# City proceeds with city manager search

By Dan Ping Editor

SANFORD — City commissioners will decide Monday how to proceed with a

search for a new city manager.

Joe Denaro, Sanford's human resource director, is proposing two options. The first option proposes a traditional selection advi-sory committee that would screen resumes and make a recommendation to the city commission.

The advisory committee would narrow its selection from all applications received based on each applicant's background and how well those backgrounds match a profile Commissioners also consider site plan for downtown Eckerd Drug Store

developed by city staff and commissioners. The profile would include a list of desired fields of knowledge, types of managements styles and abilities, and personal traits a successful candidate would need to effectively

serve as the city's top administrative official.
Once the field of candidates has been narrowed, the advisory committee would ask candidates to complete a self-assessment questionnaire. That questionnaire would be used to screen the top five to 10 candidates

who would participate in oral interviews with the city commission.

Denaro is proposing that the advisory committee include himself, a member of the city commission, a local city or county administrator, a member of the business community with experience in hiring top management, and two members of the com-

The second option Denaro is proposing is similar to the first up through the self-

assessment phase of the process. At that point, a screening committee would conduct simulated exercises to assess how each candidate would perform on the job. The exercises could include mock staff and community meetings, interviews and other problem colving deitle.

problem-solving drills.

Once the drills are completed, the screening committee would rank the candidates and make recommendations to the commission. Commissioners would then interview the top three candidates before making a final selection.

Commissioners will decide Monday

Among others, he is the recipient of the him. Among others, he is the recipient of the Outstanding Minnesota Citizen of the Year, is a member of the Minnesota Business Hall of Fame, and was honored by the governor of Minnesota with Jeno E. Paulucci Day. Nothing wrong with that. In fact, if I could claim dual citizenship I would, but so far the good people of the Virgin Islands have yet extend such a cour-

As for the money, the nearly \$10,500 Jeno contributed came out of a Sanford bank, though with a worldwide empire, those benjamins were made in Duluth; Sanford; Wartburg, Tenn.; and just about everywhere else in the world. My point, amart-alective as it was, was that Jeno was pouring a lot of money into the campaign.


I quoted one of Jeno's Credo's last week, and if I had to meet his





He gave some stipulations however — that it be done at night, when the office staff was not on hand, and with a minimum of personnel making the and with a minimum of personnel making the

recording.

The time was set for 9 p.m., with Strouse himself running the video tape machines, Al Wimberly directing, Ron

Channel-2) operating the audio board, Kendrick (he's still at Channel-2) operating the audio board, and I, as camera operator.

Shortly before 9 p.m., we were ready. Al told me to go to the front waiting room and unlock the door to let the two men in when they arrived. When I reached the front of the studio, they were both sitting on the sofa waiting for me. Yet, the door was still locked. (I never did understand that one).

Although there were two cameras in the studio, I was not allowed to be in the studio when they recorded. One camera was aimed at man No. 1, and the other was aimed at both of them. They were locked in position and I was told to leave

Man No. 1 (as I will call him) was possibly 6 feet 6 inches tall. The other man was slightly over 5 feet in height. Both looked quite normal in human standards and were well

When the recording session began, they announced they were from the planet Venus "As earthlings called it," and were in Central Florida to study our space ventures at the Cape. They said they had a small disc shaped vehicle in the swamp areas just west of New Smyrna Beach, from which they would leave to join their larger craft which was hovering above Earth, not detected by our radar or other devices.

They reported they were dispatched from "Venus" to study Farth's space programs, and as soon as enough data was

Earth's space programs, and as soon as enough data was gathered, they would be leaving, but wanted to let the world know why they were here.

know why they were here.

During their two-man conversation, they told of life on Venus (again — as WE call it) and how they had perfected space travel many decades ago. They discussed religion, (which I will delve into next week), and how their civilization had thrived. They also mentioned in passing that there were other planets in the solar system which had intelligent life. I told them I would let them out, but they said "Never mind" and went out the front door of the studio, which, after

a while, I checked, and found still to be locked.

The next morning, we mailed the video tape to the Mike

in about 10 days, the tape was returned along with a message — "What do you mean sending us a blank tape for our

program, please explain".

While Strouse was the station manager at the time, he was still a licensed engineer, and there was no reason why the tape wasn't recorded.

(The scene changes) About a week later, I was driving during the early evening hours east on SR-46, nearing Mims. My

brother-in-law John Jursa was with me.

Suddenly, we saw a bright light in the swamp land to the right of us. It was, without a doubt, a small disc shaped vehicle which took off from the land, rose into the sky, then suddenly disappeared into the night sky. We agreed at that time not to tell anyone as UFO sightings were quite common, and no one was believing in them.


The only people involved in the preceding situation were Ron Kendrick, who is still one of the top field reporters for WESH-TV, and Al Wimberly (although I have no idea where

Atlanta in mid-February, suburban housewife Sally Rountree decided to take the opportunity to show her opposition to the probable her opposition to the probable invasion of Iraq. So she scrib-bled a homemade sign — "No War for Oil" — and found a place along the route of the presidential motorcade, hoping Bush would see her

As she tells it, she was never rude. She didn't shout. She didn't elbow other onlookers or jostle toward the front of the crowd. She merely

stood holding her sign.
Nevertheless, for the
offense of exercising her rights as a
citizen of one of the world's greatest democracies, she was spat on, threat-ened and yelled at. One man went so far as to denounce her for wearing a cross around her neck, "Instructing I was not a Christian," she said.

