### Fire Extinguishers

Many home-owners keep some sort of fire-fighting equipment on hand to protect themselves in an unforeseen emergency should a fire break out on the premises. But apparently there are fire extinguishers on the market which in themselves constitute household hazards by endangering the health, if not the life, of the user.

Some metropolitan fire authorities assert that miniature fire extinguishers containing certain halogenated chemicals have been found to expel gases which have fatal effects on people as well as on fires. Inhalation of the vapors may produce asphyxiation or chronic poisoning which can seriously damage the liver or other organs. A "halogenated chemical" to translate the technical speech of the scientist into ordinary words, is one "into which any of the negative elements, fluorine, chlorine, iodine or bromine have been introduced." These "form binary salts by direct union with the metals."

In the hands of a child, such a fire extinguisher could be as disastrous as a loaded gun. Even the average adult, unskilled in the techniques of fire-fighting, may find the vapors more damaging than the fire.

While fire extinguishers, especially in rural areas, should have their place in the home, the prospective buyer should consult with fire authorities to avoid purchasing equipment of dubious worth.

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### THE WORLD TODAY

#### WASHINGTON

The result for this country will not be peace but a new and serious dilemma no matter what answer the Communists give tonight on the latest U. S. truce terms in Korea.

The Reds can accept or reject them. More likely they'll propose some changes, which would mean more talking. Any one of the three answers will require major decisions from President Eisenhower's administration.

For two years, since mid-1951, this country has endured the maddening back-and-forth of the truce talks, hoping to avoid bloodshed by eventually finding a peaceful solution.

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In London, throughout Great Britain and in every continent where Britain's contribution to history has left indelible marks, people celebrated the queen's coronation yesterday in ancient Westminster Abbey.

In these islands they carried their happiness into the rain-slicked night in an ecstasy of carnal joy.

Crowds growing to 100,000 cheered the queen and her family on six different occasions as they made on the flood-lit balcony at Buckingham Palace. Thousands danced in the streets. Great bonfires blazed through the land. Fireworks turned London's night into a spectacular theatrical pageant.

The fever of the coronation ebbed only in the early hours today, when the tired thousands finally went to bed.

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### Thomas Jefferson Davis

Thomas Jefferson Davis, first and only president of the Confederate States of America, was born in Kentucky on June 8, 1824. He was just seven months older than Abraham Lincoln, also born in Kentucky. But while Lincoln was acquiring knowledge by the light of pine knots in a log cabin, Davis was being educated in schools in Mississippi where his family had moved and in Kentucky. Before he finished at Transylvania College in Lexington, he received an appointment to West Point, and on finishing there was sent out as a lieutenant to deal with the Mohawk Indians in the north-central states.

After a few years he became tired of army life and retired to his plantation in Mississippi. He had married a daughter of Zachary Taylor, who much disapproved of the union. However the marriage was short-lived, as death soon overtook the young wife. Later in life he met and married a beautiful and talented young girl, Varina Howell of Natchez, Miss. He spent a while in England, returning to his home state he made several attempts at a "come back" without success.

The state of Mississippi gave him a home, near New Orleans, where he spent the rest of his life, writing his book, "The Rise and Fall of the Confederacy."

He became interested in politics and was sent to Washington, where his young wife was beyond most of the girls of that period in her charm and knowledge of world affairs. She soon became a favorite not only with the ladies of the diplomatic circle but with the men also. Davis also was popular and became a leader under the guidance of the great Calhoun of South Carolina.

Davis served three terms in Washington, the last being appointed Secretary of War under Franklin Pierce. During this administration he enlarged the army and also implemented the defense. The fortifications at Key West were built under his supervision. Before his term of office expired, however, the South had seceded from the union and Davis resigned to offer his services to the new union.

He had hoped to head the new army, but was chosen as the first President instead. He was inaugurated at Montgomery, Ala., the new capitol, and today a bronze star is embedded in the portion of the State building where he stood on that occasion.

MANASSAS, Va., (AP)—A Washington-bound passenger train slammed into a standing freight train near this Northern Virginia town today, killing two firemen. Ten passengers were shaken up.

Sublett, both of Alexandria.
