Governor goes back to school for Chiles' play

SANFORD - For more than an hour Thursday, Gov. Lawton Chiles discovered the wonders of the Math, Science, and Technology Magnet Program and many other facets of education at Sanford Middle School.

The school, Chiles said, is light years ahead of the 3Rs (reading, 'riting and 'rithmetic) courses of the little red brick schoolhouse era.

"Boy, I wish I went to a school like this," he said, re-calling his schoolboy days at Lake Morton School In Lakeland, "We lived across the street from the school - the teachers knew where to find me if I played hooky," he said.

Later, the governor visited the Seminole County Services Building where he personally thanked many of the county volunteers who aided firefighters for six weeks this summer. "Floridians have shown that when a disaster strikes, our communities rally to provide help and hope," he said. "Your assistance will not be forgot-

Chiles said that he was creating a Wildfire Response and Mitigation Review Committee to study the best ways to prevent, mitigate and respond to

wildfires. A report is due no later than Dec. 1, he said.

But even at the reception. Chiles continued to marvel about his earlier findings at Sanford Middle School, He was clearly enthused about the visit. This is a wonderful thing," he said, "Who would have thought we could come this far?"

During his stay at the school, the governor was greeted by eager students and their teachers. Built in 1926, the school recently had \$10 million of renovations and now has a spacious media center, art and music suites and 30 new classrooms equipped with 300 new computers.

Chiles took the time to meet with a group of the construction management team from Jack Jennings & Sons who did the renovations and additions to the school, but most of his visit consisted of chats with teachers and students.

Williams Valerie Stephanie Beauchemin, sixthgraders in Jan Tidwell's Video Production Class, taped the governor as he inspected the Media Room. He smiled, and told Tidwell what "a great opportunity" it was for the children to get this training. His visit would be shown to all the students after the tape was processed in the TV Production

Chiles was just as delighted what he found in Pam Mason's Pre-Med class. That's right, Pre-Med for seventh and eighth graders. Mason said that 125 students are taking the course. learning everything from X-

Judge tells GOP to hold its courses

Injunction issued to stop partisan endorsement in judicial races

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Circuit Judge Gene Stephenson told the Semmole County Republican Executive Committee on Thursday to temporarily stop its plans to endorse judicial candidates.

The judge ruled that dorsements would violate state law which prohibits political parties from supporting. funding or endorsing candi-

dates of their choice. "It's a bad ruling," GOP Executive Committee Chairman Jim Stelling said today. 'We intend to make an appeal - on an

emergency basis - to the First District Court of Appeals. This whole matter should have been resolved months ago." Stelling accused Circuit





Lake Mary cops seek men who robbed hotel

LAKE MARY - Police are looking for several suspects who robbed a hotel and held two of its employees at gan-

According to a police report, on July 30 at about 10 p.m., two black males armed with handguns robbed the Homewood Suite Hotel at 775 Currency Circle, Lake Mary, of its cash drawer.

When the suspects first entered the hotel they asked about room rates and walked around the lobby before they pulled guns on the front desk clerks, said Detective Todd Moderson of the Lake Mary Police Department.

They wanted the safe but the clerks couldn't get to it." Moderson said. Instead, the suspects demanded the clerks' wallets while holding guns to their head. The suspects ran out of the hotel after forcing the clerks into a back room. A blue car was seen driving away from the area following the incident.

Because of a similar incident that occurred two hours earlier, Moderson said there could be a third suspect involved in the robberies. Two black men matching the description of the suspects and asking about room rates were seen in a hotel nearby. A third man, seen with the suspects, wore dreadlocks. The men left that hotel without incident.

The wallets and cash drawer were recovered in Tampa on

Based on his investigation. Moderson said there have been no similar incidents reported in Central Florida.

"This is an isolated case," he

Moderson said his office has released composite sketches of the suspects and also has notified local media.

Committee picks top hauler in quest to privatize city's garbage collection

SANFORD - The City of Sanford is giving serious consideration to turning solid waste collection over to a private company. The privatization has been under consideration for the past 18 months and if approved, could begin as soon as October, the beginning of the new fiscal year.

Requests for proposals (RFP's) were published with the deadline of June 25. Seven replies were received, with one a no-bid. A review committee was established to examine the matter which was pared down to the top three,

At Monday's Sanford City Commission work session, it was announced that the committee had selected the proposal from Florida Recycling Services, Inc. (FRS) for the top of the list. The company is operated by Sid Vihlen, Jr., former Seminole County commissioner.

Vihlen's other business is the operation of Marquette Shores borrow plt which has been a

subject of controversy over the past few years. Sanford Public Works Director Jerry Herman

said if privatization comes about, all but probably three of his department's employees would be hired by the selected private company, and be taken off the city's payroll. This matter has been discussed for so long," Herman said, "that we are already losing a number of people who expect they will be let go anyway once the city goes into the privatization."

The change would involve only solid waste collections within the City of Sanford. According to recent statistics, there are approximately 8,879 single family residential customers, 120 multi family pickups, 650 additional bulk collections (requested calls), and 7,200 commercial container service customers.

Although the proposals were discussed this past Monday during a city commission work session, no specific actions were taken other

Care and cleaning of your microwave

Regular cleaning of a microwave oven is often overlooked because foods do not generally burn on oven surfaces. It is important, however, to make cleaning a regular part of your routine when using a micro-

PROBLEM: Slower cooking

REASONS: Microwaves are absorbed by food and cannot tell the difference between food on the walls or food in a dish or other container cooking can be slowed when a build up of food particles on the walls or floor of the oven absorb microwave energy. Food soils built up around the door or the frame can interfere with the door seal and even prevent the

Romove stains from the ce-ramic floor with a paste of baking soda and water, a special ceramic-glass cleaner or a mild cleanser. Use of harsh