As she wrote in an op-ed easay for the Atlanta Journal-Constitution: " was frightened that my neighbors re going to hurt me because I dared to express my opinion. This

America, right?\*

But it is happening here.

dissenting voice to find that her fellow citizens have adopted a pinched and dis-torted pseudo-patriotism that manages to mangle the very democratic principles upon which the nation was founded — including the freedom to freely criticize the president without fear of retribu-

even for the mildest protests. An Albany, N.Y., mall, for example,

has apparently ejected some shoppers wearing peace slogars.

There is layer upon layer of sad trony here. Even as President Bush denounces Saddam's tyranny and vows to plant the seeds of democracy In Iraq, Americans are trying to suppress their neighbors' right to express dissenting views — one of the very pillars of American democracy. The citizens' right to criticize their leaders was so important to the Founding Fathers that they placed free speech in the First Amendment to the

Constitution.
You would think that President Bush would use his bully pulpt to remind Americans that they ought to be modeling the democratic values that we are trying to export. But the White House has already proved a disappointment along those lines.

Back in October 2001, White House

spokesman Ari Fleischer didn't stop at disagreeing with satirist Bill Maher, who suggested the 9/11 terrorists were "not cowards" in their suicide.

Americans need to watch what they do, and this is not a time for remarks like that." Coming from the president's spokesman, it was a chilling

suggestion of cereorship.

The oddest thing about this wave of pseudo-patriotism is that it serves as a substitute for genuine patriotism—for a sense of shared sacrifice that would befit a proud nation threat-ened by hostile forces. Military recruiters report no upsurge in enlist-ment. And while one or two coursgeous voices have suggested a debate on a draft — either for the military or for homeland security — conscription is widely considered a political impossibility.

Few politicians would dare sug-

gest we make any real sacrifices in the rvice of our country. Instead, too many of us believe we have shown ourselves to be great patriots when we stick an American flag bumper sticker on the old SUV and run over the peace placards in our neighbor's yard. Perhaps we've forgotten what we're fighting to defend.

As a parting gift, the class donated a much needed public address system to the auditori-

Officers of the senior class were Kent Rossitter, president; Jane Schultz, vice president; Helen Habe, secretary; Thomas Ratliff, treasurer; and Rose Harkey, chaplain.

During 1939-40, Sadie Hawkins Day was observed, the student body selected a standard ring for four years, the band received new uniforms, several music students represented SHS at Rollins College and the football team fought valiantly, but won only two

The student newspaper, The Celery Fed, was published once a month and cost five cents a copy. Faculty sponsor was Miss Ruth Hand.

The staff included: Chuck DeWolski, editor; Elizabeth Pippin, associate editor; Mary Lynd Ross and Dickle Brown, sports editors; Julian Baumel, feature editor; John Dunn, exchange editor. Reporters were Marcia Proctor, Huddleston, Dot Kader and Ralph Ray.

Business manager was Joe McCaslin and others on the staff were Mary Bedlin, Bobby Newman and Helen Kane.



# **Swimmers** show off stamina

SANFORD — On Saturday, February 15th the City of Sanford Recreation and Parks Department and Seminole Aquatics hosted the First Annual One-Hour Hammerhead Challenge Swim at the Larry A. Dale Aquatic

The 44 participants competed as both individuals and teams by swimming a continuous hour in which their total yardage was tracked.

The swimmers were divided into four member teams based on relative skill and endurance levels and the combined individual yardage obtained during the hour was totaled for the team portion of the event.

The total combined distance covered by the 44 swimmers exceeded 88 miles.

Competitors ranged in age from six to "50-something" and included parents of swim team

members, lifeguards and even Seminole High School Assistant Principal Keith McAuley. "It was an absolutely great event," said Tony Ackerson, head coach of Seminole Aquatics Age Group Swim Team and event coordinator. Massachusetts, rallied to win. 58-53, in Class 6A-Region 1.

The Eagles had won their first three postseason games by an average of 22 points, but Oviedo led most of the way as its stingy match-up zone defense forced the home team to take difficult long shots.

But then star guard Darius Washington Jr. took over for Edgewater.

The 6-foot-1 junior, who is averaging close to 38 points in the postseason and is considered by many to be the top underclassman in the country, picked up three first half fouls and scored just two points as the Lions led 18-14 after the first period and 27-23 at intermission.

Edgewater would take the lead, 41-39, after three quarters, but Oviedo would regain the lead early in the final quarter behind Grant Herren and A.J. Hargrave.

Washington then went on a tear, hitting 12 of his game-high 22 points in the fourth quarter and also made a big rebound of his own missed shot to feed teammate Demetrius Scott (15 points) for the last of his three three-pointers to seal the victo-

Hargrave also hit three threepointers and led the Lions with 15 points. Herren was also in double figures with 11, while Pat Kiscaden was held to nine points.

The toughest loss though, was suffered by Orangewood Christian, which saw a running, one-handed floater from 20-feet fall through with one second on the clock to give host Brevard Christian a 71-70 Class A-Region 2 victory.

Senior guard E.J. Murray, who scored 30 points on the night, was the hero as the War Eagles (31-4) advanced to the regional finals for the fourth consecutive






