Zero tolerance but not zero results

City, county and state law enforcement traffic units conducted a Zero Tolerance drive over this past Labor Day holiday weekend. It started in the early morning hours of Friday Sept. 1 and concluded at 2 a.m. Tuesday, Sept.

The good news is that the Florida Highway Patrol reported no traffic fatalities in Seminole County during the extended holiday weekend. The bad news, at least for persons who were stopped, was that 522 traffic citations were issued and 43 arrests were made.

Officers issue 522 tickets and make 21 DUI arrests during holidays

In all, more than 60 law enforcement officers from a dozen agencies in Seminole County took to the roadways. to find aggressive drivers and persons who may be driving under the influence (DUI) of alcohol or drugs. According to Oviedo Police Lieutenant Marc Beaulieu, the goal of the program was to prevent as many traffic deaths and injuries in Central Florida as possible.

Beaulieu said not all agencies have reported final statistics for the weekend. but results for agencies that did report showed a successful campaign to eradicate hazardous drivers from our streets and highways.

Of the 43 arrests, 21 were for DUI, 16 were for other misdemeanor charges and six were for other felonies

Present reports show 167 citations

were handed out overnight from 10 p.m. Friday until 4 a.m. Saturday. These were done by the City County State traffic unit. For the total reporting agencies, 250 citations were handed out from 4 s.m. Saturday until 2 a.m. Tuesday.

The drive was hosted by the Oviedo Police Department and Seminole County Sheriff's Office. The Florida Department of Transportation and Florida Highway Patrol also took part in the project. Operations Commander was Capt. Steve Benson of the Oviedo Police Department, with Lt. Jerry Riggins and Sgt. Mark Dibona heading up the operations center for the Sheriff's Department.

The 6-foot, 190pound Central Florida alum has flourished since returning to Orlando, becoming a valuable leader on a team that has had a surprising amount of turnover aince 1997.

This season Cooper led the team in receiving yards with 881 yards and 14 touchdowns. Defensively he tallied a career high 45 tackles and added two interceptions, both of which were returned for touchdowns.



Pre-game prayer Is it all about publicity?

This is what I don't understand about those high school football prayers: Why do they have to be said aloud? Is God hard-of-hearing? If so, that would explain why so many football fans from Texas to

North Carolina are standing to repeat the Lord's Prayer aloud just before high school football games. Maybe they believe that God will not hear them if they stay seated and whisper the well-known prayer.

Maybe they believe that only a public prayer can bring victory to the consistent losers of East Podunk

High or keep the band on key during its performance of R. Kelly's "I Believe I Can Fly."

Or maybe there's something else going on. There

is a strain of conservative Christianity whose mem-bers desperately need to believe they are being per-secuted. The more formidable and determined their adversaries, the holier they believe themselves to be. That defiant us-against-them, David-against-Goliath, Daniel-in-the-lion's-den tone was struck by Mississippi radio sports broadcaster Paul Ott, who was quoted in The New York Times: "We are not going to let them take God any further away from

Ott's remark begs the question: Who is trying to

take God away from our country?

In June, the Supreme Court issued a ruling that struck down the public, pre-game prayers sanctioned by the Santa Fe (Texas) Independent School District. The case grew out of complaints by two families — one Catholic and one Mormon — who said that the Protestant prayers to which they were routinely subjected before ball games violated their rights and constituted government endorsement

of a particular religion.

In siding with those families, the court did not silence prayer or place God in exile. Indeed, God is in fashion these days, so frequently invoked by the presidential tickets that it is easy enough to mistake the campaign trail for a camp revival meeting. But the court did point out that those whose religious views are in the minority have the right not to be hectored in a public place by government-organized prayers they don't believe in. There is nothing un-American about that.

The Supreme Court, which properly enforced the First Amendment separation of church and state, is not the inspiration of Satan. Nor are

Christians in this country in danger of being fed to the lions. According to the most recent Gallup poll, nearly 90 percent of Americans identify themselves as Christians — a vast majority. In other words, Christians remain firmly in charge

You will never hear that, however, from the publicity-seeking religious forces whose self-identity is tied up in the notion of battling the gious forces whose self-identity is tied up in the notion of battling the forces of evil in the public commons. They need to advance the view that they are struggling uphill against a mighty, godless government that oppresses true believers. If nothing else, that struggle of the faithful against the heathens makes for good fund-raising letters.

So several religious groups spent the summer sending out word to their followers to pray aloud at the opening of football games. While the prayers may have looked spontaneous, they were anything but. Conservative preachers and radio broadcasters such as Ott did all they could to encourage those moments of public piety.

The movement is expected to grow, especially in the Bible Belt, where football has long been a religion. And as long as school officials do not attempt to organize the prayers, the high court would be

where football has long been a religion. And as long as school officials do not attempt to organize the prayers, the high court would be unlikely to intervene. If their behavior does not coerce others, either explicitly or implicitly, fans have every right to stand and pray aloud before football games if they like.

