Real Estate Taxes

No one denies that the elimination of all city, county, and state ad valorem taxes on real estate would be a good thing. The Homestead Exemption Amendment has already eliminated a part of these taxes. Gov. Shultz has proposed that all state ad valorem taxes on real estate except the one mill constitutional levy be eliminated. But the Florida Tax Revision League, with headquarters in Jacksonville, would do away with all real estate taxes, city, county, and state.

At first blush it would not seem in any way possible to do this. Real estate taxes have always been the mainstay of all Florida city and county governments. To do away with these taxes makes the wonder if it would be possible to operate the schools at all, whether state highways, parks, and other public services be maintained, whether prisons, and county roads could be maintained, whether all of these things would be done, whether fire departments and police forces could continue to operate.

The Florida Tax Revision League says it would be easy. This is the way they would do it. In the first place they would cut the most of government eliminating 25 percent of our present city, county and state expenditures, or 25 million dollars. That would certainly seem to be a worthy purpose. But if the cost of government can be reduced, it ought to be reduced any way whether all of the Florida Tax Revision League's program is adopted or not.

Once expenses have been cut, the League would levy a transaction tax, or a sales tax, in order to produce whatever revenue may then be necessary. In other words, the state would have to raise all the money now paid into city, county and state treasuries by real estate, except in so far as that amount might be reduced by governmental economies. That this would not be impossible they deduce from the following figures prepared from Mr. W. F. Walker's report on receipts and expenditures for the State of Florida and its political subdivisions for the year 1933:
