by his associates as a man who has never been afraid to speak his mind on any subject.

His views on individual liberty, freedom of speech and his opposition to curtailment of personal thought and action have been nationally and internationally his reputation as an advocate of freedom of thought and action is unchallenged.

His signed statement is as follows:

To those who are impatiently opposed in principle to the 18th Amendment and who regard it as a barrier to the proper relation between the Federal Government and the states, there is no hope to be had in the proposal of Governor Smith to deal with that amendment.

Of course, there are those who are not emotional satisfaction out of any way possible. For the moment they are content with the present. They will not examine it. They do not believe it can be fulfilled. They will not consider whether it fulfilled it would give them what they demand.

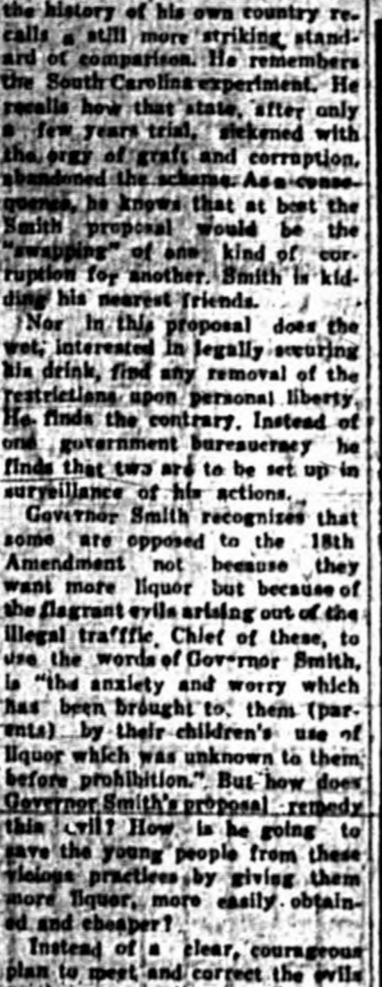