But the question remains: Why do they want to? A quiet prayer is just as likely as a public one to protect the young athletes on the field from injury or, if the supplicant's concerns are more parochial, to get Jerry Jr. off the bench and into the action. True believers should know that.

"The North Pole is melting." So began a decidedly

alarmist news story published last week on the front page of the venerable New York Times.

The presence of water at the very top of the world is "more evidence" of global warming, said the paper of record, adding that, "The last time scientists can be certain the pole was awash in water was more than 50 million years ago."
Well, maybe not quite 50

million years ago, as it turns out. Maybe more like last summer.

For as climatologists point out, breaks in the polar ice occur quite often, particulariy in summer months. "In fact, it happens many, many times every year," said Claire Parkinson of NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center, in an interview with Time maga-

Goddard's satellites have been monitoring the polar ice caps for years, so the scientists there would know if a climatological calamity was under way at the North Pole. So how did the New York

Times get its global warming story so wrong (which it acknowledged this week in a correction that, of course, didn't get nearly the play as the original scary news story)?

Because the reporter relied on politically motivated scien-

tists who subscribe to the global warming orthodoxy that human consumption of fossil fuels have driven up atmospheric carbon dioxide levels to the point that Mother Earth is having hot flashes.

One of those scien-tists is James McCarthy, director of the Museum of Comparative Zoology at Harvard University

He happens to be co-leader of a working group for the United Nations-sponsored Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, which has previously concluded that there has been a discernible human influence on global cli-

So when McCarthy, a global warming adherent, arrived at the North Pole earlier this month (he was a guest lecturer on an arctic tourist cruise aboard a Russian ice breaker) he found the confirmation he was looking for: open water at

"It was totally unexpected," he said, "Global warming was real, and we were seeing its effects for the first time that

far north."

McCarthy was echoed by fellow scientist (and guest lecturer) Malcolm McKenna, a paleontologist at the American Museum of Natural History,

who accompanied him on the arctic tourist cruise.
"I don't know if anybody in

history ever got to 90 degrees north to be greeted by water, not ice," he told the Times. "Some folks who pooh-pooh global warming might wake up if shown that even the pole

is beginning to melt."
Funny, neither McCarthy or
McKenna have been heard from since the New York
Times essentially retracted its
alarmist global-warming story. Maybe they are embarrassed to have revealed to the world how little they really know about climatology.

And that's the problem with the global warming debate. The IPCC, of which McCarthy is part, canvassed a bunch of scientists and arrived at a con-clusion that the human popu-lation is causing global warm-ing. Yet most of the scientists that formed the IPCC "consensus" have no expertise in the area of climatology.

That's how two scientists could go to the North Pole, see a patch of water, and declare it prima facie evidence of global warming. And it is on the basis of such unsound science that the United States and

other industrialized nations are being asked by the United Nations to dramatically reduce carbon dioxide emissions.

What that means is reducing the use of fossil fuels for driving our cars, heating our homes, and providing electricity for our offices and facto-

nomics student can tell us, the way to reduce demand for a commodity — in this case, fos-sil fuels — is to drive up the

What impact would higher energy costs have on this country? Well, think about the run up in gas prices in the Midwest this past spring. Think about the escalation in

Think about the escalation in electricity prices in the West (especially here in San Diego).

That is what we can look forward to if global warming adherents get their way. If they are able to persuade the White House and Congress to agree to the Kyoto Protocol, which calls for industrialized nations to reduce their carbon. nations to reduce their carbon emissions by 30 percent overthe next dozen years.

Now, if human activity real-ly was the cause of global warm-ing really was the cause of the North Pole melting, then most Americans would probably be willing to use less energy (at higher prices) to save the plan-

But the science simply does not show that an environmental calamity is under way and that the human population

Let McCarthy and McKenna return to the North Pole this winter. If they see open water at the time, then there will be something to worry about.



Florida Lottery earns record \$908 million for education

The Florida Lottery announced it has transferred a record \$908 million into the **Educational Enhancement Trust** Fund (EETF) for Florida's public schools for fiscal year 1999-

The Lottery also sold a record total of \$2.248 billion worth of tickets for this fiscal year.
"Our mission is to help fund education in a responsible manner. We're extremely proud of being able to announce this record year and look forward to increasing our transfers to education again next year," said Dayid Griffin, Secretary of the Florida Lottery. "But as Impressive as these numbers are, it can never replace the contributions made every day by parents and teachers. Ultimately, a community's commitment to education

the Lottery alone can do." Lottery funding accounts for less than 10 percent of total edu-cation spending in Florida.

The fiscal year ended June 30, 2000. Under Florida law, at least 38 percent of all Lottery profits are transferred to the EETH for public education. The **EETR** in turn distributes Lottery dollars to Florida's 67 school districts, 28 community colleges and 10 state universities.

During fiscal year 1999-2000, the Lottery sold \$568.3 million


