Peaches In Pudding
(Bliner Serving 3 or 4)

Spanish Goulash
(Bittered Asparagus)

Mashed Potatoes
Bread Grapes Butter

Cabbage Relish Salad
Peach Pudding
Coffee

Spanish Goulash
(Top-of-Stove Cooking)

1 pound round
1 cup flour

1 tablespoon bacon fat

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup diced onions

1/4 cup diced celery

1/4 cup granulated sugar

1/4 teaspoon powdered cloves

2 cups boiling water

1 cup tomatoes

Cut beef into one-inch cubes.

Roll in flour and brown in fat in a frying pan. Add water and simmer 30 minutes. Add tomatoes and boil gently for 10 minutes or until meat is tender when tested with fork.

Cabbage Relish Salad

1 cup shredded cabbage

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup diced onions

1/4 cup diced sweet pickles

1/4 cup granulated sugar

1/4 cup flour

1/8 teaspoon salt

2 eggs yolks

2 cups milk

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

1/2 teaspoon lemon extract

1/4 teaspoon almond extract

1 egg whites, beaten

2 cups sliced peaches

1 tablespoon confectioner's sugar

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup milk

Add yolks and milk. Cook in a double boiler until mixture is thick and creamy, stirring frequently. Add extracts and whites. Mix lightly and pour over peaches which have been mixed with confectioner's sugar and placed in a shallow dish. Chill and serve.
