The secretary of state explained yesterday that while France discriminated against American imports it had been tentatively placed on the preferred list pending the outcome of the discussions now in progress with Andre de Laboulaye, the French ambassador.

Within the next few days, Hull added, the discussions should be concluded and France will then have its choice of opening active negotiations for a new agreement which will eliminate many of the lower duties on its exports to this country giving the United States "equality of treatment."

The United States has no commercial treaty with France and American products entering that country have been accorded widely varying treatment at the hands of customs.

Reports from Berlin yesterday said the Wilhelmstrasse received with satisfaction word from President Roosevelt's proposed cancellation of the German American trade treaty. The reaction at Ber-

that required before the courts would recognize bankruptcy petitions from municipalities or other taxing units. Representative Wilcox said Monday that the present Senate amendments made the act virtually unworkable.

In the bill's original form it was provided that 20 percent of a taxing unit's creditors holding any single kind of indebtedness, could petition a federal court for relief. Agreement of two-thirds of all creditors then would force a settlement upon the remaining creditors, provided the court approved the settlement.

The Senate limited the percentage figures to 40 percent of all creditors and 60 percent of all assets to satisfy an agreement. These amendments contemplated the winding down of indebtedness according to the taxing unit's ability to pay.

Seminole County Welfare Board had a balance of \$423.88 after administering its relief work during March. It was reported at the Court House today. Only 17 cents remained in the treasury on March 1, but receipts for the month, including the monthly \$200 donation from the County, reached \$384.44. Expenditures totaled \$342.33.

Cost of operating the County Home during March was \$410.12, as reported today by Supt. R. I. Dann. The Home housed 37 white and colored persons, during the month, and \$13.23 per day was spent in housing, feeding, and clothing the group. Produced during the month were: 194 gallons of milk at 12 1/2 cents per gallon, 135 dozen eggs at 15 cents per dozen, and 44 pounds of butter.

Dr. S. Pulston's report as County Physician indicates that he had another busy month. During the month he was on duty at the County Home, eight to the County Jail, and 18 homes of county patients. In addition, he performed five major and two minor operations, and held 26 office consultations.
